Extreme Weather

Pupils at Clifton High School wear a uniform, which is distinctive and most importantly recognises them as a member of the school community. Our uniform means that pupils do not have to worry about peer pressure as everyone is dressed the same, generating a sense of belonging and identity. The wearing of a uniform prepares pupils for adulthood and the world of work.

Every pupil is expected to dress in accordance with the School Uniform Policy at all times. Pupils are ambassadors for the School when in uniform, both on and off the school premises. Failure to adhere to the School Uniform Policy will result in a sanction, in line with the Misconduct and Discipline Policy. Any requests for deviations to the Uniform Policy must be made to a Deputy Head of School.

## Uniform Standards

- **Blazers** must be worn at all times by Senior School Pupils and as directed in Years 3 - 6
- **Eyebrow slits or cuts** are not allowed
- **Hair** below shoulder length must be tied back at all times, to prevent accidents and in the interest of hygiene, with simple blue or black accessories. Hair should be neat and a natural colour. No extreme hair styles are permitted
- **Jewellery** is limited to a watch, small stud earrings (maximum one in each ear) and, if desired, a fine chain with a religious symbol appropriate to the wearer. Inappropriate or additional jewellery will be confiscated and handed in to the School Office where pupils can collect it from 4.15pm onwards
- **Make-up** is permitted for pupils in Year 10 and above and pupils will be asked to remove it if not discrete
- **Nail varnish** is not allowed. Pupils who have nail polish on will be sent to the School Office at registration where there is nail polish remover and cotton wool available
- **Scarves, hats and gloves** should be navy or black with no logos
- **School coats** should be navy or black with no logos
- **Shirts** must be tucked in and all buttons done up
- **Shoes** should be a formal, black leather or leather substitute shoe. They should be well-fitting and support the feet. Shoes with a canvas upper, soft-soled ballet pumps or black trainers of any kind are not permitted. There should be no logos
- **Socks** should be navy or grey for boys, navy or white for girls. Trainer socks are not permitted. Tights should be navy or black
- **Sixth form students** should be dressed as if they are attending an interview with jackets to be worn by both males and females. Students who do not adhere to this may be sent home
- **Skirts (Kilts)** are not to be rolled up and should be knee-length or just above. If the kilt is being rolled due to the loss of a button, pupils will be sent to the School Office where there is a needle, cotton and buttons available
- **Sports kit** is not to be worn to and from school, in lessons, to assembly, for registration or in the Dining Room. No additional clothing from other sports retailers, clubs or associations is permitted. **Failure to wear the correct sports kit will result in the following: 1 unit of kit forgotten = 1 mark, 3 marks = Misconduct Mark, full kit forgotten = Misconduct Mark**

**Labelling of Clothing**

All clothing and major items of equipment must be marked with the pupil's full name.

**Second-Hand Uniform Shop**

The second-hand uniform shop is run by the Admissions team and is located next to the Admissions office in the Main School Building. Items can be tried on or taken home to try, providing they are either returned or paid for the following day. Uniform will be accepted into the second-hand shop to sell that is clean, in good repair and conforming to the current uniform list. Blazers and coats should be dry-cleaned or washed. Articles are priced by Admissions depending on condition. The School retains 20% commission on the sale price and the remainder is credited to parents via their school bill. Any items remaining unsold after one year are given to charity. Admissions can provide further information on purchasing or selling uniform. **Lost Property**

Lost property is held in the PE office and all pupils can enquire about lost items at break time. Parents can enquire about lost items, after school, on a Tuesday between 3.35 – 4.15pm.

Named items will be returned to Senior School pupils via Games lessons and to Junior School pupils at Friday assembly.

On the last afternoon of each term between 3.35 – 4.15pm any unnamed uniform will be on display outside the MUGA or in the Room to Question, dependant on the weather. Any unclaimed items of School Uniform will be donated to the Second-hand Uniform Shop and any unclaimed non-school uniform items will be donated to charity.

## Appendix D: Sixth Form Dress Code



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- Students are encouraged to develop a greater sense of personal responsibility as well as of personal style.
- Clothes should be suitable for an interview or a situation where they are representing the School.
- Types of clothing that could cause embarrassment are not appropriate. Very informal outfits must be avoided.
- The dress code is much more than what is worn; it is about displaying the highest standards of presentation whilst maintaining a personal image.

Key Items	Guidelines
<b>Jacket</b>	Any 'tailored' style garment. Not fur, leather, denim. Jackets should be available in school at all times and must be worn around the School.
<b>Skirt or shift dress</b>	Skirt length should be, at most, 10 cm above the knee and at least 10 cm above the ankle. Very short, tight fitting styles are not appropriate.
<b>Trousers</b>	Smart trousers appropriate to the ethos of the dress code. No jeans or jean style trousers of any kind i.e. not with rivets etc. No shorts or combats. No 'skinnies'. Girls, in particular, are not allowed to wear leggings, jeggings or similar on their own or with top, tunic or shirt only.
<b>Coat</b>	Tailored style – no leather or fur or with fur trimmings.
Additional Items	Guidelines
<b>Shift dress or similar</b>	Skirt length as above. No strappy styles and shoulders must be covered.
<b>Shirts and tops girls</b>	Strappy, cropped, halter neck, backless and sheer styles are not acceptable. Plunging necklines are unsuitable and tops should not have visible logos, or printed messages. 'Hoodies' and sweatshirts and any kind of t-shirts are not acceptable. Thickly knitted and shabby pullovers and cardigan are also not acceptable.
<b>Shirts and tops boys</b>	Tailored shirts only. No t-shirts of any kind and no tops with visible logos, or printed messages. 'Hoodies' and sweatshirts of any kind are not acceptable.
Accessories	Guidelines
<b>Shoes</b>	Sensible and appropriate footwear that should be of a neat appearance and suitable for School, bearing in mind the distances walked and the number of stairs on the site. Open heel shoes with no straps are not suitable i.e. no mules or flip flops. No trainers, canvas shoes or plimsoll style. No Ugg or similar boots. More formal styles acceptable. Students should give thought to health and safety issues when in laboratories and other practical rooms.
<b>Ties - boys</b>	Although preferred to be worn, ties are optional

- These guidelines are not exhaustive; the Assistant Head, Sixth Form, tutors and senior staff will give further guidance on suitability where necessary
- Tutor groups are encouraged to monitor standards of appearance in discussion with the tutor.
- The tutor will make the final judgement. Occasionally it may be necessary to refer a student to the Assistant Head, Sixth Form, who will offer further advice. If a student persists in wearing unsuitable clothing a second time they will be sent home by the Assistant Head, Sixth Form with a letter and when possible with a phone call home to parents. Students may also be requested to change into more formal attires kept in School by the tutor team if they do not comply with these guidelines.
