How: Talk to a counselor ASAP! (Sophomores must have 3.0 GPA or higher and at least one recommendation from a junior high teacher)



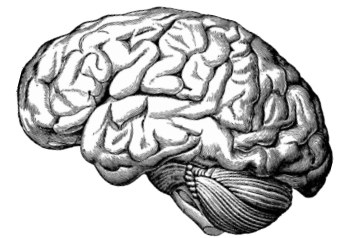
