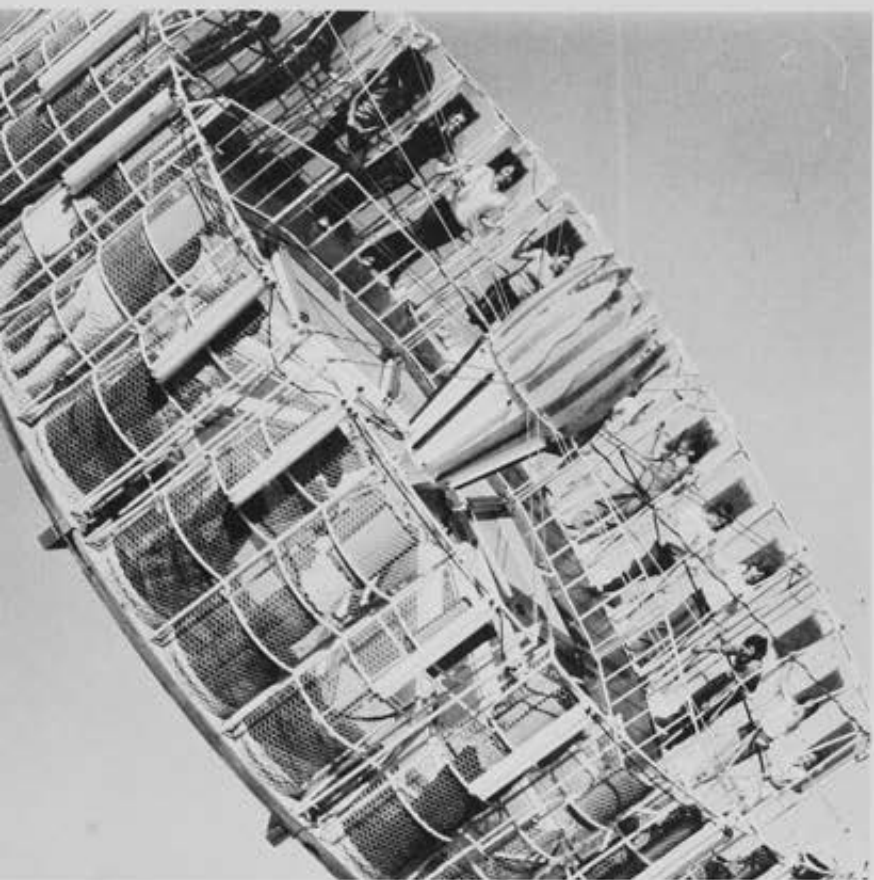

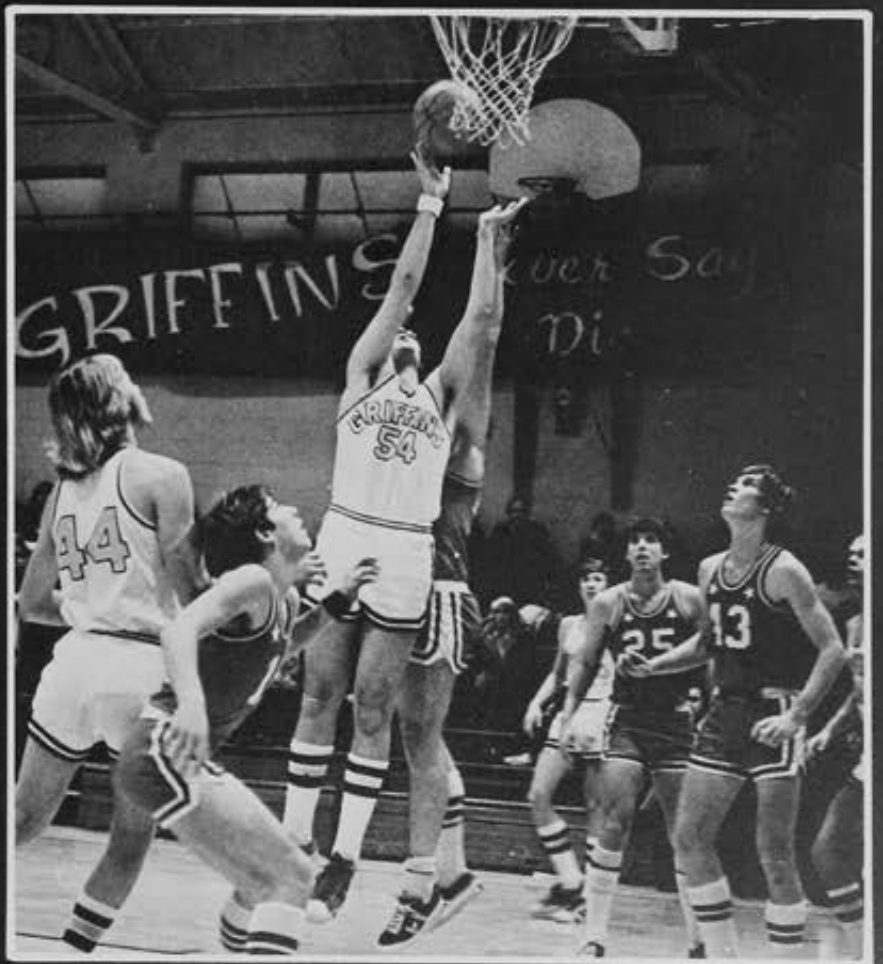
Pep Rallies

Griffins Capture CAC

One by one, the opposing teams practiced, hit and prepared; one by one they took their turn and one by one they became the Golden Griffins' next victim. The Black and Gold rolled to a 9-0-1 season, and captured the CAC crown. Although undefeated, the Golden Wave was "not good enough" to qualify for State play.

The Griffins' accomplishments were marked by several post season honors. Vianney was No. 1 in defense, No. 4 in offense in the area. In overall rankings, the Griffins were No. 5 in the State, No. 3 in the area and No. 1 in CAC.

A few impressive team achievements include: 265 points scored, 38 touchdowns, 2018 yards rushing, 2618 total yardage, 18 interceptions and but 30 points scored against it.

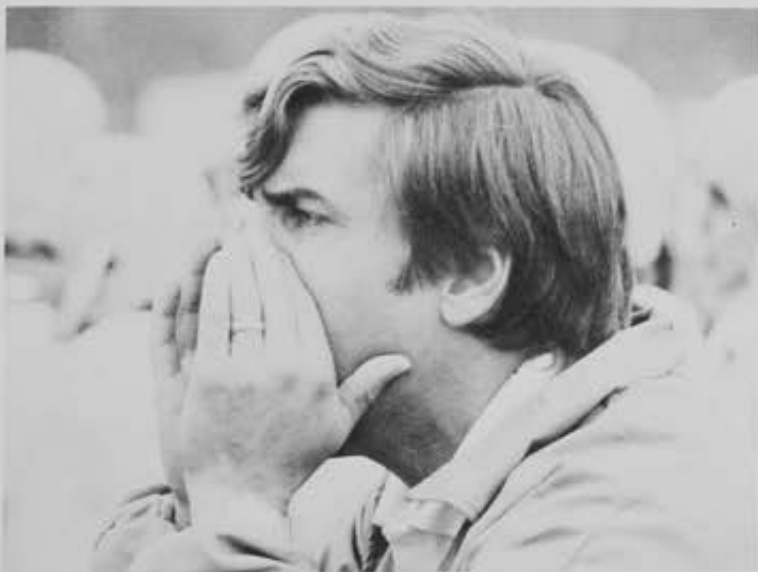

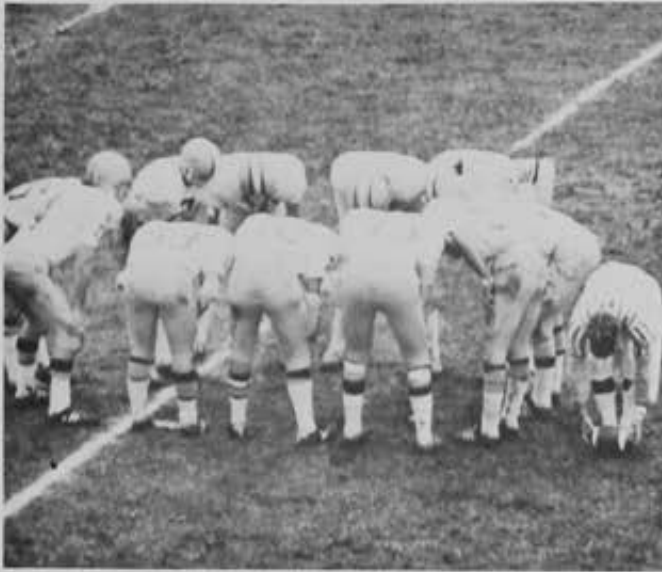
The Golden Griffins opened their 1973 season against the Southwest Longhorns. An early touchdown and field goal gave the Griffins a 10-0 victory. The following three games put the Big "V" into high gear. With the offense rolling, Mercy took a 34-0 beating. The undefeated Kennedy Celts were squelched 34-0. DeAndreis suffered a 47-6 pounding.

The first four victories gave the Black and Gold the confidence and desire they needed for the remaining schedule. In the Homecoming game against the Aquinas Falcons the offense managed but two points. Homecoming MVP, Gerald Chambers sparked the defensive unit.



The Golden Griffins then eased by the Bi-State CBC Cadets 34-0. Over 400 yards was gained in this encounter.





A crowd of over 3,000 was on hand to witness the CAC showdown battle as the Griffins hosted the DuBourg Cavaliers. After a scoreless first half, the Black and Gold ripped through the DuBourg defense for a 26-0 score. This was the sixth shutout of the season for the Griffins.

Then came Chaminade. Playing too conservatively the Griffins eked out a 7-7 tie, enough to clinch the CAC crown.

The final game of the year was a 42-8 drubbing of St. Mary's Dragons.

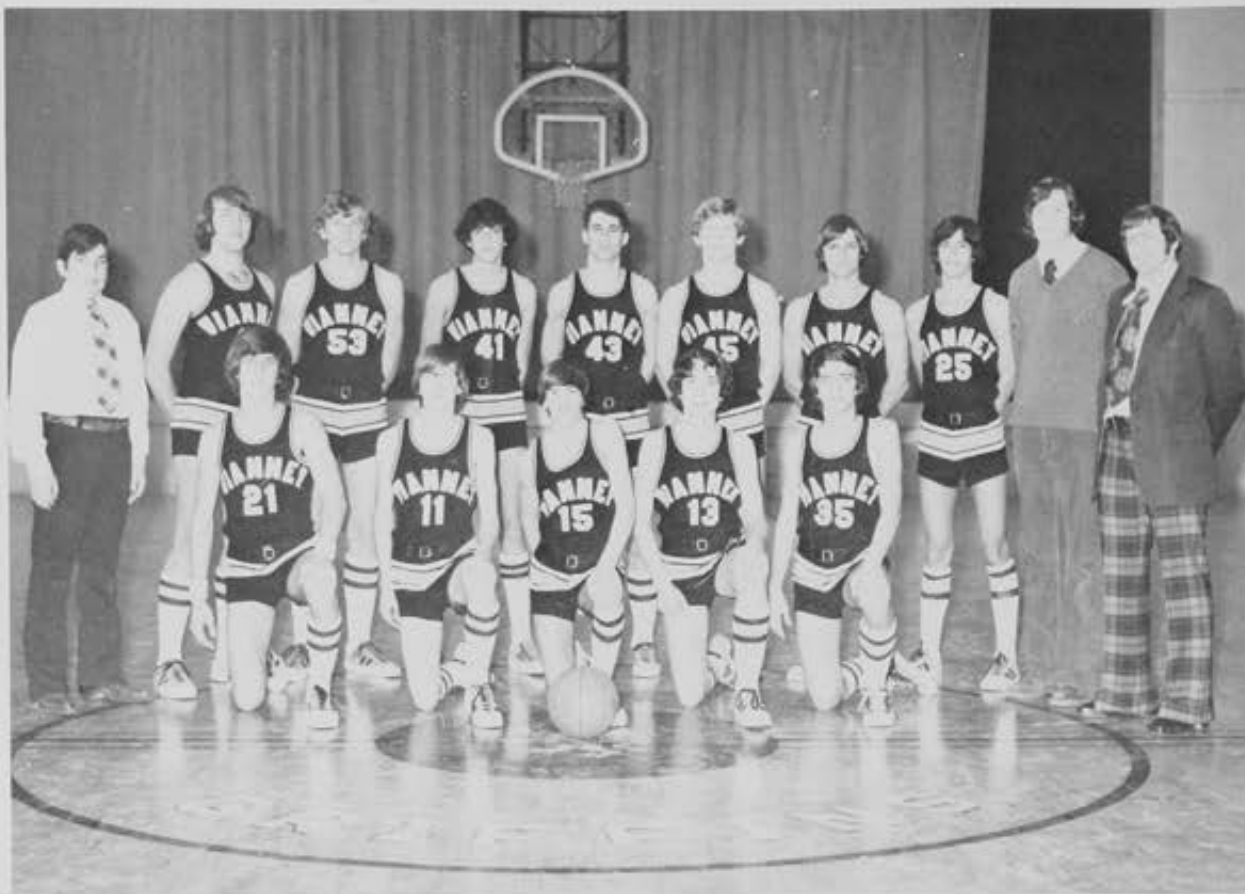

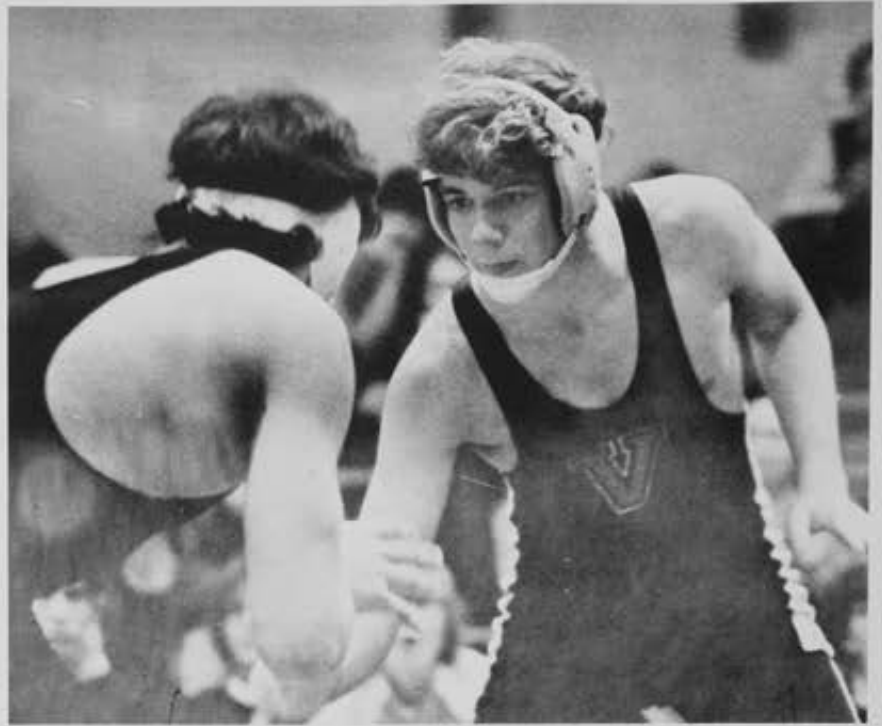

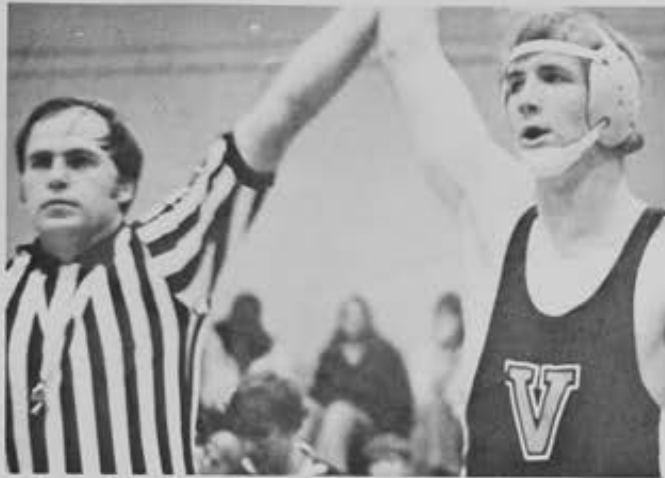


Varsity Wrestling

For the first time in the history of Vianney, the baseball team won the CAC title. In addition, it won the District title, thus ending with a 15-6 record, the best of any Griffin nine.

The '74 team was led by the pitching of Pat Mulligan (8-4), and the hitting of all-Metro Infielder Neil Fiala (.492), Dan Murphy (.408), and Dave Klipsch (.371).

After losing their first two games, the baseball outlook was rather gloomy. Then the Griffins started to come around and in their next game defeated last year's State Champs, Fox, 13-0. This was the spark the club needed. From there on the Griffins were devastating except for a disappointing second place in the Brentwood Tourney. Following this, the team won their next four games before losing to Kirkwood. District play nearing, the Kirkwood game loss was a blow to the team. However, the nine put it all together in their first game against Kennedy, 13-0. In the semifinal game, the team posted a 10-5 win over Parkway North. In the finals, the team played probably the best game of the season when they defeated three-time State Champion, Lafayette, 5-2. The next three games against CAC opposition, saw the Griffins defeat DuBourg, St. Mary's and Kennedy. This brought the win streak to six, but more important it gave the team a 5-1 CAC lead. Kennedy's loss gave them a 6-2 standing. This left the team the opportunity of winning the CAC crown, with but two games left. The baseball nine then met Hazelwood in the regional, in what proved to be the game of the year. However, the Griffins lost 2-1 on a wild pitch in nine innings, and Hazelwood went on to win the State Crown. The final two games were victories over Chaminade and Mercy and the Griffins had their First CAC Baseball Championship. This coupled with the CAC track crown gave the Golden Griffins the All-Sports Trophy.
