The 1968 Vianney Griffin football team won their second straight CAC championship and clinched the class 4-a state playoff berth in District 3 with its 26—7 victory over the Aquinas Falcons. Vianney dominated the entire game, both on the ground and in the air. Quarterbacks Jim Sasser and Phil Reed threw scoring tosses to Randy Welker while Sasser added another to Kevin Higgins. Higgins completed the Griffin scoring with a 2 yard TD run. The defense, led by guards Jerry Ortinau and Larry Bath, held Aquinas to four first downs and 7 points in becoming the area's top defense team.

ST. MARY'S WASHED OUT

The Griffins became the only undefeated, untied team in the St. Louis area and the first team in the history of the school to complete a perfect season when they downed the St. Mary's Dragons 16—0. The game started slowly due to the rain and mud, but the Griffin defense finally broke through in the second quarter when Dale Pleiman dropped a St. Mary's runner in the end zone for a safety. After this, the Griffin offense went to work demolishing the Dragons, and scoring four more times before the game ended, although two of the scores were called back for penalties.

Vianney later drove to the McCluer 30 yard line where the Griffins were stopped inches shy of a first down. McCluer then ran out the clock.

Vianney finished the season with a record of 10-1. We were ranked fifth in the prep poll and had had the area's top defense.

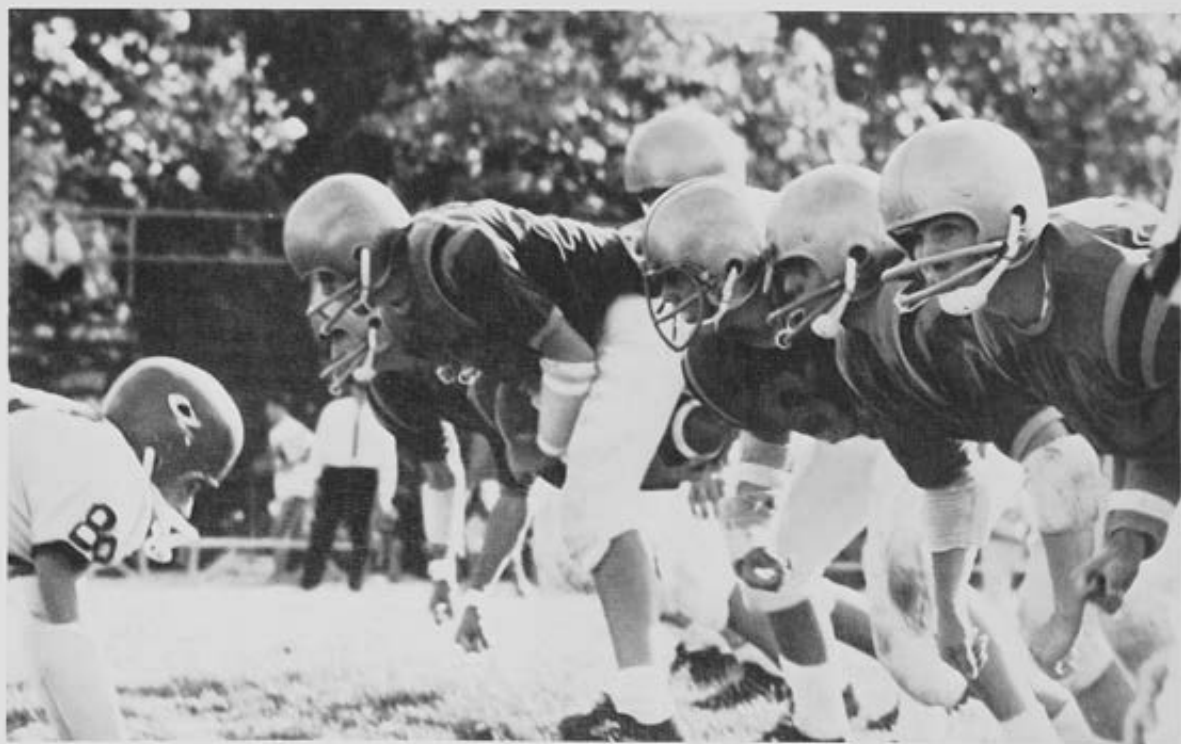

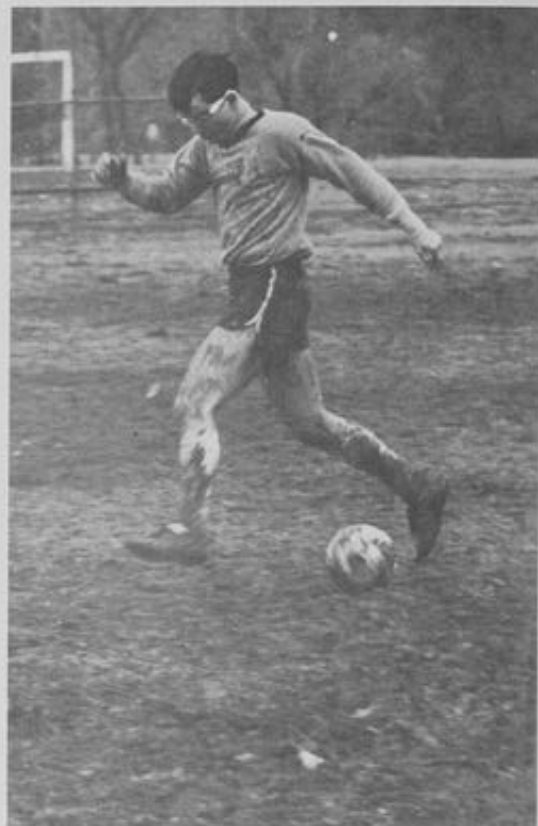

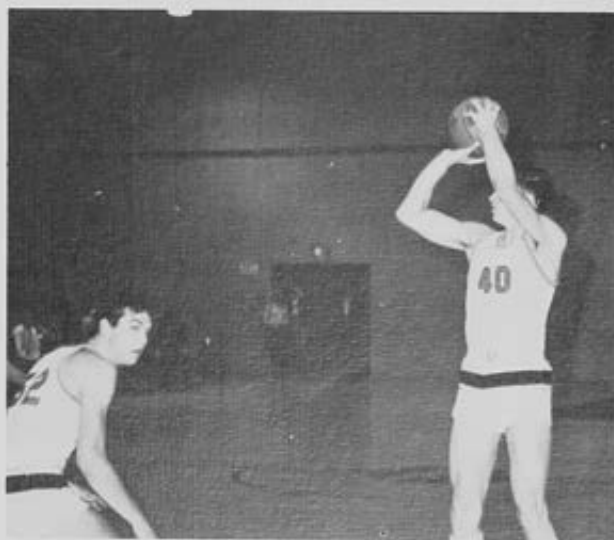

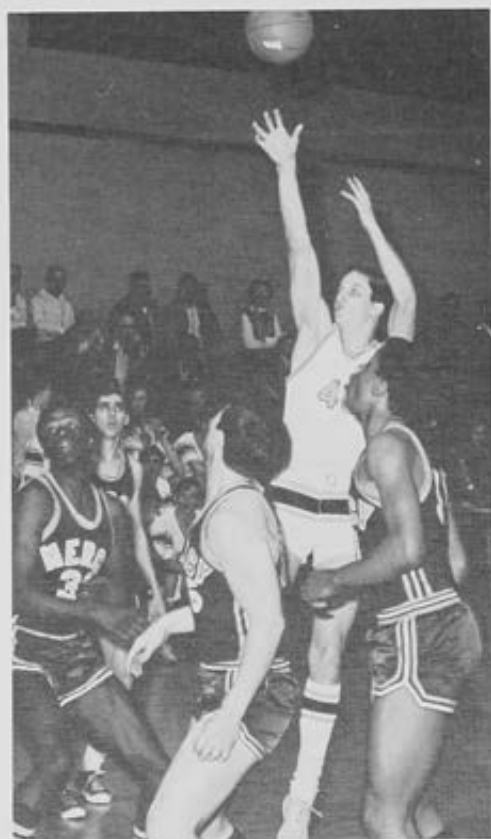

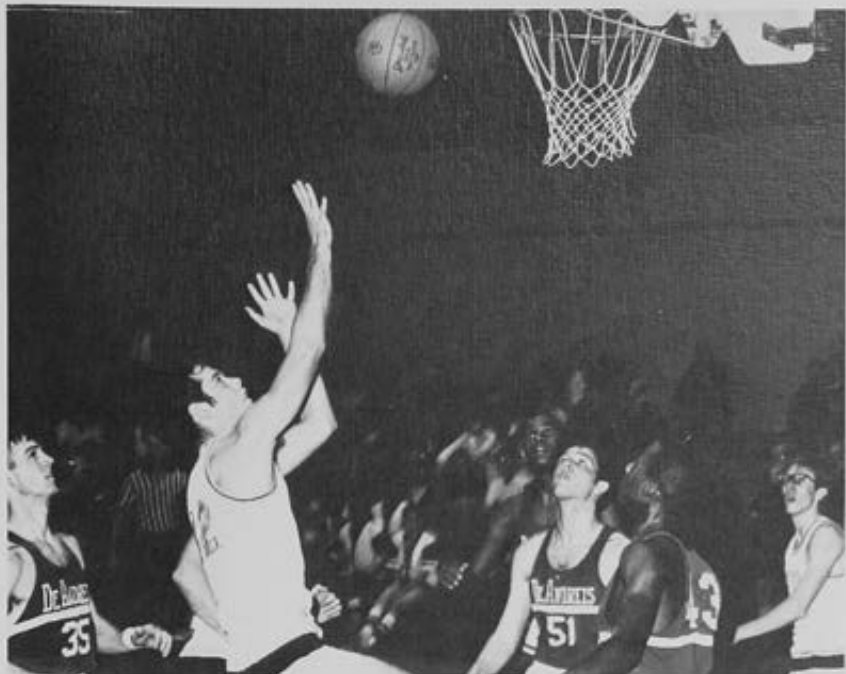

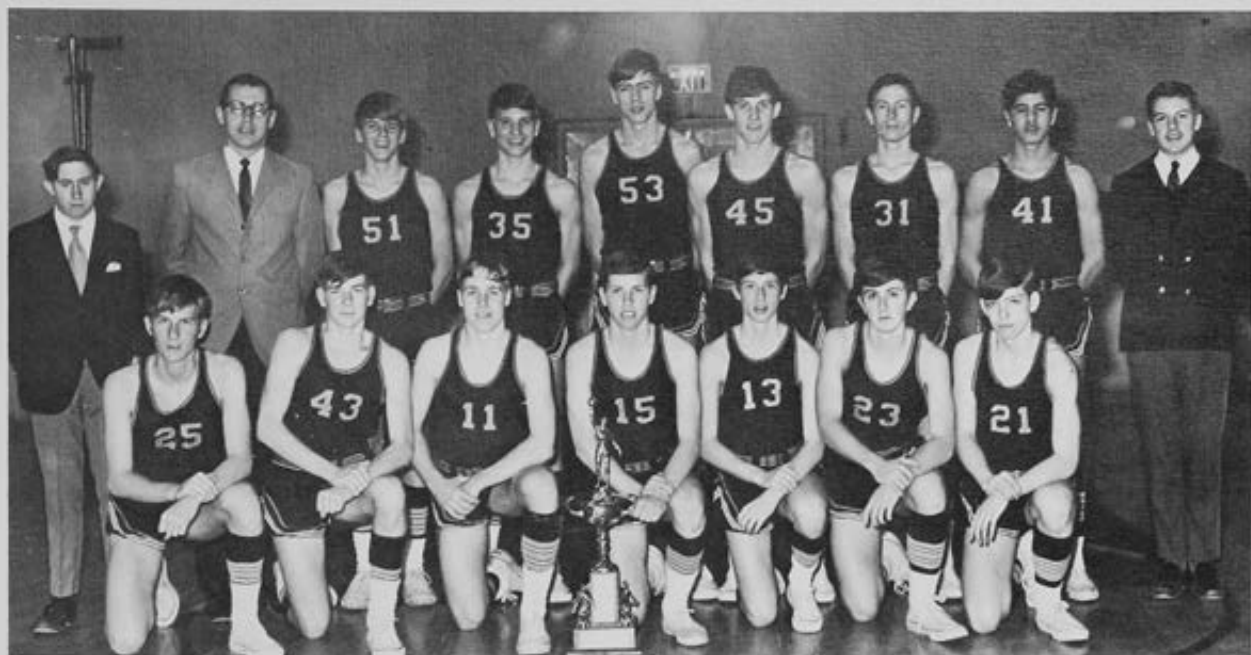

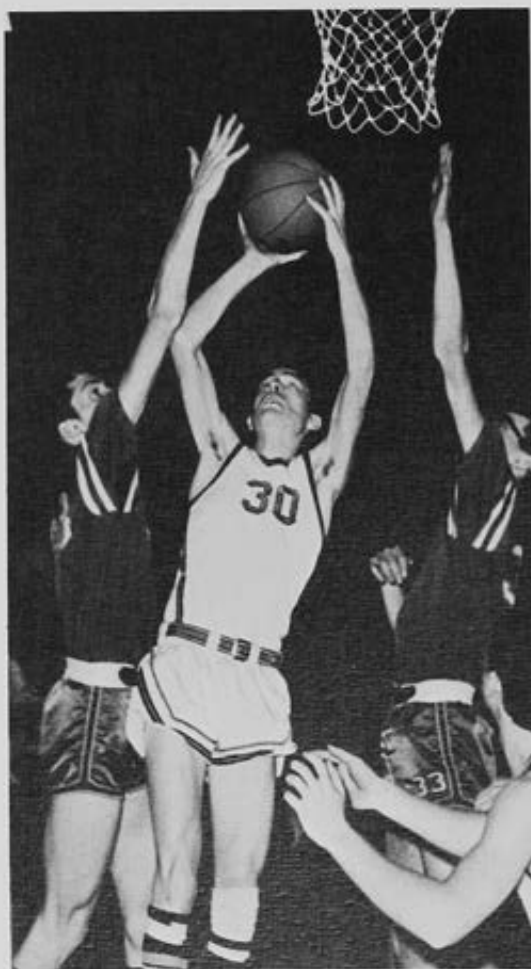

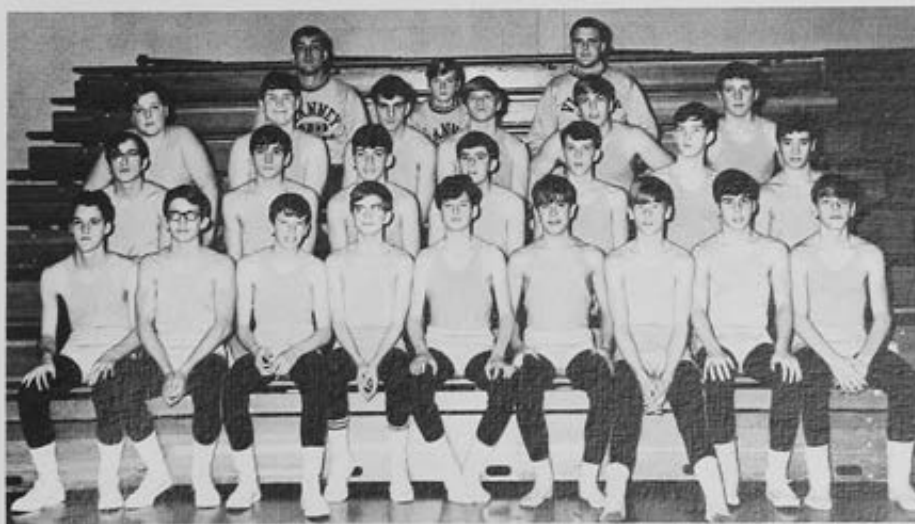

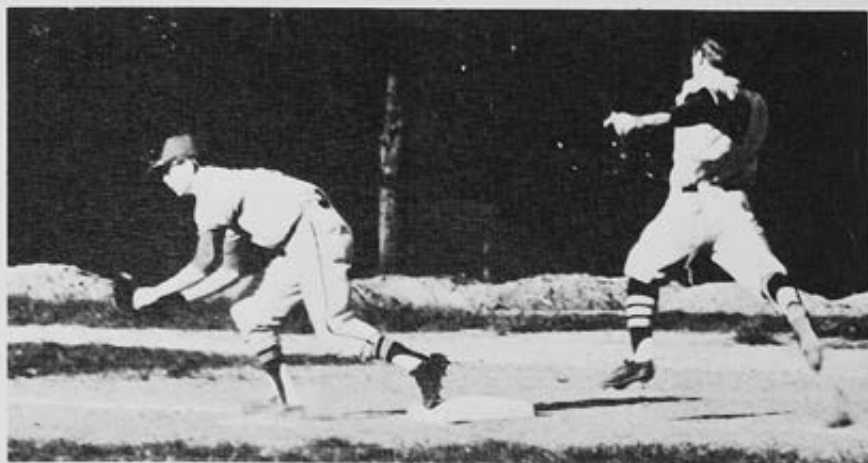

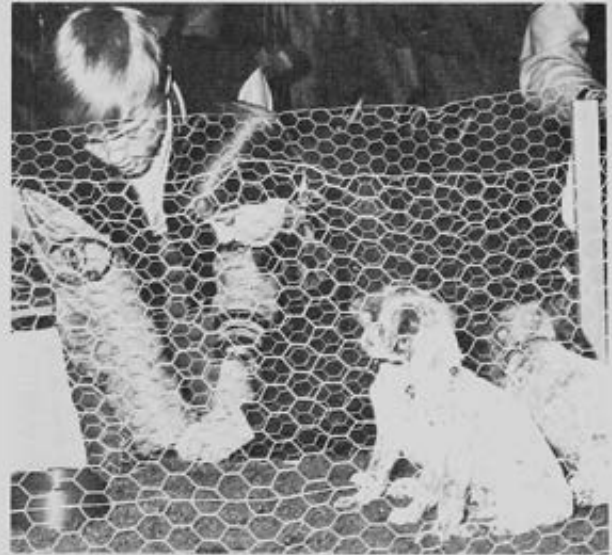

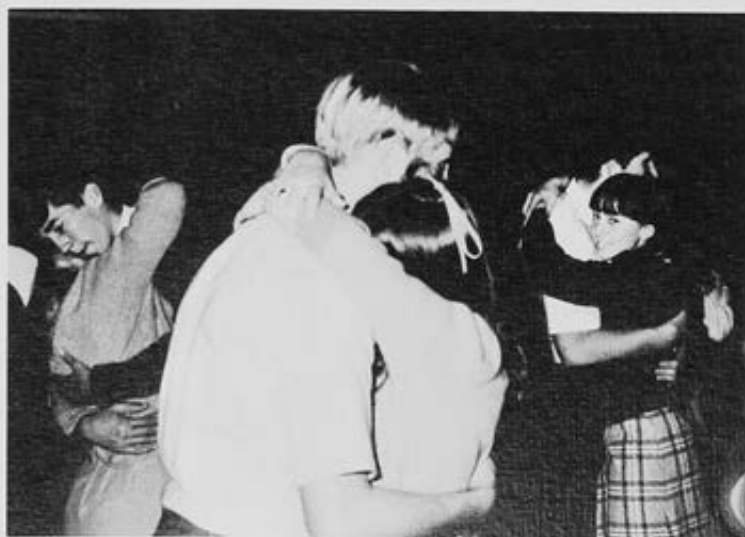

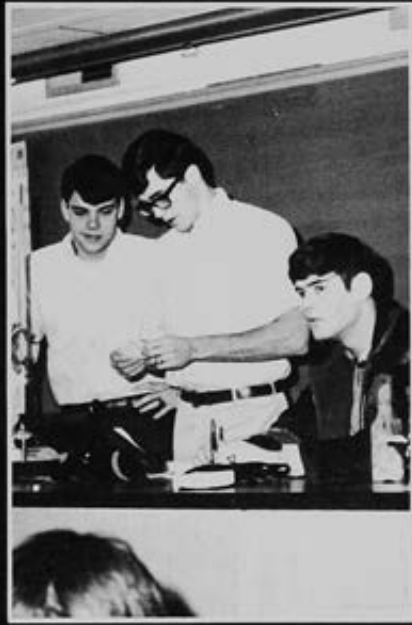

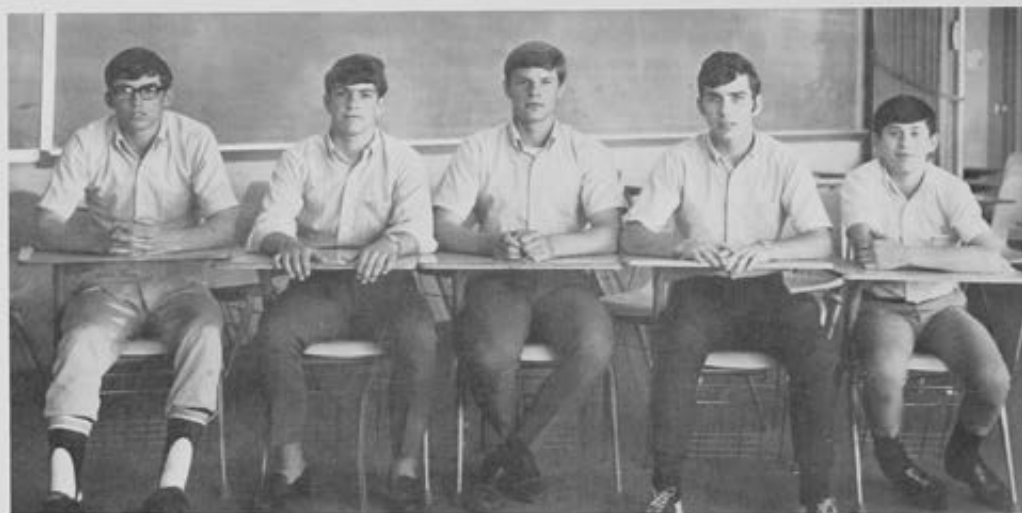

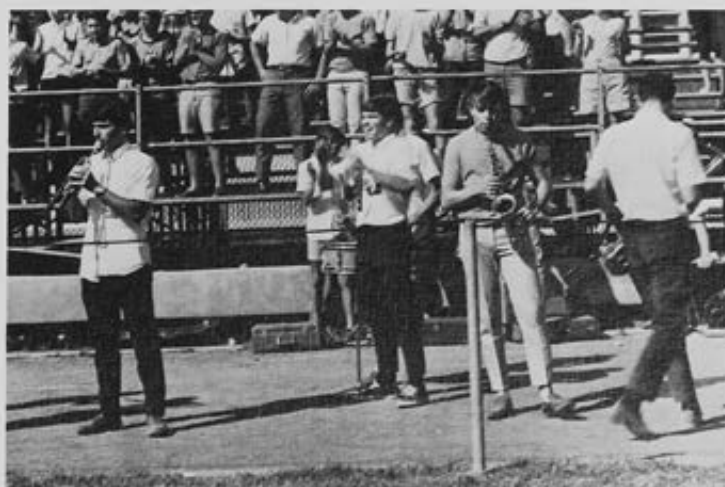

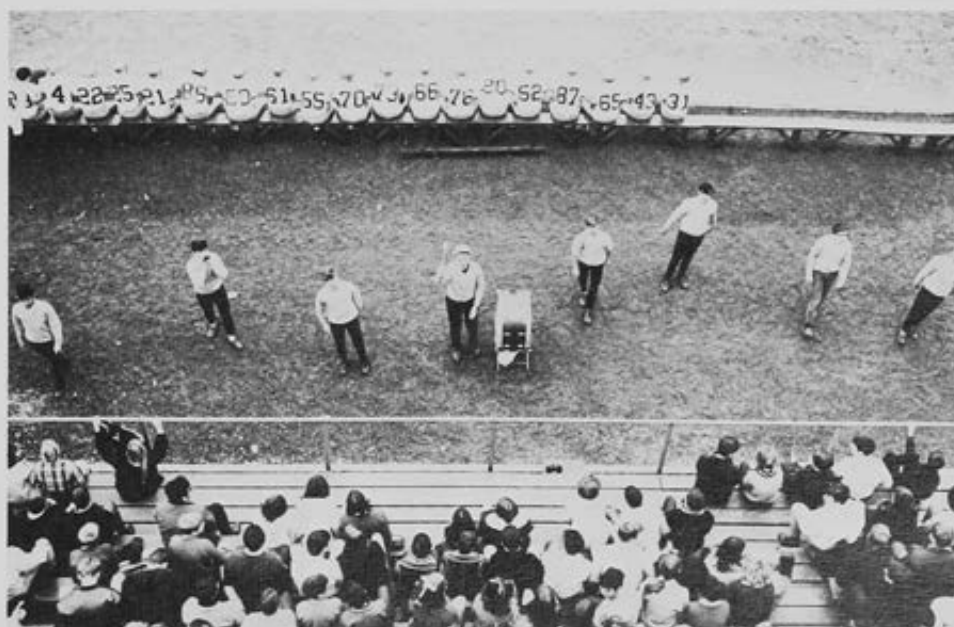

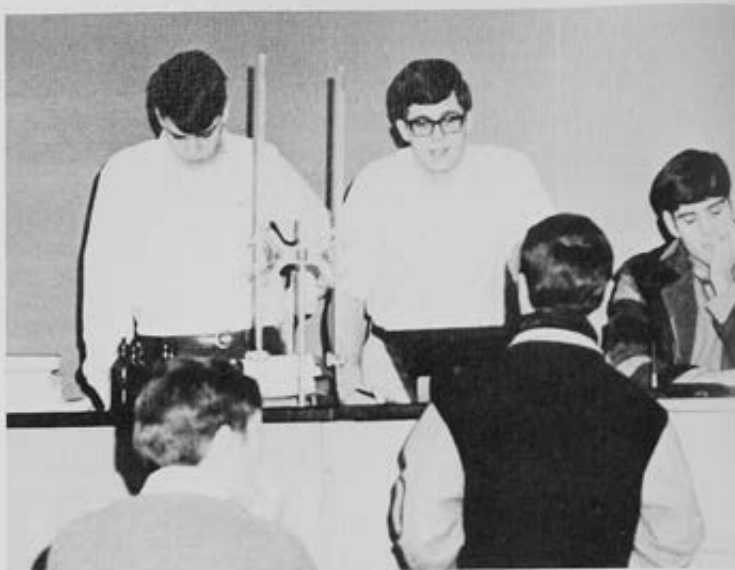

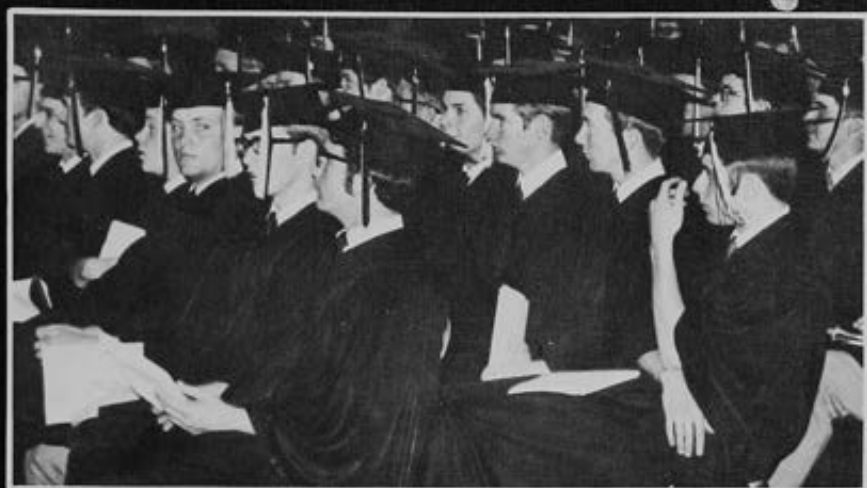

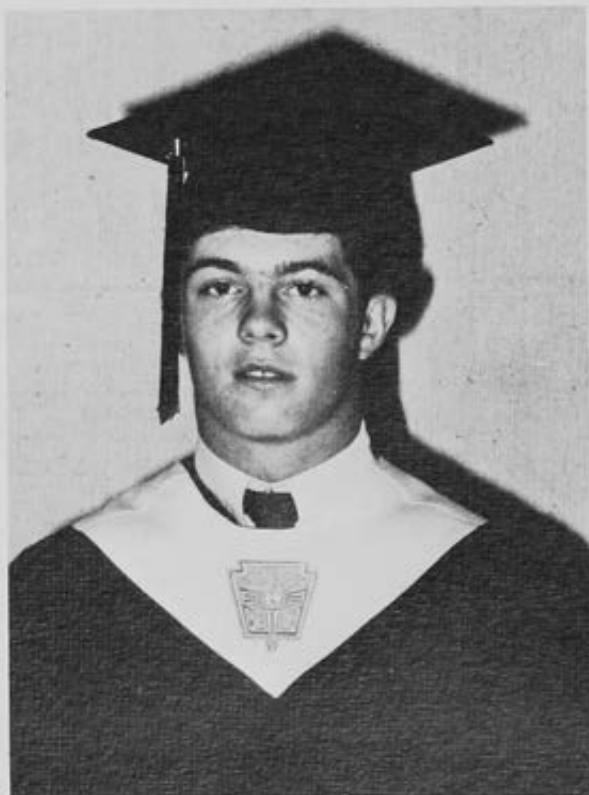


Gene Swacker—Valedictorian

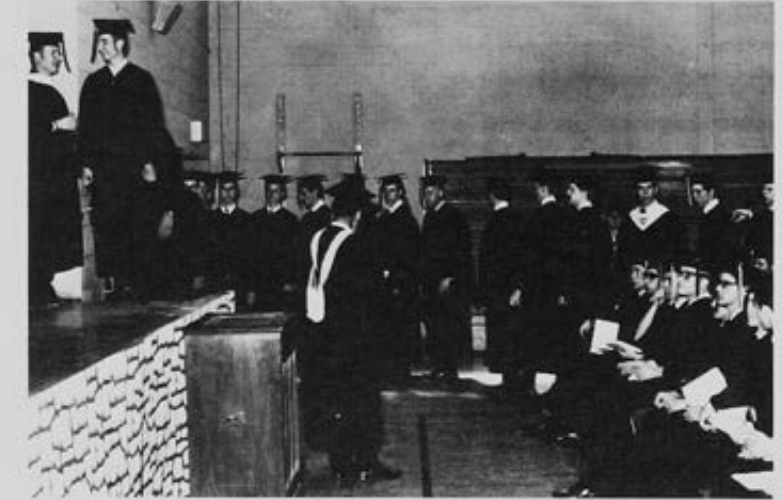

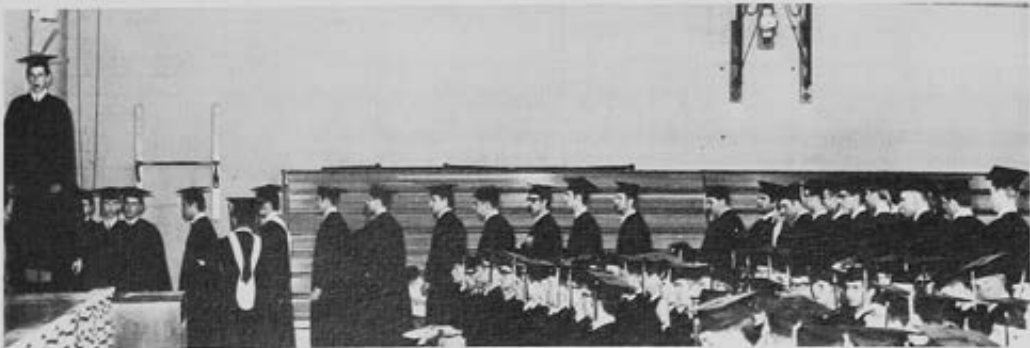
