The International Education/Education Leadership (IEEL) specialization is a unique opportunity for experienced professionals to study with world-renowned faculty, taking courses that focus on both theory and practice while engaging in research that is meaningful to you.

Program Design

The International Education/Education Leadership PhD specialization is designed to:

- Enhance your knowledge and skills, useful in current or planned international educational and leadership roles.
- Improve your ability to analyze and conduct research about current social, economic, political, and ethical issues and concerns related to international educational and community situations and activities.
- Prepare you for leadership roles as a senior-level administrator, leader-practitioner, policy maker, academician, and researcher.

To accomplish these goals, students engage in a variety of intensive courses, independent studies, seminars, and internships of a highly practical nature. Students will have an opportunity to work with internationally recognized faculty at one of the highest-ranking and most diverse universities in the United States.

With courses online during the fall and spring, and a five-week summer residency, students will be able to complete all coursework in three years. Working closely with multiple faculty members, students will have a supportive environment to complete their dissertation after their coursework.

Goals Statement: The goals statement is 750–1000 words and should describe your academic and career goals related to the intended program.

Transcript: Students can upload their unofficial transcripts for application review. Visit our website for specific information.

GRE Scores: Scores must be from an examination taken within the last five years. Official test scores must be received by Mason by the application deadline.

Three Letters of Recommendation: Applicants should follow the instructions included within the online application to submit the recommendation form directly to their recommender.
