# *DEDICATION TO BRO. PATRICK NOONAN 1925-1982*





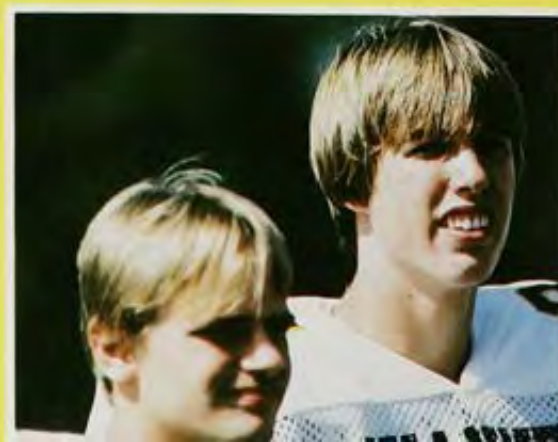
The life of Brother Patrick Noonan was filled with one very important aspect, service. He gave service to others and to God, who he dedicated his life to through the Marianist Brothers. He had a happy life and helped others throughout it.

Brother Pat was born on July 25, 1925, in Charleston, Missouri. His family moved to Sikeston, Missouri, and this is where he grew up. He attended Chaminade High School as a boarding student and graduated in 1942.

While Bro. Noonan was at Chaminade, he started on the football team as a guard. On August 15, 1943, Brother Pat took his First Vows as a Brother in The Society of Mary. He began his teaching career in 1945 at McBride High School and the next year taught at Chaminade. From 1947-1953 Brother Pat taught at St. Michael's High School in Chicago. He returned to Chaminade for one year and then spent a year in prayer and reflection during his Second Novitiate. His 14 years

before he joined the Vianney faculty in 1970 were spent as a teacher at McBride High School.

Brother Pat continued to serve at Vianney, teaching and being very active in Student Council. Due to Brother Pat's undying service to Student Councils, the Missouri Association of Student Councils dedicated their annual convention to him. His service, always done quietly and happily will remain with the wonderful memories of Brother Patrick Noonan.

# DEBATORS ARGUE WELL WHILE LAMB LEADS SPEAKERS TO TOP

The 1982-83 edition of the Vianney Speech-Debate Team was the most successful in the history of the team.

The team had a very slow start despite great expectations from Coach Hesel and Coach Pilch. During the first half of the season, the only Griffin speaker to win a trophy was Ron Lamb who consistently took first place round after round in Radio Speaking.

The second half of the season was better for the team. During the second half of the season, the Speech team broke at least one Lincoln - Douglass debator into

the semi-finals in every tournament they attended. At the Fox tournament both Kevin Barrett and Rich Sartori made it into the quarter-finals. The Parkway West Tournament saw Ron Lamb and Joe Hegger break into the finals and Kevin Barrett finished third in Lincoln-Douglass. Later in the year at the Francis Howell Invitational the team made their finest showing. Steve Vonder Haar grabbed third place in Radio Speaking; John Chapman finished third in Lincoln-Douglass Debate; Rich Sartori and Kevin Barrett met in the Finals in Lincoln-Douglass, but since members of the same team can not debate

each other, the judges had to go to speaker points from previous rounds and Barrett won by a mere two points.

In "post-season" play, the Griffins made a great showing. In the St. Louis area districts Ron Lamb dominated the field in Radio Speaking as usual. Ron finished first in Radio Speaking and qualified for State. In the State competition Ron made a very impressive showing. Only in one round during the entire competition did Ron not finish first and when all was said and done, Ron took first place in the entire state.

# PROCTORS AND GOVERNMENT JUSTIFY VIANNEY

# VIANNEY PAYS RESPECT TO HAROLD ALFERMAN & DAN MAY

Vianney junior Dan May had his two year battle against leukemia come to an end on February 19, 1983. Dan died at 11 a.m. on that Saturday from complications resulting from chemotherapy treatment of his leukemia. The treatment made him more susceptible to other diseases because of its deterioration to his immunization system. The deterioration resulted in his death from pneumonia.

His doctors attempted all means at their disposal in trying to save Dan's life. Radiation, chemotherapy and finally, this past year, bone marrow transplant all were used in an attempt to put Dan's leukemia into a state of remission.

Dan was a first-honors student who was also involved in Vianney athletics. Although he found out about the leukemia at the beginning of his first season of basketball at Vianney, Dan still played on his freshman and sophomore basketball teams. Even when che-

motherapy deteriorated his playing skills, Dan still attended practice and put forth the effort to participate with his team.

Dan May attended classes at Vianney this school year until the middle of September. At that time, doctors decided that Dan's last possible treatment of his leukemia was a bone marrow transplant. The treatment caused a six-week hospitalization and a period of rest for Dan.

The Vianney family will miss this student and athlete who affected, in many ways, all of our lives.

## VIANNEY LOSES NO. 1 FAN

Harold Alferman, who was regarded by many as Vianney's "Number One Fan", died of cancer on Tuesday, February 1, 1983 at St. Joseph's Hospital in Kirkwood. Funeral services for him were held on Friday February 4th at St. Peter's Church with burial services in Calvary Cemetery.

Classes were dismissed on that day to give students a chance to pay their last respects to this great man who gave so much of his time and effort to Vianney. Nearly six hundred members of the Vianney Family attended the services.

Before coming to Vianney 14 years ago as a custodian, Harold was a switchman. But Harold was really more than just a custodian. He was one of Vianney's most supportive sports fans. He rarely missed any of the school's sporting contests. In 1981, at the annual Football banquet, the Athletic

Department gave him an award designating him as the school's "Number One Fan" because of his constant attendance at games and other events.

Harold cared very much about his family. He was a devoted family man who acted as a scoutmaster for his children's scout troops. Harold also was the coach of a Khoury League baseball team. He rarely missed one of his grandchildren's plays or games and made sure that he spent time with each and every one of his thirteen grandchildren.

Vianney will miss this man who devoted so much time to the school.



# MARIANIST MEMBERS HONORED FOR YEARS OF SERVICE

This year marks the anniversary of Profession of First Vows in the Society of Mary for three men who have touched the lives of many in the Vianney family. Father George Scherrer celebrates his fiftieth year as a Marianist, Brother James Ebbesmeyer and Brother Earl Leistikow both celebrate their twenty-fifth year as Marianists.

Father Scherrer is a native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He first professed vows at Maryhurst Novitiate on August 15, 1933. He continued his studies toward the priesthood at the seminary in St. Meinrad, Indiana and was ordained on February 2, 1945. He has been teacher, chaplain, coach, confessor, mission drive coordinator, and sports fan at McBride, Chaminade, and Vianney High Schools in the St. Louis area and at Don Bosco High School in Milwaukee.

Brother James Ebbesmeyer is a



native of Florissant, Missouri. He first professed as a Marianist in Galesville, Wisconsin on September 8, 1958. He continued his studies at St. Mary's University in San Antonio, working toward a Bachelor's Degree in Physics in 1961. Brother Jim then did maintenance and grounds work at Chaminade, Vianney, and the Novitiate in Galesville until 1966. He returned to St. Mary's University and earned a Bachelor's Degree in Industrial Engineering in 1968. Since coming back to Vianney in that same year, Brother Jim has served as Business Manager (1968-1970) and Director of Grounds and Maintenance. His accomplishments at Vianney range from constructing the track and football stadium, to remodeling the cafeteria and several classrooms in the school, to constructing the storage sheds and maintenance buildings on Vianney's campus to installing air conditioning in the Brothers' residence and the chapel. All of which greatly benefit Vianney.

Brother Earl also professed his vows on September 8, 1958 in Galesville. He received a Bachelor's Degree in English from St. Mary's University in 1961. Since the 1961-62 school year, Brother Earl has been assigned as teacher at St. Mary's High School in St. Louis, Chaminade in St. Louis, Chaminade College School in Toronto, Vianney in St. Louis, and currently again at Chaminade in St. Louis. He has taught English, French and Latin during those years. Brother Earl pursued post-graduate studies at St. Louis Uni-



versity and University of Notre Dame and was awarded a Master of Arts Degree in Modern and Classical Languages from Notre Dame in August, 1974. He also spent the summer of 1980 in Quebec at the University of Laval.

All three of these men have meant much to the Vianney Family. To honor them and their dedication to the Blessed Mother through the Society of Mary there was a Mass and reception in the Vianney gym on Sunday, April 24, at 4:30 p.m. All Vianney alumni were invited to share in this celebration.

Vianney Soccer has been the premier team for the past few years, not only in St. Louis but statewide. In the last seventy games, Vianney has recorded only two losses. The Griffins won their third State Championship in a row this year, their fourth out of the past five years. Vianney has been in the final four, six out of the last nine years.

The 1982 Varsity Soccer team was no exception to the winning tradition. Vianney started the season with a twelve game unbeaten streak, won the CAC Tournament, and took the State Crown,

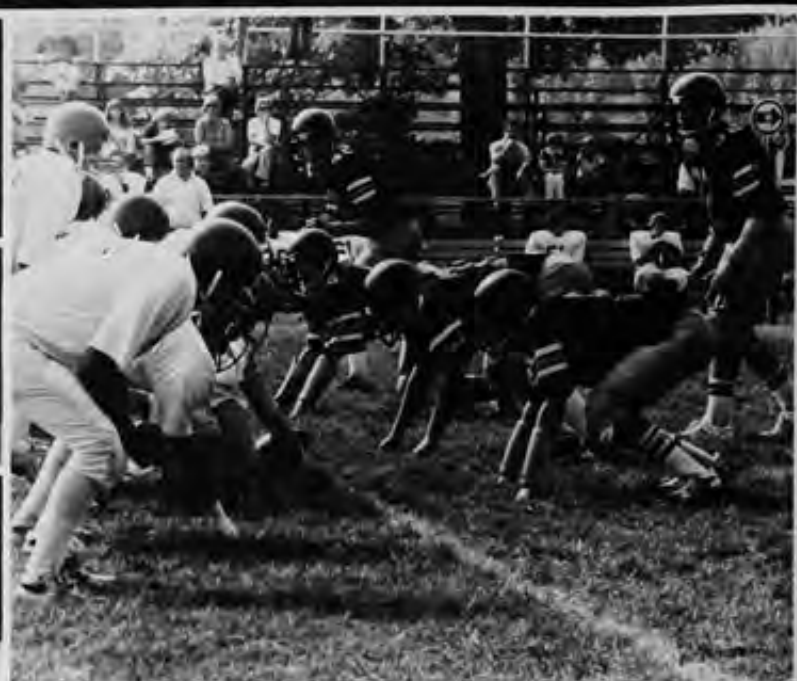



# *DEDICATION TO BRO. PATRICK NOONAN 1925-1982*





The life of Brother Patrick Noonan was filled with one very important aspect, service. He gave service to others and to God, who he dedicated his life to through the Marianist Brothers. He had a happy life and helped others throughout it.

Brother Pat was born on July 25, 1925, in Charleston, Missouri. His family moved to Sikeston, Missouri, and this is where he grew up. He attended Chaminade High School as a boarding student and graduated in 1942.

While Bro. Noonan was at Chaminade, he started on the football team as a guard. On August 15, 1943, Brother Pat took his First Vows as a Brother in The Society of Mary. He began his teaching career in 1945 at McBride High School and the next year taught at Chaminade. From 1947-1953 Brother Pat taught at St. Michael's High School in Chicago. # PROCTORS AND GOVERNMENT JUSTIFY VIANNEY

The 1982-1983 Proctor and Student Government system, moderated by Father Joseph Uvietta, was very much like that of the previous year.

Instead of assigning tables to specific students, as had been done in years past, the voluntary table cleaning system was successful. Students could volunteer to clean tables at the end of each lunch shift and could then earn money to buy their meal for the day. With the cafeteria proctors assisting these students, the system's progress was remarkable. In addition, the Student Government sys-

Students would then be summoned to appear in front of the Student Court, which assembled on the first Thursday of each month. # VIANNEY PAYS RESPECT TO HAROLD ALFERMAN & DAN MAY

Vianney junior Dan May had his two year battle against leukemia come to an end on February 19, 1983. Dan died at 11 a.m. on that Saturday from complications resulting from chemotherapy treatment of his leukemia. The treatment made him more susceptible to other diseases because of its deterioration to his immunization system. The deterioration resulted in his death from pneumonia.

His doctors attempted all means at their disposal in trying to save Dan's life. Radiation, chemotherapy and finally, this past year, bone marrow transplant all were used in an attempt to put Dan's leukemia into a state of remission.

Dan was a first-honors student who was also involved in Vianney athletics. Although he found out about the leukemia at the beginning of his first season of basketball at Vianney, Dan still played on his freshman and sophomore basketball teams. Even when che-

motherapy deteriorated his playing skills, Dan still attended practice and put forth the effort to participate with his team.

Dan May attended classes at Vianney this school year until the middle of September. At that time, doctors decided that Dan's last possible treatment of his leukemia was a bone marrow transplant. The treatment caused a six-week hospitalization and a period of rest for Dan.

The Vianney family will miss this student and athlete who affected, in many ways, all of our lives.

## VIANNEY LOSES NO. 1 FAN

Harold Alferman, who was regarded by many as Vianney's "Number One Fan", died of cancer on Tuesday, February 1, 1983 at St. Joseph's Hospital in Kirkwood. Funeral services for him were held on Friday February 4th at St. Peter's Church with burial services in Calvary Cemetery.

Classes were dismissed on that day to give students a chance to pay their last respects to this great man who gave so much of his time and effort to Vianney. Nearly six hundred members of the Vianney Family attended the services.

Before coming to Vianney 14 years ago as a custodian, Harold was a switchman. But Harold was really more than just a custodian. He was one of Vianney's most supportive sports fans. He rarely missed any of the school's sporting contests. In 1981, at the annual Football banquet, the Athletic

Department gave him an award designating him as the school's "Number One Fan" because of his constant attendance at games and other events.

Harold cared very much about his family. He was a devoted family man who acted as a scoutmaster for his children's scout troops. Harold also was the coach of a Khoury League baseball team. He rarely missed one of his grandchildren's plays or games and made sure that he spent time with each and every one of his thirteen grandchildren.

Vianney will miss this man who devoted so much time to the school.



# MARIANIST MEMBERS HONORED FOR YEARS OF SERVICE

This year marks the anniversary of Profession of First Vows in the Society of Mary for three men who have touched the lives of many in the Vianney family. Father George Scherrer celebrates his fiftieth year as a Marianist, Brother James Ebbesmeyer and Brother Earl Léistikow both celebrate their twenty-fifth year as Marianists.

Father Scherrer is a native of Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He first professed vows at Maryhurst Novitiate on August 15, 1933. He continued his studies toward the priesthood at the seminary in St. Meinrad, Indiana and was ordained on February 2, 1945. He has been teacher, chaplain, coach, confessor, mission drive coordinator, and sports fan at McBride, Chaminade, and Vianney High Schools in the St. Louis area and at Don Bosco High School in Milwaukee.

Brother James Ebbesemeyer is a



native of Florissant, Missouri. He first professed as a Marianist in Galesville, Wisconsin on September 8, 1958. He continued his studies at St. Mary's University in San Antonio, working toward a Bachelor's Degree in Physics in 1961. Brother Jim then did maintenance and grounds work at Chaminade, Vianney, and the Novitiate in Galesville until 1966. He returned to St. Mary's University and earned a Bachelor's Degree in Industrial Engineering in 1968. Since coming back to Vianney in that same year, Brother Jim has served as Business Manager (1968-1970) and Director of Grounds and Maintenance. His accomplishments at Vianney range from constructing the track and football stadium, to remodeling the cafeteria and several classrooms in the school, to constructing the storage sheds and maintenance buildings on Vianney's campus to installing air conditioning in the Brothers' residence and the chapel. All of which greatly benefit Vianney.

Brother Earl also professed his vows on September 8, 1958 in Galesville. He received a Bachelor's Degree in English from St. Mary's University in 1961. Since the 1961-62 school year, Brother Earl has been assigned as teacher at St. Mary's High School in St. Louis, Chaminade in St. Louis, Chaminade College School in Toronto, Vianney in St. Louis, and currently again at Chaminade in St. Louis. He has taught English, French and Latin during those years. Brother Earl pursued post-graduate studies at St. Louis Uni-



versity and University of Notre Dame and was awarded a Master of Arts Degree in Modern and Classical Languages from Notre Dame in August, 1974. He also spent the summer of 1980 in Quebec at the University of Laval.

All three of these men have meant much to the Vianney Family. To honor them and their dedication to the Blessed Mother through the Society of Mary there was a Mass and reception in the Vianney gym on Sunday, April 24, at 4:30 p.m. All Vianney alumni were invited to share in this celebration.

Vianney Soccer has been the premier team for the past few years, not only in St. Louis but statewide. In the last seventy games, Vianney has recorded only two losses. The Griffins won their third State Championship in a row this year, their fourth out of the past five years. Vianney has been in the final four, six out of the last nine years.


