

**Policy Statement #7004 (Construction) of the Board of Education
Regarding the Educational Specifications for School Renovation, Revitalization,
and/or New Construction Projects**

- I. Purpose
 - A. To ensure the development of a written document to convey the specific program and spatial requirements for school or support facility renovation, limited renovation, addition, and/or new construction projects
- II. Definitions
 - A. Educational specifications – a detailed description of the proposed educational activities for a particular school facility and the corresponding school facility architectural and design requirements that will facilitate those activities
- III. Policy Statement
 - A. The Board of Education of Calvert County believes that the first step in any renovation, limited renovation, addition, or new construction project is the identification of the building specifications required to meet the instructional and physical needs of students and staff. To that end, Calvert County Public Schools will develop a standard educational specification document for each planned school renovation, limited renovation, addition, and/or new construction project. This document will be adopted by the Board of Education and will serve as the foundation for the design and development of the school or support facility.
- IV. Delegation of Authority
 - A. The Superintendent is directed to develop administrative procedures to implement this policy in accordance with all local policies and local, state, and federal laws and regulations and to communicate this policy and accompanying procedures to all relevant parties.
- V. Exceptions
 - A. There are no exceptions to this policy. However, the Board, by majority vote, may temporarily suspend all or part of this policy. Suspension of all or part of this policy, however, in no way relieves the Board of its obligation to comply with the pertinent local, state and federal laws and regulations or the rules and regulations of the Maryland State Board of Education and the Maryland State Department of Education.
- VI. Review
 - A. This policy will be reviewed at the end of four years, or sooner, if approved by majority vote of the Board of Education in public session.

VII. Effective Date

- A. This policy is effective November 12, 2020.
