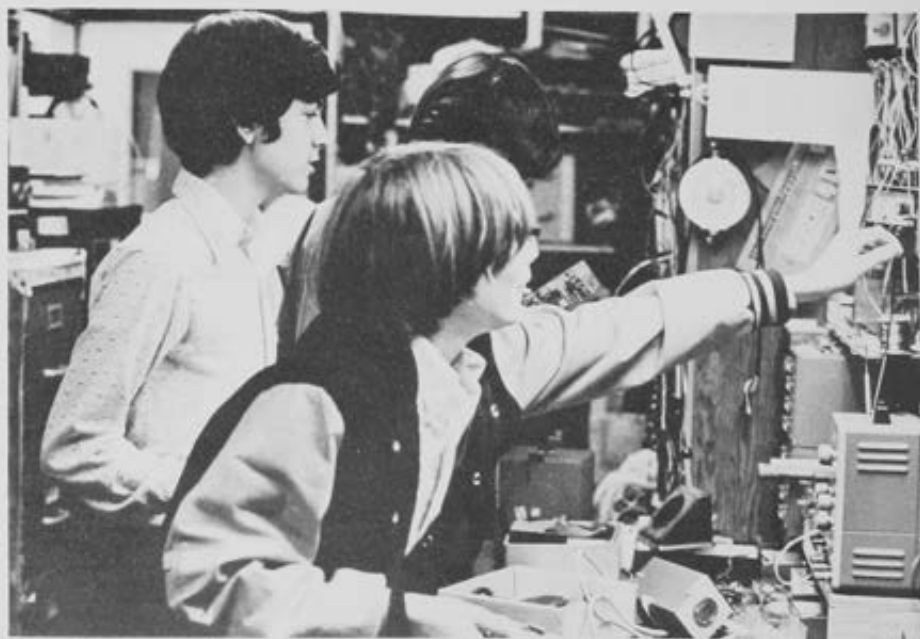

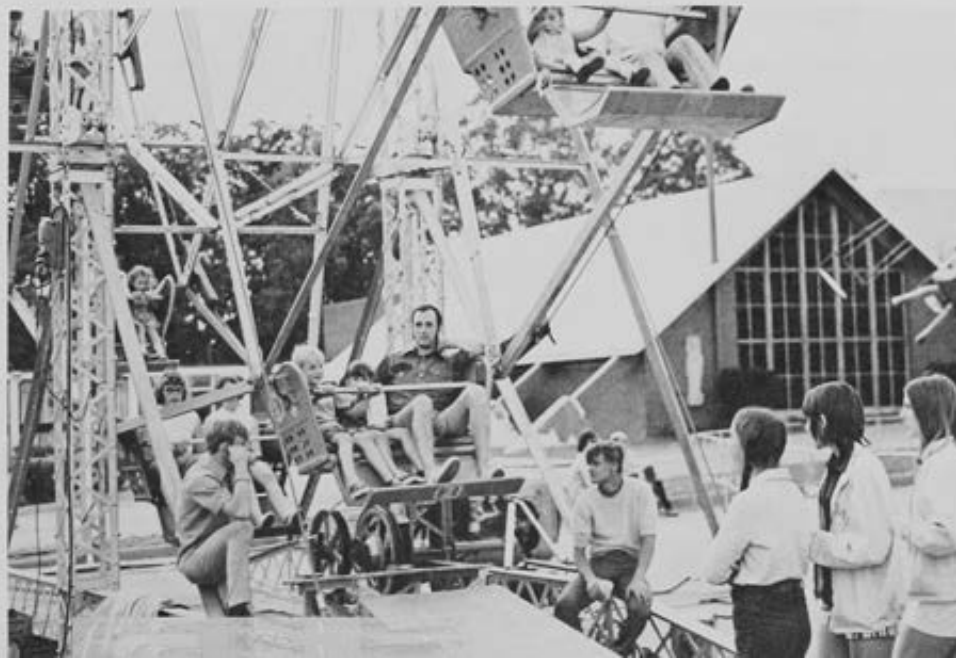

Shortly after the beginning of the second semester of last year, the student body and faculty were confronted with the idea of an NCA evaluation. Naturally, not too many students knew what this was. Under the coordination of Mr. Charles Eisele and Bro. William Chewning, this NCA (North Central Association) evaluation was explained as a self-evaluation process, by which the school should become aware of its strong and weak points. The self-evaluation process took well over a year of hard work by the administration, faculty, and student body. Every area of Vianney (each academic department, all activities, the administrative processes of

the school, the Student Council, etc...) was carefully reviewed and evaluated. After Vianney had finished this self-evaluation, representatives of the North Central Association (an accrediting association for secondary schools, colleges, and universities) came to Vianney to evaluate our self-evaluation. 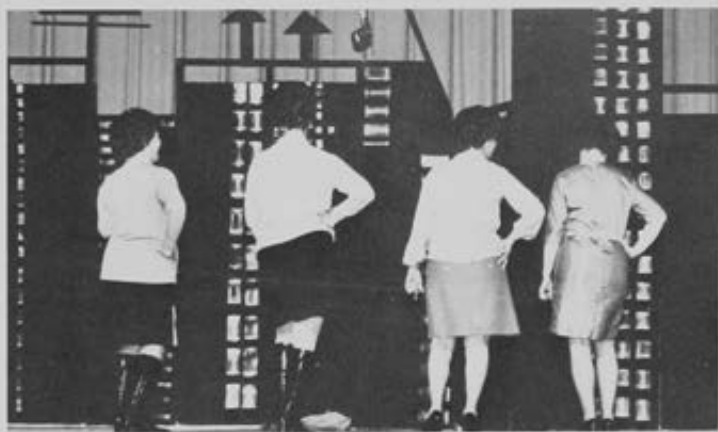

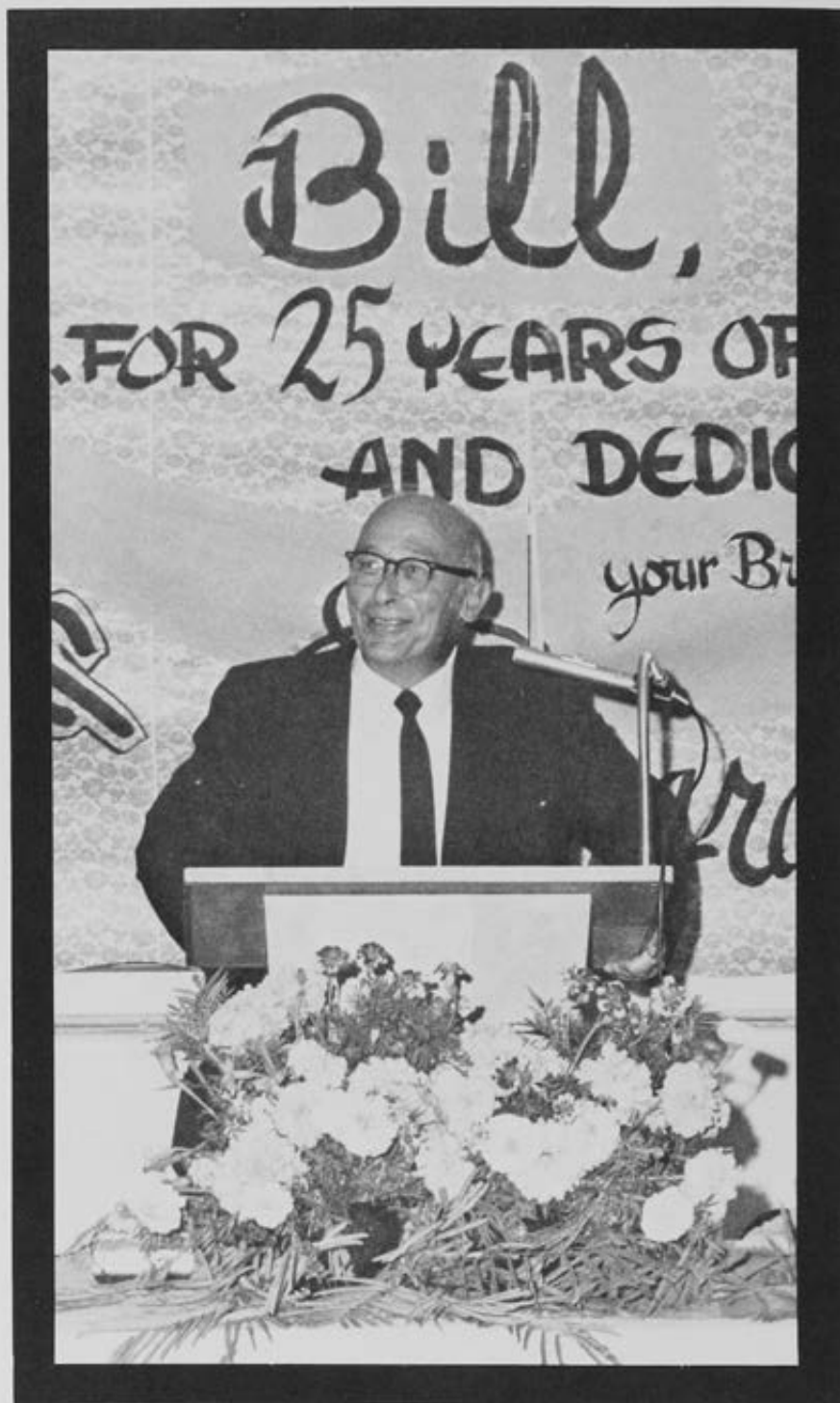

Fall Sports

Well the Vianney Griffins opened their 1972 season with several question marks, the most notable one being this year's offense's lack of depth. However, Vianney showed a ball control offense, and it was an offense which led the area throughout most of the season in points scored. The Griffins finished with a total of 280 points, an average of 28 points per game, compared to the school record of 282 set in 1970. The defense showed it was tough averaging 6.5 points a game while posting six shut-outs tying a mark set by that 1970 team, a squad which finished 10-0.

The Griffins opened their season against the Southwest Longhorns. The outcome was

never in doubt, as Vianney posted its first shut-out 26-0.

The Griffins next encounter was with the Celts of JFK. Vianney's starting unit again did not finish the game as the score mounted 48-0. The third contest was the first home game of the season with DeAndreis bowing to the Black and Gold for three in a row 40-0. Disaster struck in the form of overconfidence and turnovers in the fourth game, as the Falcons upset Vianney, 15-10.

The Griffins sought revenge the next two weeks, pounding Rosary at home, 42-13 before outscoring cross-town rival Kirkwood, 31-22. The following game was just a warm-up as DuBourg went down with a 43-0 defeat.

The stage was set for the biggest game in Vianney's history. Over 4,000 enthusiastic fans crowded Griffin Stadium in great anticipation. Both squads were equally balanced and impressive in all positions. In the fourth quarter the Griffins finally put together the only successful drive of that overcast Sunday afternoon. Mike Chambers bulled over from one yard out for the game's only points. Mike was named the game's MVP; the Vianney team was honored by KXOK as the "Prep Team of the Week."

The tremendous spirit and enthusiasm generated at the Homecoming Game was not to be found the following week at Roosevelt Field. The Dragons of St. Mary's accounted for Vianney's second loss, which cost the Griffins a CAC Co-championship and a potential state play-off berth. The Vianney Golden Griffins finished the season with a fine record of 8 wins and 2 losses, whitewashing Mercy 21-0 in their final home game. We will remember defeating two ranked teams, Kirkwood and Chaminade, placing 9 players on the CAC All-Conference teams, and five more on the All-District team.

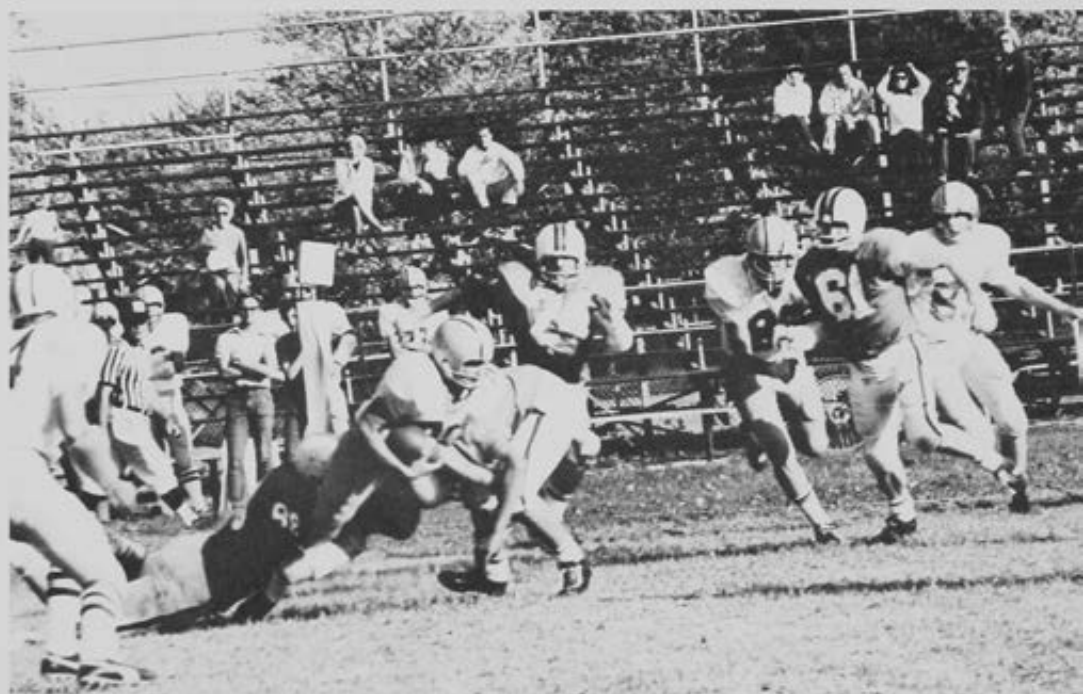

The Griffins also had exciting victories over such teams as Aquinas and DuBourg, 2 of the 4 CAC champs. The Aquinas game which had to be the most exciting game of the season, was a game in which the Griffins applied a delay offense during the entire game and came out on top 39-34 with the high point man being Cliff Albers with 15 points. The high point game of the season came in the DeAndreis game when Mike Chambers pumped in 29 points.

The most shocking loss of the season had to be the loss to Kennedy in which the Griffins found themselves

23 points down at half time, but they battled back to within 5 points before finally being stopped. Even though the Griffins had a poor record they were in contention for the CAC title all the way up to the game against St. Mary's. The key to staying in contention had to be the big victories over Aquinas and Chaminade. In the Chaminade game Neil Fiala threw in 23 points and Dave Klipsch added 20 points in the 64-63 victory with Joe Wehrle scoring the winning bucket. On the special team awards, Mike Chambers was voted the MVP and captain of the team. Chambers also was picked to the 2nd team CAC squad. Joe Wehrle was voted the best defensive player while Cliff Albers had the best free throw percentage. In looking to next year, the future does look bright with four juniors, Kurt Wehrsten, Neil Fiala, Dave Klipsch and Cliff Albers, who all saw lots of action during the year, leading the way.
