



This competency-based course is designed to provide students with an overview of the criminal justice system. In the Criminal Justice course, students will engage in virtual reality and interactive videos designed to test their visual memory and ability to apply their skills to effectively manage a crime scene. Students will become immersed in topics that include criminal and constitutional law, security, and communications. Students will review basic law enforcement skills, which cover tactics, methods, and skills utilized by law enforcement. These concepts should be taken into consideration when taking this course and assessing implementation options. Upon completion of this course, students will be equipped with the knowledge and skills to earn a digital badge in Criminal Justice, and will be better prepared for the certification exam.

Misdemeanors and Infractions	Define types and categories of misdemeanors crimes and infractions.

Communication	Demonstrate proper communication usage and procedures (i.e. use the telephone and police radio properly).
Low Risk Traffic Stop	Demonstrate correctly conducting a low-risk traffic stop, including reporting to dispatch, and issue a traffic citation.

Handcuffing	Demonstrate proper handcuffing techniques.
Search Procedures (Vehicle & Equipment)	Identify appropriate search procedures in the inspection of a vehicle and equipment.
Search Procedures (People)	Identify appropriate search procedures for persons.
Patrol Duties	Identify the main duties and responsibilities of patrol officers.
Patrol Procedures	Identify different types of patrol procedures and techniques.
Patrol Types	Identify different patrol types and zones and evaluate the advantages and disadvantages of each.
Criminal Investigations	Identify the different types of criminal investigations (juvenile, robbery).
Interviewing Witnesses	Describe effective interview skills and techniques for obtaining information from witnesses and victims in an investigation.
Suspect Interviews	Describe effective interview skills and techniques for obtaining information from suspects in an investigation.

Miranda Warning Requirements	Describe Miranda warning requirements in suspect interviews.
Fingerprint Processing	Describe fingerprint processing (e.g., live scan, inked impressions).
Officer Response Safety 1	Describe scene safety techniques for officer response (e.g., domestic abuse, assault).
Officer Response Safety 2	Describe scene safety techniques for officer response at a motor vehicle crash site.
Impaired Drivers	Recognize and describe indicators of impaired drivers.
Reports	Describe the purpose of different types of reports.
Use of Force Guidelines "Force Continuum"	Describe the use-of-force guidelines as it applies to Federal, State, and local laws.
Officer Presence & Verbal Commands	Explain the proper de-escalation techniques used by police officers.
Non-lethal Weapons	Identify non-lethal weapons and techniques for use in the field.
Less-than-lethal Force and Deadly Force	Describe the differences between less-than-lethal force and deadly force.
Deadly Force	Identify the procedural laws and requirements governing the use of deadly force.
Civil and Criminal Liabilities	Explain the civil and criminal liabilities that apply to use of force by a police office.
Legal Issues	Describe legal issues pertaining to objective reasonableness as it pertains to the use of force that include Tennessee v. Garner and Graham v. Conner cases.
Weapons Safety	Demonstrate weapon safety and familiarization.
Interpersonal Skills	Identify the unique interpersonal skills required in communicating with a culturally diverse community.
Human Relations	Identify factors that may affect human relations in criminal justice operations with culturally diverse communities.
Culturally Diverse Communities	Identify methods of communication that may enhance human relations with culturally diverse communities.
Mental Health	Describe procedures for identifying, handling, and referring people who exhibit signs of mental illness.
Domestic Violence, Abuse, and Neglect	Identify and describe procedures for dealing with domestic violence, including abuse and neglect.
Racial Profiling	Identify racial profiling as it relates to policing.

Crisis Management	Identify solutions for situations that require crisis management and conflict resolution (e.g., language interpreters, victims of domestic violence, homeless persons, disaster response).
Reports	Describe the purpose of different types of reports and field notes.
Accurate Report Writing	Explain the who-what-when-where-why-how elements of accurate report writing and field notes.
Community Policing	Analyze current trends in effective community-oriented policing.
Computer Databases	Display familiarity with law enforcement computer databases (i.e. National Crime Information Center (NCIC)).
Technology	Identify emerging police technology and social media.
Security: Terrorism	Identify sources and types of domestic and international terrorism.
Security: Private	Describe safe and responsible ways of responding to expressions of hostility or threats, including the use of private security and property protection.
Security: Criminal Organizations	Identify different types of criminal organizations.
Health and Safety 1: Hazards at a Crime Scene	Discuss the potential health and safety hazards one could encounter at a crime scene.
Health and Safety 1: Minimize Risk	Demonstrate skills and techniques to minimize risk to self and others at the crime scene.
Health and Safety 2: State and Federal Regulations	Discuss state and federal regulations regarding hazardous materials as related to crime scenes.
Health and Safety 2: Hazardous Materials	Identify hazardous materials, proper response, and scene management.
Health and Safety 3: Emergency Procedures	Discuss emergency procedures involving personal risk in a crime scene situation.
