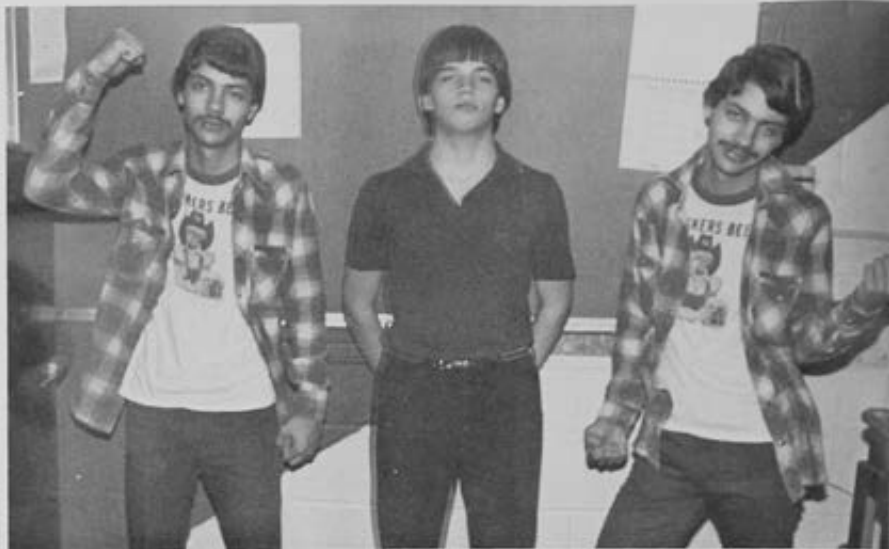

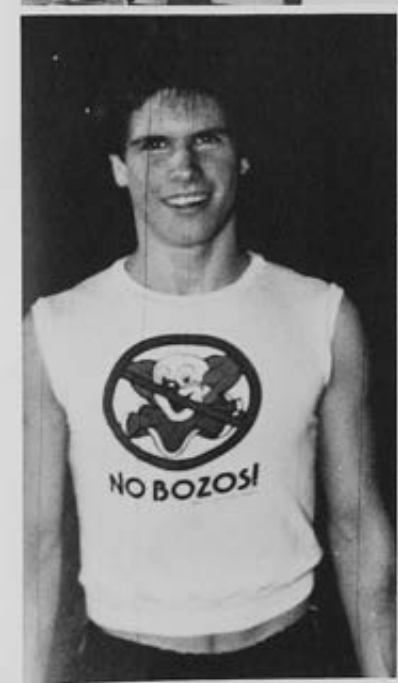

# 25 YEARS OF SERVICE AND DEDICATION

Mr. Hoffmann has been enjoying teaching at Vianney almost as long as Vianney has been in existence. He came to Vianney in September of 1961, one year after Vianney opened its doors.

He was born in South St. Louis on July 7, 1939, and he grew up in Resurrection parish, playing baseball, soccer, and basketball for the parish teams. He went to high school at Prep South, and college at St. Louis University, majoring in history. After graduating, he was hired at Vianney by Brother Kenneth Nesbit, Vianney's first principal, and continued attending St. Louis University part time until he received his Master's Degree in American History in 1963.

Mr. Hoffmann was married in June of 1963 and has three children. His two sons have attended Vianney and his daughter has graduated from Notre Dame High School. He has divided his time between Vianney and raising his family, coaching and attending innumerable baseball, softball, basketball, volleyball, soccer games and gymnastic meets. His oldest son, Bill, a 1983 Vianney graduate is attending St. Louis University. His daughter Linda is at Meramec Community College, and his youngest son, Jeff, is a junior at Vianney. He and his wife are looking forward to more time to spend together and at Vianney as the children grow up.

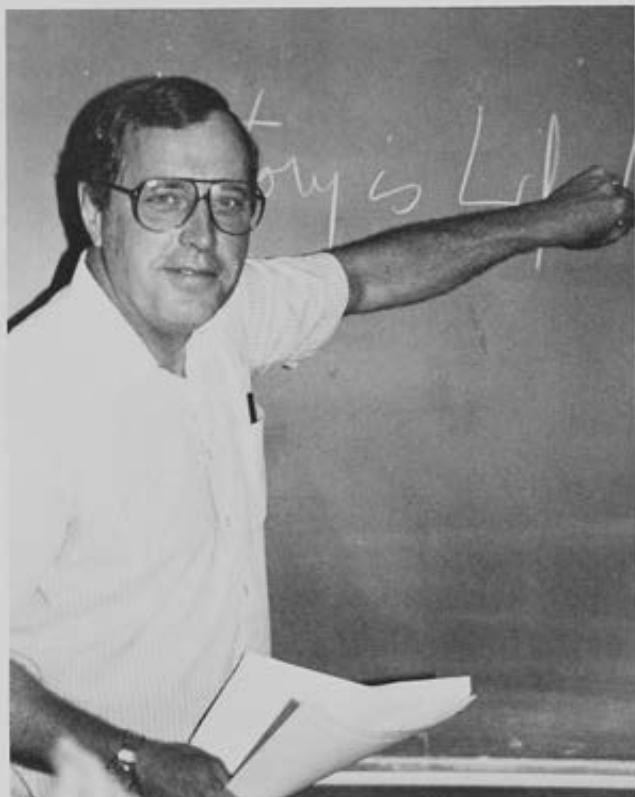
In his twenty four years at Vianney, Mr. Hoffmann has mainly been involved in teaching all the history courses at various times, although he did teach English one year. He was coach of the soccer team when Vianney first started soccer and has been sponsor of the highly successful chess team. His main concern during these twenty four years has been that there has not been enough hours in the day to raise a family and still participate in the very active curricular and extracurricular programs at Vianney.

Although he has often been labeled as Vianney's "oldest" teacher, Mr. Hoffmann has found that dealing with the generations of young men at Vianney has kept his much younger than his actual years, and he is looking forward to many more years of contact with the fine faculty, parents and students at Vianney.

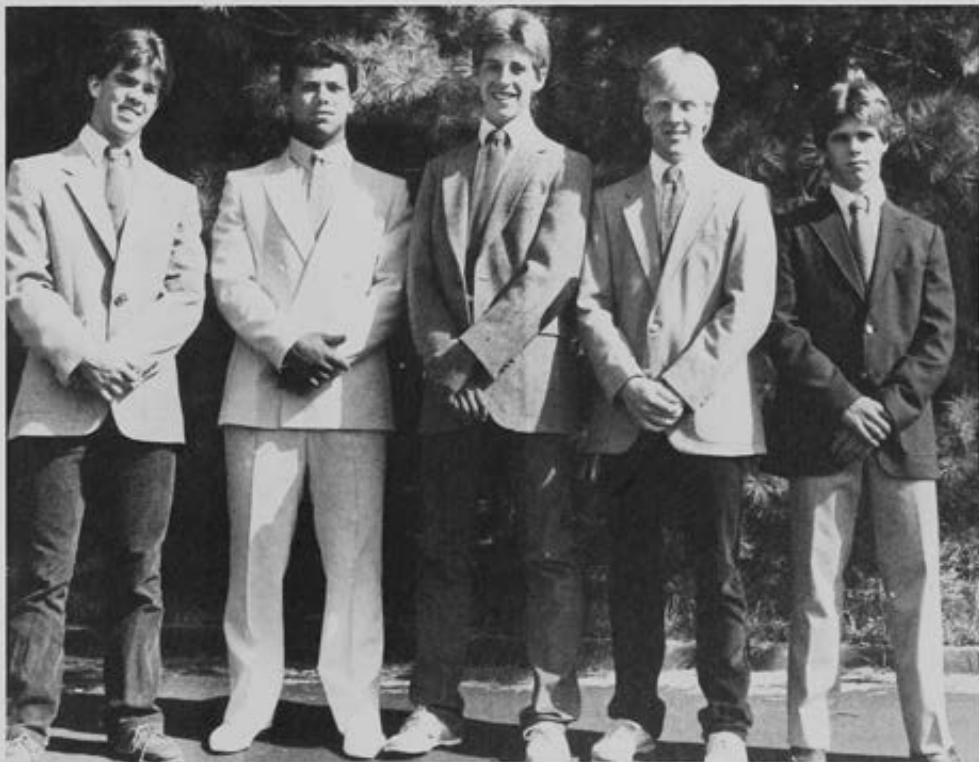

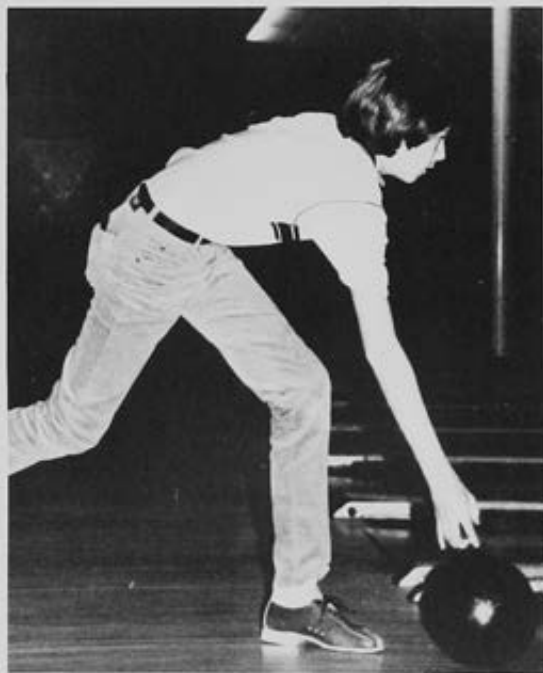

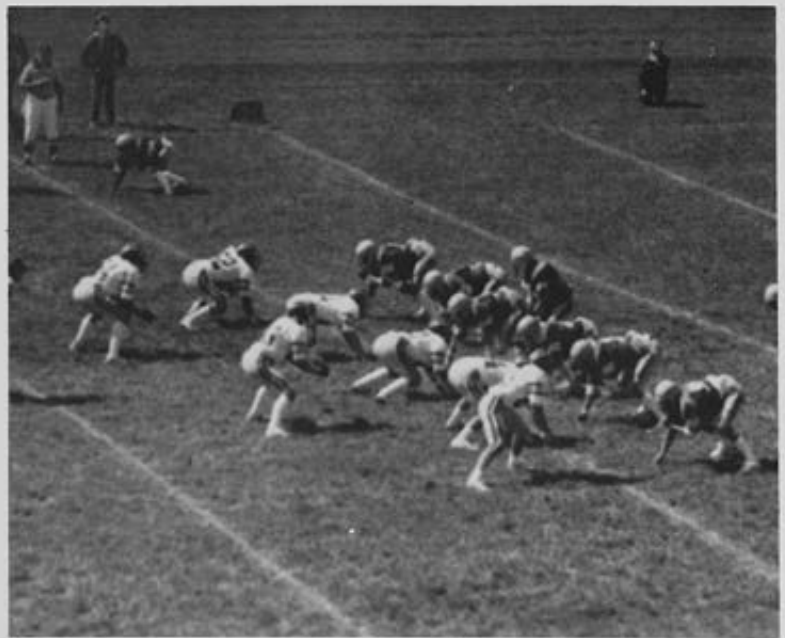

Congratulations to all cindermen, and coaches Farrell, Furrer, Kwasinski, Stevenson, and Ripplinger on a fine year.



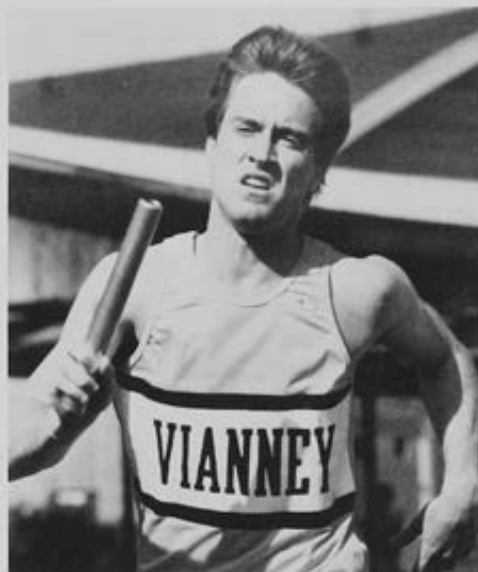
