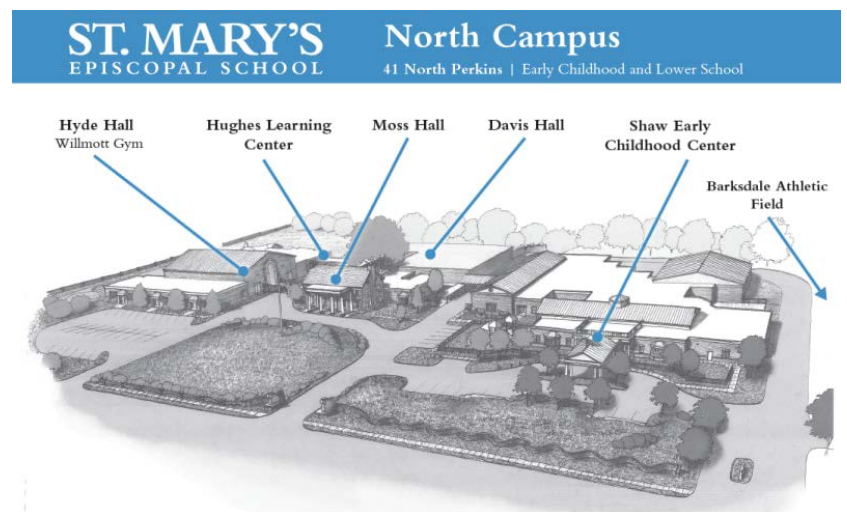
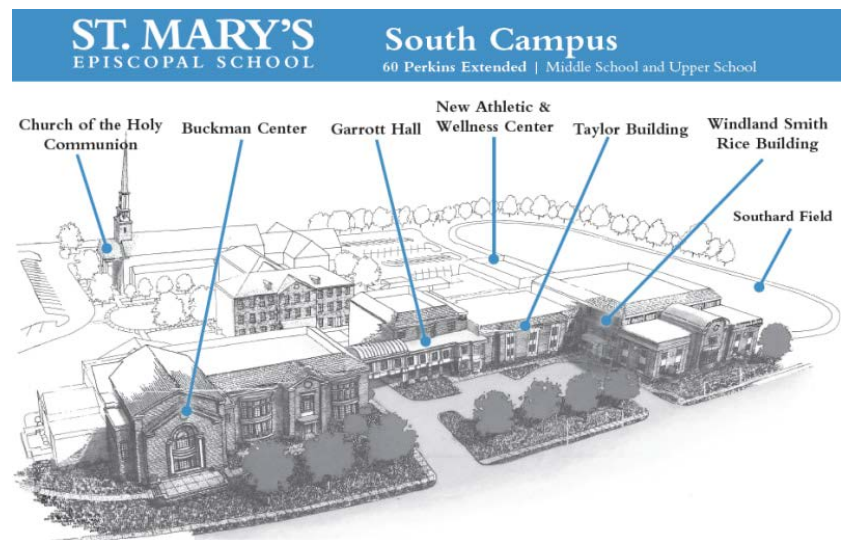
Late Fee

For good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is acknowledged, including, without limitation, my child or I being permitted on the campus of St. Mary’s Episcopal School (“SMS”) to attend school, camp, and/or after-school care, participate in SMS activities including SMS sports, clubs, early-care, or after-school care, and/or use SMS facilities including, without limitation, the Athletic & Wellness Center, Joy Field, Southard Field, and/or areas within Church of the Holy Communion used by SMS, Parent/Guardian and/or Student/Child agree to the following: **ACCEPTANCE OF RISK AND CONSENT:** I am aware that SMS is taking measures to protect its employees and students from the exposure and spread of COVID-19. Further, SMS is recommending that students, parents, faculty, and staff follow safety and health guidelines for the prevention of COVID19, including those issued by the City of Memphis, Shelby County, Tennessee Department of Public Health, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and any other applicable authorities.
