

Online learning at ABS

What is Online Schooling in Kuwait?

Online schooling is a way for students to study at their own homes. ABS began the online journey before many other schools in Kuwait, as soon as the Corona Virus pandemic occurred. Students in all departments of ABS get to attend classes virtually using Zoom and doing their work using Microsoft Teams. Attendance in class is mandatory, good behavior is expected, and work must be done in order to maintain and improve GPA scores and to graduate successfully. All of this has been put in place in order to allow us to stay safe in our homes during the pandemic.



How are ABS students dealing with this change?

ABS has a detailed schedule with 3-7 classes a day. Online schooling starts at 8 am and ends at 2:30 pm. Students in ABS have mixed feelings about online school. Some students miss school and wish to get back to school as soon as possible while others are happy with the extra freedom they have and enjoy staying in the comfort of their homes.



Student's View of Online Learning

"Online School has been a very big change. The students had to adapt to the change quickly and get used to it. It is just like regular school where we wake up early and have classes. Out of all the classes, Journalism is my favorite, because I enjoy writing and learning about different styles of writing. Another class I like is Environmental Science, because our teacher makes it fun and I enjoy learning about it. Finally, I love English because our teacher is very understanding and the way she teaches, is great fun."

Student's Opinion

"In MSHS, we have four long classes every day. Each class is 1.5 hours long. Honestly, I think if Online Learning continues much longer that the school should make the lessons 1 hour in length because 1.5 hours is a very long time to spend in one class and the students can get bored and tired of the class. In conclusion, online classes are very practical; it is also good fun. I prefer it over actually going to school. The idea and concepts are extremely good and I don't mind doing it the whole year!"

"In our experience, we think online schooling is practical during this situation. Although we do miss our friends, our health should always be our number one priority! We have found Online Learning to have many advantages. It is simpler and also provides more freedom, since students can be anywhere for classes: their chalets, homes, or even relative's homes. Online schooling has been an interesting new experience that we students get to enjoy."

Who decided online schooling is a better alternative to no school?

Online schooling began in March 2020. Private schools such as ABS, decided to continue school virtually and public schools followed later. Online school is still continuing until further notice. Governments all over the world decided that online schooling is a better alternative to keep the citizens safe. Kuwait's government is one of the countries that is continuing online schooling, until the situation can be dealt with.

Kuwait is taking the situation very seriously, because they care about people's health and welfare. The government decided to cancel normal schooling to reduce the COVID-19 cases in Kuwait.

Online Learning has been important for the welfare of the student's health and learning. Students have been able to study in the comfort of their homes without being a danger to themselves or others. Students have learned just like they would do in schools thanks to the technology and facilities at ABS. Because we have followed the safety precautions, we have been kept safe.

The Emir of Kuwait, Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, who ruled the country for 14 years, died at the age of 91, on September 29, 2020. "Sheikh Sabah was an extraordinary symbol of wisdom and generosity, a messenger of peace, a bridge-builder," said UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres. Saudi Foreign Minister Prince Faisal wrote "We lose a wise leader who devoted his life to service of his country and to Arab and Islamic nations." With the passing of Al-Sabah, The United Arab Emirates announced a three-day mourning period. The cabinet later confirmed his brother, Crown Prince Sheikh Nawaf al-Ahmad Al-Sabah, as the new Emir of Kuwait.


Parent-Teacher Conferences



KG First Day-Character Visit!






Parent Volunteers



Avoiding Plagiarism in your writing

To avoid plagiarism in your research papers, projects, and schoolwork: all you need to do is credit the writers for their work and ideas. Many students have points taken off and are required to resubmit their work, or receive zeros, due to not citing their information correctly. If you did not write it yourself, it must be cited. Any idea or thought that you learned during your research, will need to be acknowledged on the works cited page at the end of your paper. Essentially, plagiarism is taking someone else's ideas or words, intentionally or not, and presenting them as your own. This could be a quote or passage that you forgot to cite, an entire paper, or even ideas. "Yes, ideas can be plagiarized! If you read an article and take the same stance or position as your own without crediting the article, that is considered plagiarism. You are taking someone else's position and ideas instead of creating your own. You cannot grow as a student, thinker, and person if you plagiarize from someone else's work." (Cain, p.25, 2011).

ABS students should be using The Modern Language Association (MLA) for all their papers and projects.

5 types of plagiarism to avoid



- 1 Missing quotation marks and author attribution
- 2 Buying a paper from an essay-writing website
- 3 Turning in someone else's work as your own
- 4 Having somebody rewrite sections of your paper
- 5 Using old work you previously wrote as "repurposed" content

COVID-19 To Vaccinate or Not?


Covid-19 has been a hot-topic during High School lessons this Semester, especially in Journalism and Global Issues lessons. At the time of writing, 90,702,906 people around the world had been infected by the virus resulting in 1,943,432 deaths worldwide. Many countries are currently being affected by a “second-wave” of the virus with an increasing number of countries having to return to strict lockdown rules to combat a new mutant strain of the original virus. In Kuwait, the actions of the government have kept cases to 152,000 with 938 deaths. Cases continue to fall in Kuwait, but still the impact of the virus continues to be felt and effects our everyday life.

One of the solutions put forward to help to return the world to normal has been mass vaccination. On December 14, 2020, the Government approved the emergency use of the Pfizer-BioNTech coronavirus vaccine. On December 24, 2020 Prime Minister Sabah al-Khalid al-Sabah received the first jab to mark the beginning of the immunization program by the end of December, 100,000 people in Kuwait had registered to take the vaccine.

After the pandemic broke out, many people were at the state of panic. There wasn't a cure found to treat the people other than treating most of their people's symptoms. From the beginning of the pandemic, many doctors suggest that getting a vaccine is the best way to “treat” the virus since there is no cure. Many scientists have had many clinical trials throughout 2020 and have found a way to create a vaccine in less than a year. Usually when creating a vaccine, it takes at least 5-to-6-years max or less. Now the question is, should everyone get vaccinated? People that are the ages of 18 and up should get vaccinated. The reason why is that the people in these ages interact with other people from the outside a lot versus the people that are younger in age. When a person gets sick, their body knows how to fight it and that means that the person is immune to the virus. If you are not vaccinated, your body will have trouble fighting the virus and you potentially will need to be placed into critical care or even worse. With the vaccine, it prevents being in critical care because your body knows how to fight it. It is better for people to get vaccinated because what happened in 2020 was disastrous to say the least. When you get the vaccine and there should be another virus breaks out, not many patients will be in the hospital because they are vaccinated, and their body is fighting the virus. This year when vaccine didn't exist, people lost their jobs, people died, and many problems have arisen this year. With vaccine, it makes the doctors lives and people's lives much easier. There may be side effects for some people when being vaccinated, but if another virus has spread, their bodies know how to fight it. Thus, the amount of death and times in quarantine would lessen.



COVID-19 Safety Measures



1. Wear masks in all public places.
2. Increase the physical distance between individuals (1.8 meters is the general recommendation.)
3. Avoid cluster gatherings.
4. Wash your hands for 20 seconds.
5. Use an alcohol-bases hand sanitizer that contains atleast 60% alcohol.
6. If you feel symptomatic or have a fever, visit your nearest hospital.

Did you try any Kuwaiti dishes if yes what are they?


Yes, I've tried Shwarma and Mixed Grill. Love the Fatayer and It is my favorite!


Did you have any difficulty adjusting with the system?



Introducing the new ABS Website


