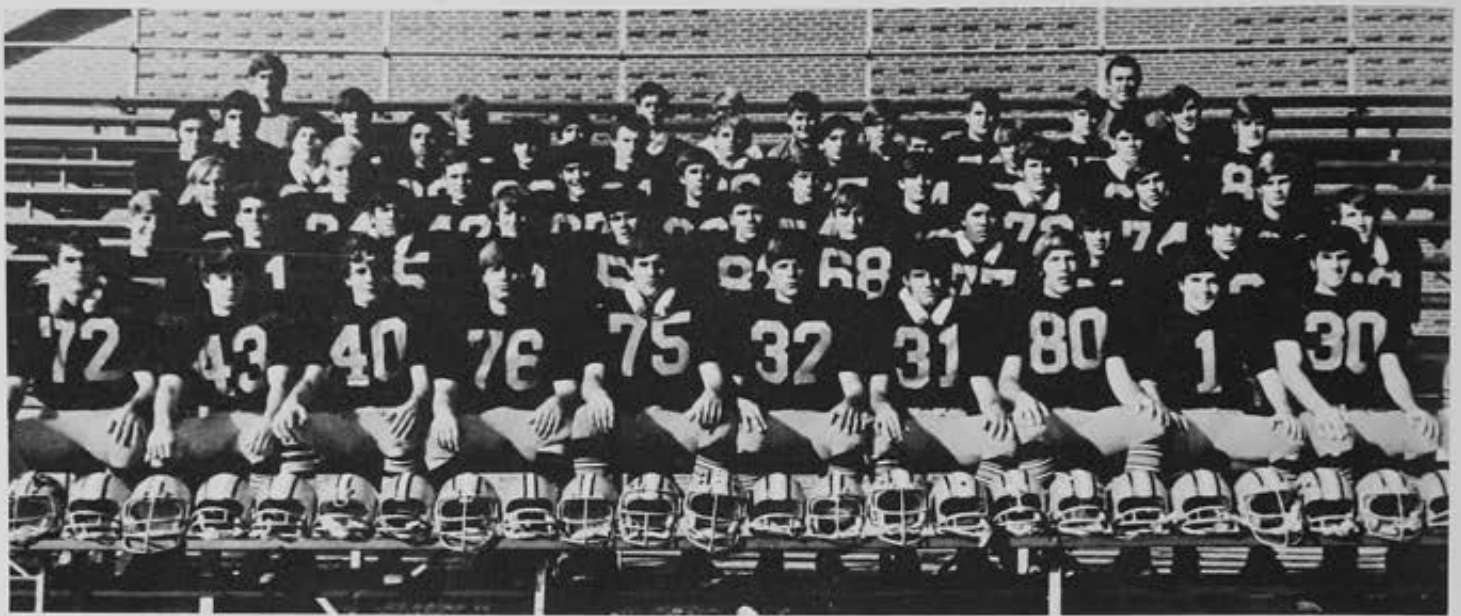

## Inconsistent - Season

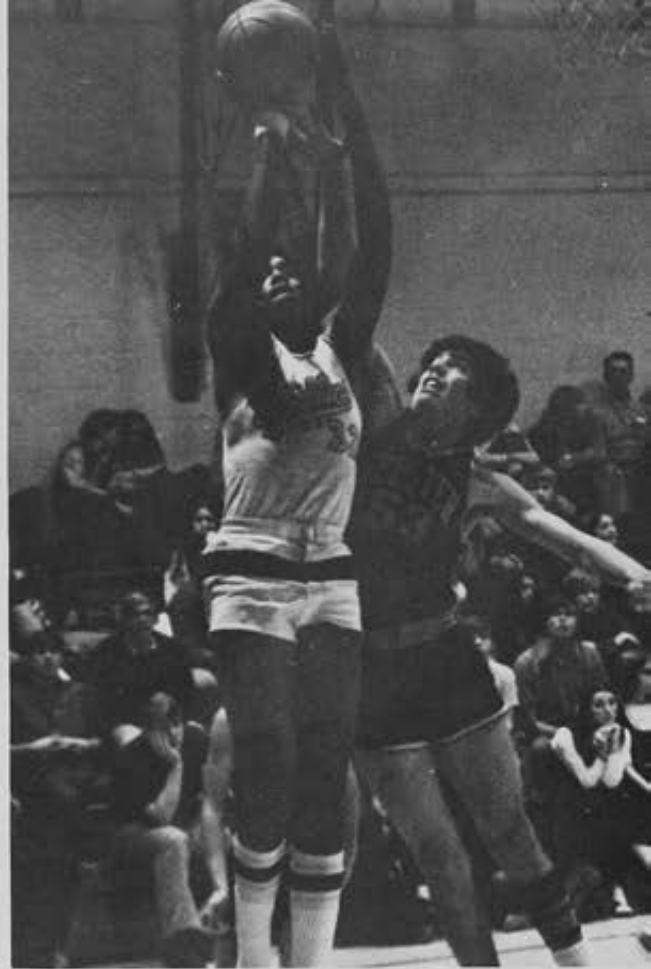

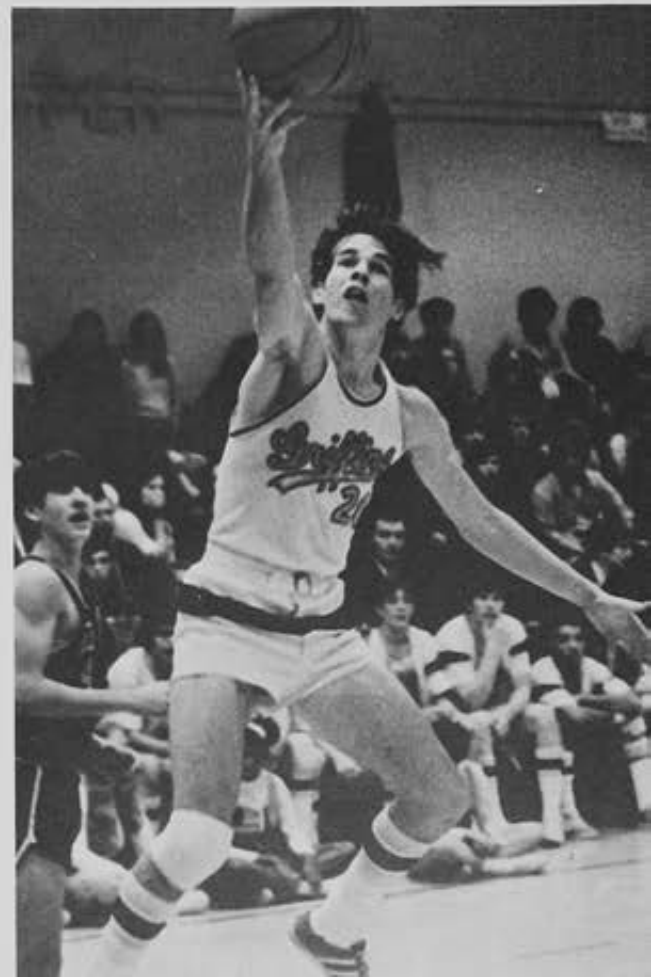

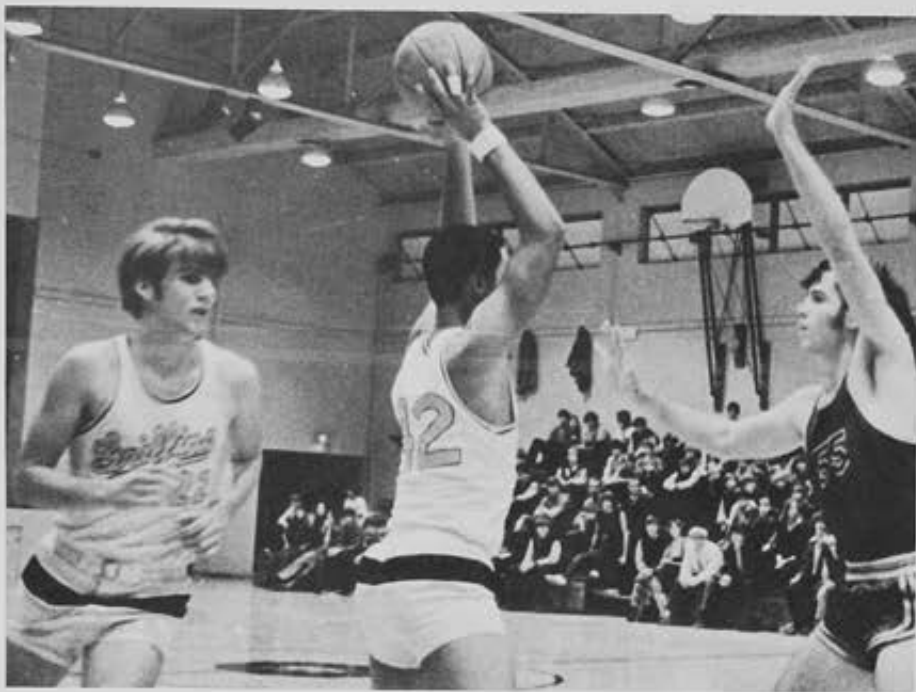

# Wrestling Comes of Age

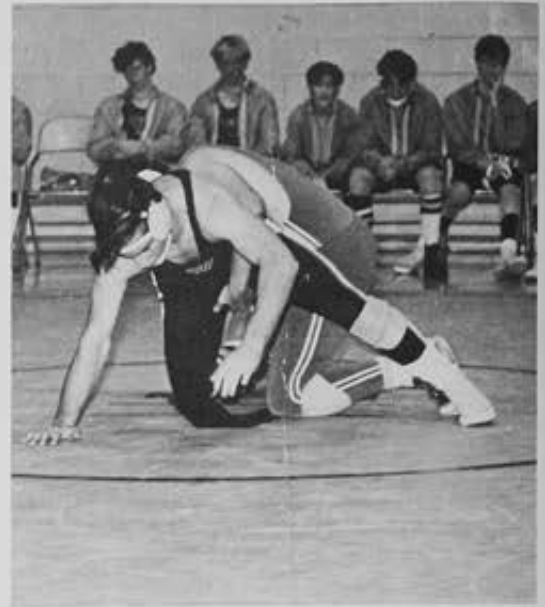

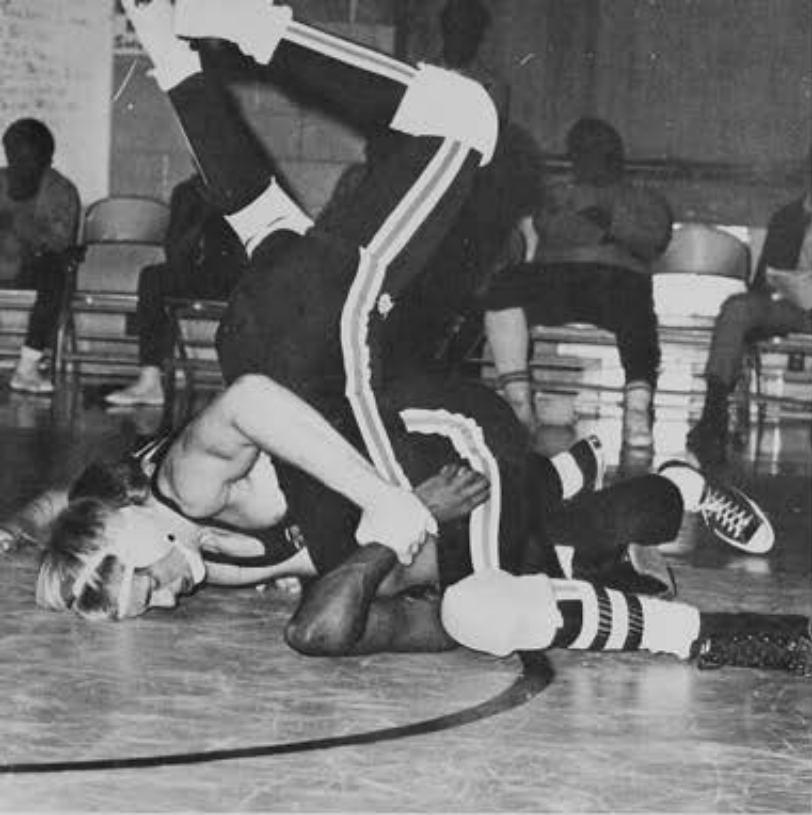

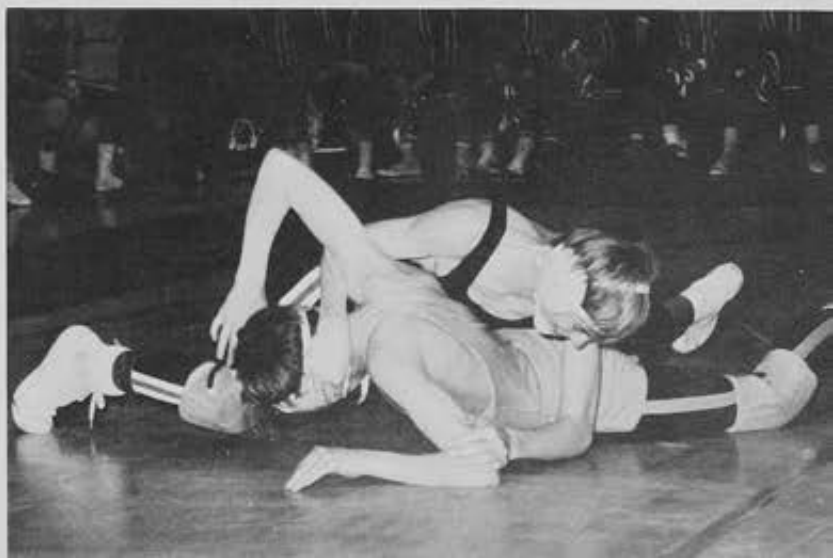

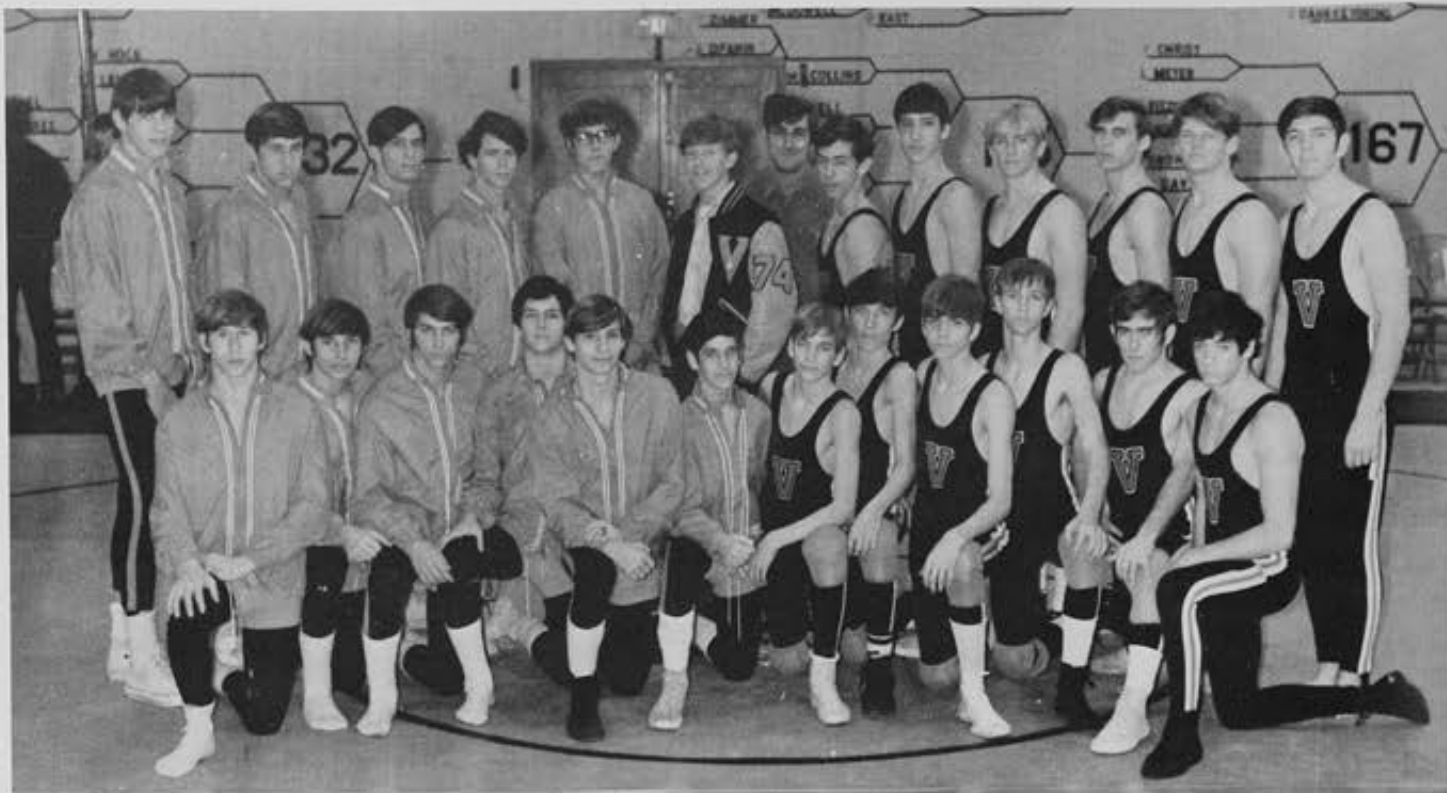

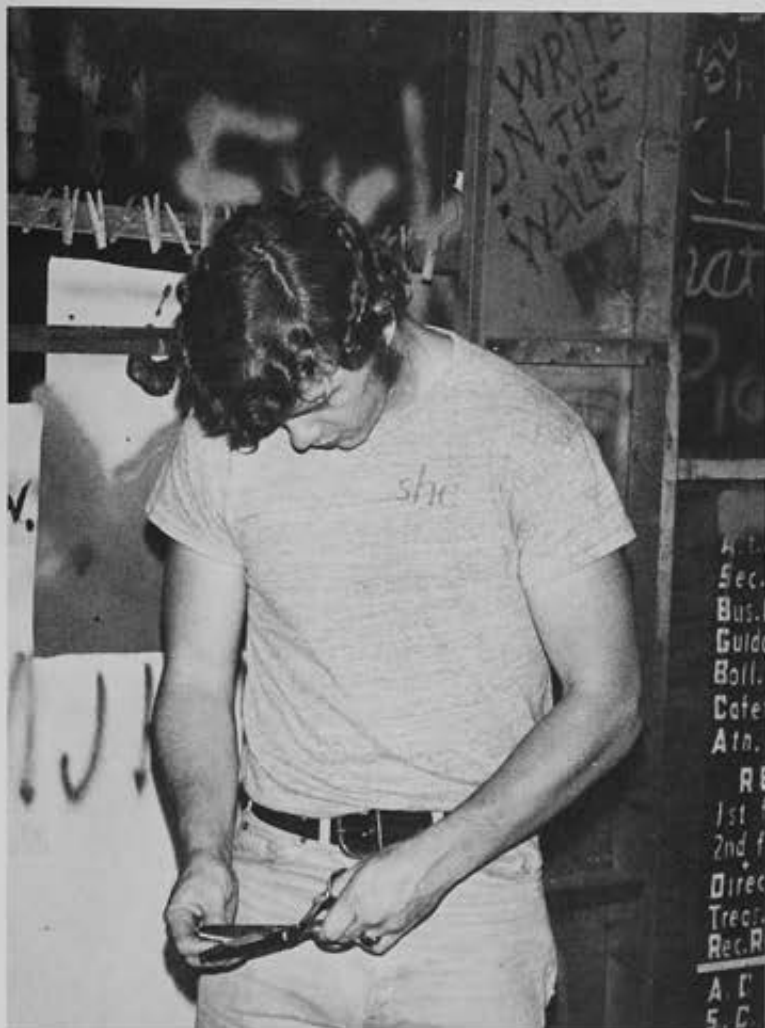

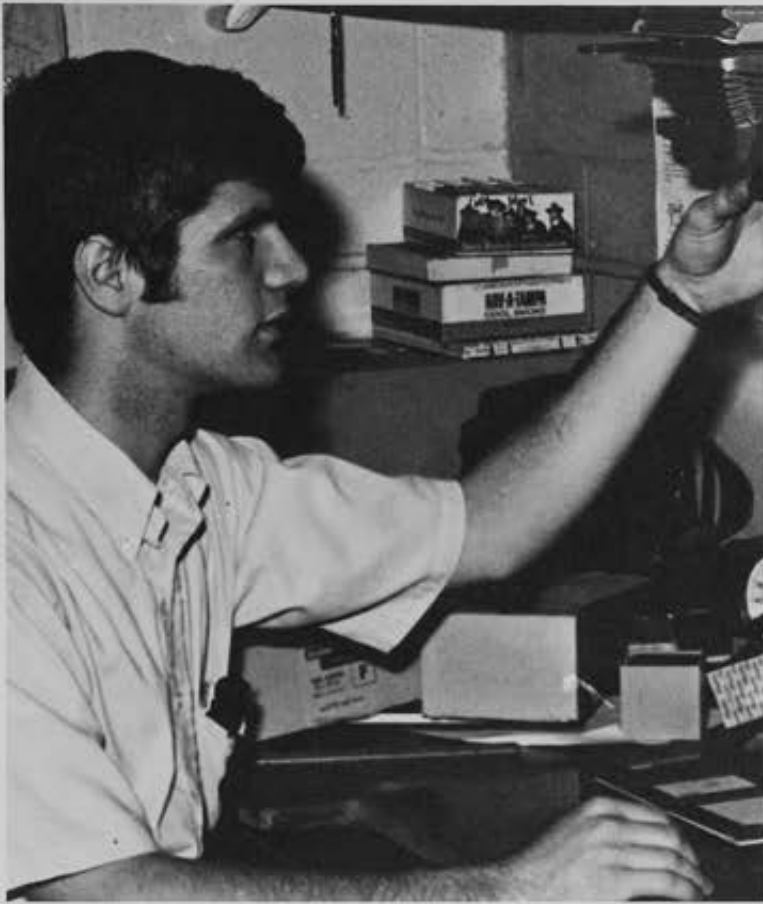

The other editors also proved

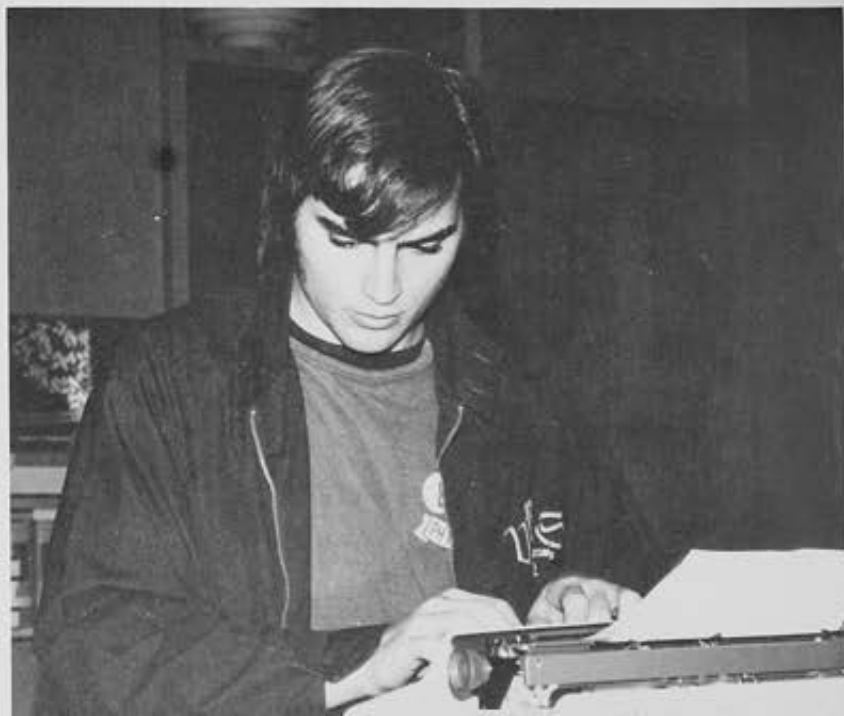

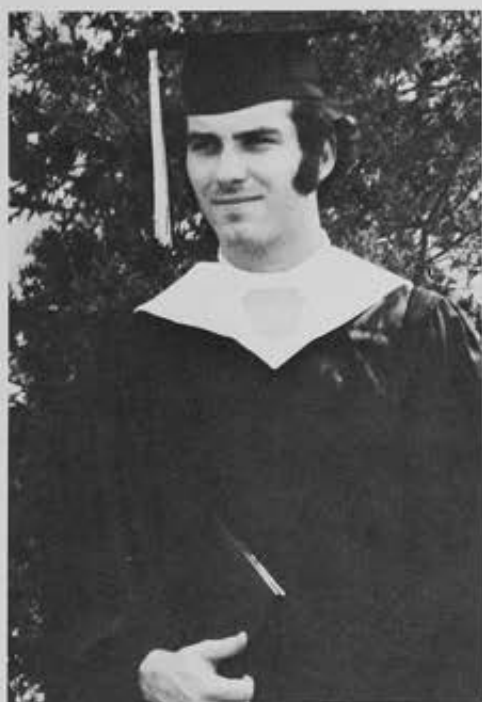
