

2.6. Bullying and Hazing 2.6.1. Bullying Students who engage in any form of bullying against a school employee or student, on or about school property, on a school bus, at a school bus stop, or while traveling to or from a school location or school event, or at any school related or sponsored activity regardless of location or circumstance, may be suspended or expelled under the terms of this policy. It is the intent of the Davis School District to respond to school-related bullying incidents by implementing prevention efforts where victims of bullying can be identified and assisted, and perpetrators educated, in order to create safer schools that provide a positive learning environment. 2.6.2. Hazing [a] Hazing and initiation activities that involve hazing are abusive and illegal behaviors that harm victims and negatively impact the school environment by creating an atmosphere of fear, distrust, and meanspiritedness. The District is committed to providing a safe and orderly environment for all students that promotes respect, civility, and dignity. Any student who, individually or collectively participates in hazing or related initiation activity, or conspires to engage in hazing, at any time or in any location, will face immediate disciplinary action, up to and including suspension, expulsion, and loss of participation in [b] In addition, students who participate in hazing may be referred to appropriate law enforcement authorities and may face subsequent prosecution. [c] Reporting Requirement (i) School Personnel who become aware of hazing or related initiation activity shall report such incident immediately to school administrators so that prompt and appropriate action can be taken. School personnel who fail to report incidents of hazing to school or District administrators may face disciplinary action. (ii) Students who observe hazing activities and fail to intervene or report the hazing to school officials may face disciplinary action for conspiring to engage in hazing.

Bountiful Jr. High School Cheerleaders Contract 2021-2022

Conduct: A cheerleader is an extremely recognizable representative of a school. Cheerleaders are in a position of great influence; therefore, high standards of conduct and respect are essential. Cheerleaders should always conduct themselves to bring honor and positive recognition to the school. Cheerleaders are expected to follow all school policies and uphold high standards always. Theft, bullying, lying, cheating, teasing, swearing, or mistreatment of any kind will not be tolerated. Any offenses will result in immediate probation for the remainder of the current term.

Social Media: As a cheerleader, all social media postings including text messages, either posted by you or postings that you are part of, should be appropriate in conduct and language as to represent the school always. Any social media postings brought to the coach's or administration's attention that are deemed inappropriate will result in immediate probation for the remainder of the current term. In addition, any inappropriate or derogatory statement, comment, or post made to you or about you must be brought to the attention of a coach, administrator, counselor and/or parent BEFORE you respond, reply, post or re-post concerning the statement, comment or post in question.

Membership: Grades and citizenship will be checked at each term. GPA must be maintained at 3.0 or above during tenure as a cheerleader. If a cheerleader does not meet this requirement and/or has an "F", a "U", or 2 "N's", the cheerleader will be put on probation for the entire following term. If two probations are needed, the cheerleader will be permanently dismissed from the team. Cheerleaders must follow all school rules. Failure to do so will result in being placed on probation for the rest of the current term. Cheerleading requires extensive amounts of personal time. It is expected that cheerleading will take priority over other extracurricular activities. Cheerleaders are expected to commit themselves to the team for the entire school year. If issues arise that require mediation please speak with the cheer advisor, your school counselor or an administrator for help.

<u>Probation:</u> Probation period is from the time the cheerleader is put on probation until the end of the current term. The student will be placed in a Study Skills class for the period assigned as Cheer for the probation time. A cheerleader who is on probation cannot represent the school in any way, including:

- a) be in uniform or dress in any representation of being a cheerleader (e.g. wear jacket)
- b) warm-up or practice with the team
- c) be introduced as a member of the team
- d) use the team locker room

A cheerleader who has been on probation and does not meet academic, citizenship or conduct standards at the end of the probation period will be permanently removed from the team for the rest of the school year. If a second probation becomes necessary, the cheerleader will be automatically removed from the team for the rest of the school year.

<u>Games</u>: Cheerleaders should be present at all games and initiate positive crowd management with chants and cheers for the entire duration of the game. Cheerleaders are expected to cheer for varsity and junior varsity games in volleyball, girls' and boys' basketball and wrestling. Cheerleaders are not allowed to be on their phone, chew gum, eat food, or get drinks (except water) during the games. Cheerleaders must stay in their assigned places. They cannot get out of line to talk to friends, to each other, or to parents. Cheerleaders must be in complete uniform and ready to go 10 minutes before all games. This includes being warmed up and stretched out. Cheerleaders are expected to be in their place ready to go at the beginning of each quarter (including coming back from halftime). No jewelry

(earrings, necklaces, bracelets, rings, watches) or any other item that is not considered part of the uniform will be allowed. If a cheerleader plans to leave a game early, this must be cleared <u>prior</u> to the game with the advisor in charge.

<u>Travel:</u> Cheerleaders are required to ride the bus to all away games and back. Exceptions to this rule will be given only when a parent/guardian signs the appropriate release form and gives it to the advisor in charge.

<u>Practices:</u> Cheerleading requires a great deal of time before and after school and during the summer months. Participation in practices is mandatory. All absences must be cleared prior to the absence with the advisor. Transportation for these practices/activities is the responsibility of the cheerleader and parent/guardian.

Athletic Events: Cheerleaders will need to attend all athletic games. Cheerleaders will miss some class time to attend the away events and will be required to make up all missed work. If a cheerleader misses more than 1 game per athletic season for any reason they will be put on probation.
