From 1946 - 1984 The Buck & Doe Run Valley Farms (aka King Ranch), operated a fabled working cattle ranch on America's finest grasslands right here in our community. Each year, thousands of cattle were sent from Texas to Chester County, Pennsylvania.

Significant efforts by the local community and the Brandywine Conservancy ultimately led to the purchase of the King Ranch property in 1984 which is now forever preserved, right here in our community, and includes 5368 acres of rolling grasslands, mature forest, centuries-old buildings, and important water resources.

Also included is 771 acres of the Laurels Preserve, which is some of the same land that the indegenious people of the Lenape Tribe once inhabited.

These efforts ultimately led to 33,000 of preserved acres in succeeding years. Together, King Ranch Inc. and the Brandywine Conservancy, Inc. orchestrated the most significant private conservation effort of its time. Without it, it was once rumored that this land would be developed by Disney, or even a nuclear power plant.
