# CHS / ASU - DUAL CREDIT CONTRACT (Continued)

1. Specific details about **admission requirements and tuition rates** for ASU dual credit courses are listed on page 5. Admission requirements & tuition rates differ depending on whether the student plans to take DC courses at ASU or on the CHS campus.
2. All ASU-DC students must **complete the attached paperwork**, including the **ASU-DC Agreement form**. New ASU-DC students must complete the **ASU-DC online application** (instructions are on page 5). Due to limited space, these requirements should be completed by the end of March. Failure to complete requirements in a timely manner can result in removal from the DC roster(s).
3. **Approved DC courses** on the ASU campus (including information about weighted points) are listed on page 1 of this application.
4. Due to FERPA laws, CHS is not allowed to register students for courses on the ASU campus without their direct participation & approval. Therefore, **it is the student's responsibility to continue to work with the CHS Counselor/ASU-DC Coordinator until he/she is officially registered for the ASU course**. Therefore, you may need to stay in regular contact with the CHS (659-3400) even during the summer months, to ensure that you are registered for ASU courses that do not conflict with your CHS classes. To view ASU's class schedule, go to [www.angelo.edu](http://www.angelo.edu), click on "Menu", then scroll down and click on "Current Students", then "Class Schedule", enter the type of course, the course number, then scroll down and click "Class Search" at the bottom.
5. **ASU professors do not report grades or attendance** in SAISD's Home Access Center/Parent Connection until the end of the semester. It is the student's responsibility to communicate with his ASU professor regarding his/her academic progress.
6. College courses usually have **fewer grades than high school courses**. There are likely to be fewer opportunities to recover from a low test grade and/or major assignment. Therefore, it is imperative that the student thoroughly prepare for each assignment/test.
7. Short Term & Long Term **Carver placement is likely to result in the removal** from a course on the ASU campus. The student will be placed in a grade level course. ISS placement can also endanger the student's success in ASU courses.
8. If the student would like ASU to approve **Sp.Ed. or 504 accommodations** for the dual credit classroom, it is the responsibility of the student to apply for accommodations at <https://www.angelo.edu/current-students/disability-services/> and ask the his/her CHS Counselor/DC Coordinator to email supporting documentation to ASU.
9. **Attendance is very important**. A minimum number of "contact hours" is required for college credit. We recommend that students, who expect to miss several days (i.e. due to an extra-curricular activity, etc.), discuss this issue thoroughly with CHS &/or ASU DC Coordinators prior to enrolling in the course. It is the responsibility of the student to become familiar with the professor's attendance policy and to proactively communicate with the ASU professor, regarding any projected future absences.
10. **ASU's calendar can be different than the SAISD calendar**. ASU dual credit students may be required to attend classes on the ASU campus, even when there is a CHS holiday (e.g. SAISD Teacher Workdays, Wednesday before Thanksgiving, etc.). It is the student's responsibility to clarify attendance questions/concerns with their professor.
11. ASU dual credit students should **be proactive and have good communication** with their CHS & ASU teachers with regard to changes in their CHS or ASU schedule (i.e. activity schedule, STAAR testing, final exam schedule, etc.)
12. ASU-DC students or parents should **see the CHS Counselor/ASU-DC Coordinator immediately, if issues arise** that have a major effect on the student's ability to attend their ASU class (e.g. medical conditions, family emergencies, etc.)
13. ASU-DC students should immediately **contact the CHS Counselor/ASU-DC Coordinator if he/she is considering dropping an ASU class**. The student must get parent permission & sign an "ASU-DC Drop Request" form (available in the CHS Couns. Ctr.)
14. ASU's **last day to drop** with a "W" is usually about 6-7 weeks before the end of the college semester.
15. Each withdrawal will affect the student's overall **completion rate** for college courses and could affect future financial aid eligibility. College students are **limited to 6 drops** in their undergraduate career. Carefully consider the overall course load to avoid drops.
16. **Grades lower than a 70** (2.0 GPA) result in loss of CHS credit & ASU academic probation. Probationary students are only permitted to enroll in 6 hours (2 classes) & can be suspended if subsequent semester average is below a 70 (2.0). Although D's are passing on the college side, they are usually not transferrable to another university.
17. **CHS highly recommends** that students **check to see if their chosen dual credit course(s) will apply to their future college degree plan**. This information is usually available at the college's website under "Academics", or by talking to an admissions officer/advisor in your major field of study. Taking courses that do not fit in your degree plan can have negative consequences.
18. Students who wish to take **ASU Dual Credit Eng. 3 on the ASU Campus**, should understand that due to...
  - A. Texas curriculum requirements (TEKS), English 3 students are required to study a variety of things, including writing/composition skills & American Literature. And...
  - B. Since ENGL 1301-02 are strictly writing/composition courses, SAISD cannot ask an ASU professor to include American Lit. into these classes for high school TEKS purposes (like we can if taken on the CHS campus). Therefore, students taking Eng.3 on ASU's campus need to take ENGL 1301 in the Fall, ENGL 1302 in the Spr. & ENGL 2626 (Am. Lit.) in the Summer. ENGL 2626 is taken for curriculum purposes only (pass/fail) and is not posted to the CHS transcript or calculated into CHS GPA.

### Program Eligibility:

The off-site dual credit program is available to high school students subject to the following provisions:

1. Angelo State University must have a formal written agreement with the student's high school for off-site dual credit enrollment.
2. The student must meet all eligibility requirements and application dates set forth by ASU and the high school.

### Program Cost:

The student will receive a scholarship to cover 100% of the tuition and fees of up to three (3) lecture courses per fall and spring semester for courses taught by the high school teacher. Students taking courses over three lecture courses will be charged the dual credit rate. Courses delivered online will be charged the dual credit rate and will not receive a scholarship. It is the responsibility of the student to pay the tuition balance per term by the set ASU payment deadline. The 2021-2022 dual credit rate is \$50/credit hour; however, costs are subject to change for future years.

### Student Agreement:

- I agree that I am responsible for reviewing, understanding and abiding by the University's regulations, procedures, requirements and deadlines as described in all University publications.
- Pursuant to my rights under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), I give permission for ASU to disclose verbally or in writing information concerning my educational and financial records to high school administrators while enrolled as a dual credit student. (See [https://www.angelo.edu/ferpa/ferpa\\_for\\_students.php](https://www.angelo.edu/ferpa/ferpa_for_students.php) for more information.)
- Pursuant to my rights under FERPA, I give permission for ASU to disclose verbally or in writing information concerning my educational and financial records to the parents/guardians I have listed on my dual credit admission application while enrolled as a dual credit student.
- I will contact my high school counselor immediately if I need to withdraw from a course(s).
- I understand that dual credit students are not eligible for federal Pell grants or direct loans.
- I will maintain satisfactory attendance in my dual credit courses.
- I will notify ASU if my contact information changes (email, mailing address, etc.).
- I have read and understand the financial responsibilities information provided to me at the end of this document.
- I understand that I may receive a 1098-T Tuition Statement. (See <https://www.angelo.edu/services/controller/1098T.php> for more information.)

## Financial Responsibility Statement

When you initially register as a student at Angelo State University, you establish an account with the University through its Student Accounts Office. The terms of this agreement apply to all purchases, charges, fees, fines, tuition and loans made or obtained by you or someone else with your permission or on your behalf, or assessed to you, by, from or with respect to the University (collectively referred to as "Charges"), including tuition and fees.

A student who fails to make a full payment of tuition and fees, by the due date may be prohibited from registering for classes until the full payment is made. A student who fails to make full payment prior to the end of the semester or term may be denied credit for the work done that semester or term. Payments that are returned due to insufficient funds or stop payment do not constitute a payment in full.

You promise to pay to the total amount of all charges billed to your account, as well as all late fees, service charges, installment option fees, and interest allowed by law. You understand and agree if you drop or withdraw from some of all of your class for which you have registered, you will be responsible for paying all or a portion of tuition and fees in accordance with the published refund schedule at [https://www.angelo.edu/services/registrar\\_office](https://www.angelo.edu/services/registrar_office). This schedule is accordance with Texas Education Code 54.006.

You understand and agree if you fail to pay your account with Angelo State University by the scheduled date Angelo State University may refer your account to a collection agency. If a collection action is initiated with respect to your account, a collection fee will assessed and will be due in full at the time of the referral to the third party. The collection fee will be calculate at a maximum of 30% in accordance with Texas Government Code Sec 2107.003. You understand your account may be reported to one or more national credit bureaus. Your account is not a secured credit account. This delinquency may be reported to the State of Texas and a hold may be activated thus preventing you from receiving any funds payable to you from any state agency.

If a payment is made to your account and the payment is returned to the University as a result of insufficient funds or for any other reason, you agree to pay us the return payment fee in addition to the original amount. Pre-registered classes secured by a returned payment are subject to cancellation.

I agree not to incur Charges in excess of the amount specifically authorized by the University. The University reserves the right to refuse to allow further Charges to be placed on your account for any reason, at any time. You consent to the University or contracted agents, at our option, to report favorable and/or unfavorable credit information regarding your account to credit bureaus and other appropriate organizations. Delinquent accounts will be payable to the University until paid in full, or until the debt has been turned over to a collection agency or other legal authority for collections. Delinquent accounts that have been turned over to a collection agency or legal authority must be paid directly to that entity. The University will not accept payment on their behalf. If your account is delinquent, your academic record will be placed on hold and the University may restrict access to your grades and/or transcript. Registration for future classes may not be processed and further Charges to your account may not be allowed until the account is paid in full. You agree to reimburse us for the fees charged by the collection agency, which may be based on a percentage (at a maximum of 30%) of the debt, and all costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney fees, we incur in such collection efforts in accordance with Texas Government Code Sec 2107.003. Your account is not a secured credit account. This delinquency may be reported to the State of Texas and a hold may be activated thus preventing you from receiving any funds payable to you from any state agency.

You authorize the university, the departments, their respective agents and contractors to contact you regarding your educational debts at your current or any future number either provided or acquired for your personal phone(s) including but not limited to a cellular phone or other wireless device(s) using automated telephone dialing equipment or artificial or pre-recorded voice or text messages.

Every student may not meet the IRS requirements to receive the IRS Form 1098-T. Angelo State University provides a Tax Notification for the tax year whether the student meets the IRS requirements to receive the IRS Form 1098-T. Every student should access the Tax Notification and read the personal message at the top to determine if the student will receive the IRS Form 1098-T for the tax year. The Form 1098-T is not a receipt. Angelo State University does not report payments to the IRS. Payment information for the tax year is available in the Tax Notification or from the student's personal receipts. This agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with and pursuant to the laws of the State of Texas including, but not limited to Texas Education Code § 51.967, Limitation on Educational Debt.

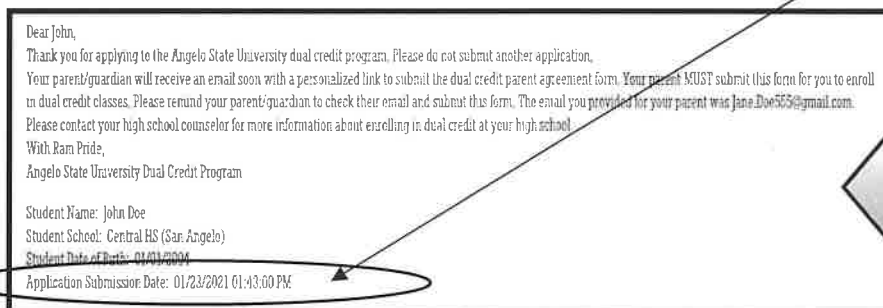

2. **New** ASU-DC students: **Complete the Online ASU-DC Application** - In order to be activated in ASU's computer system

- Click on "Presidential Scholar Dual Credit Program (Courses on the High School Campus)"
