



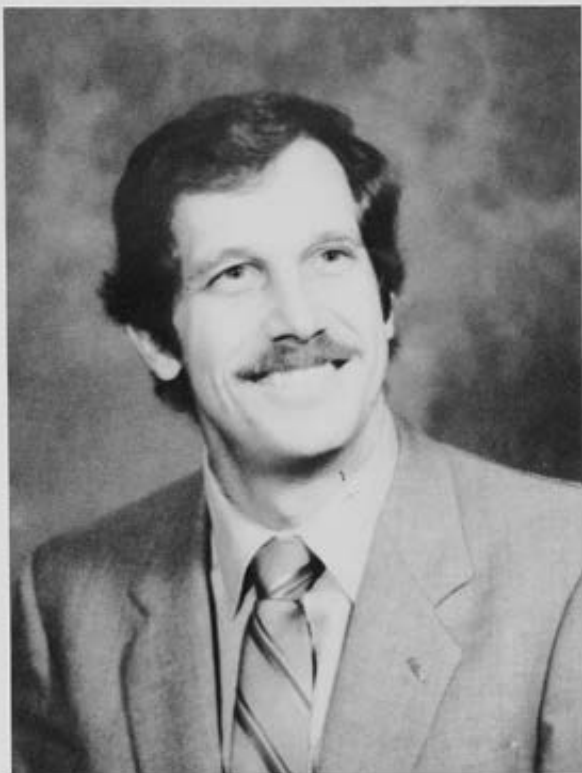
Brother Marvin was a man of God whose deeds spoke laudably of his dedication and service to youth. He was a selfless example of good for all.



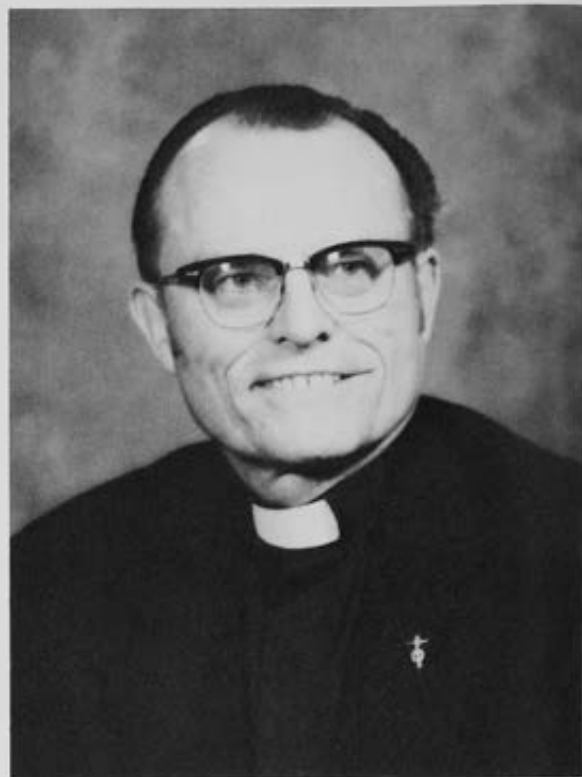

SOCCER CHAMPIONS

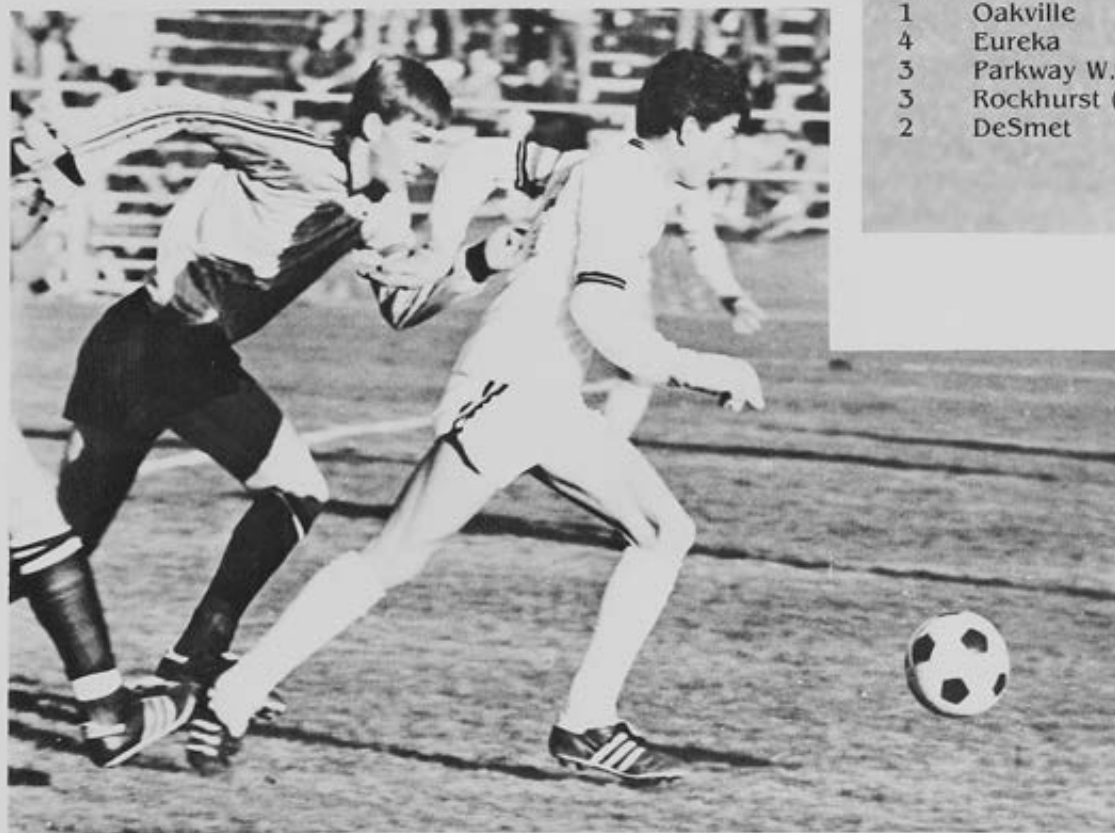

WHEREAS, on November 21, 1987, the Vianney Golden Griffins claimed an unprecedented fifth state soccer crown; and

WHEREAS, this 1987 victory came after state titles in 1978, 1980, 1981 and 1982, making the Griffins the only team in the state to have won five (5) state titles; and

WHEREAS, throughout the season, the Griffins relied on a stifling defense and a quick-strike attack to emerge victorious in the toughest district in the state; and

WHEREAS, Vianney finished the season with a 23-6-3 record with titles in each of the four tournaments in which it competed this season, and these tournaments included the CBC Tournament, the Bob Guelker CYC Tournament, the Granite City Tournament, and the State Tournament; and

WHEREAS, through the unstinting efforts of coach Mike Villa, Vianney emerged as the top-ranked team in the Post-Dispatch Soccer Coaches poll; and

WHEREAS, high school soccer has long been a sport dear to the hearts of St. Louisans and the special regard in which this sport is held has been consistently demonstrated for many years by the excellence of St. Louis soccer teams and the excellence of St. Louis soccer players; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Aldermen of the City of St. Louis is extremely gratified that a St. Louis area team has emerged once again as the soccer champions of the state.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT this Board of Aldermen, meeting in regular session and being apprised of the foregoing, does hereby offer this resolution of congratulations and best wishes to coach Mike Villa and the Vianney Golden Griffins on this occasion of their fifth state title and its hopes that many, many more state titles will be forthcoming in the future, and directs the Clerk of the Board to prepare a fitting copy of this resolution to the end that it might be presented to Coach Villa and his team in a manner deemed appropriate by this resolution's sponsor.

Many Seniors intend to continue their language study in college and study abroad.

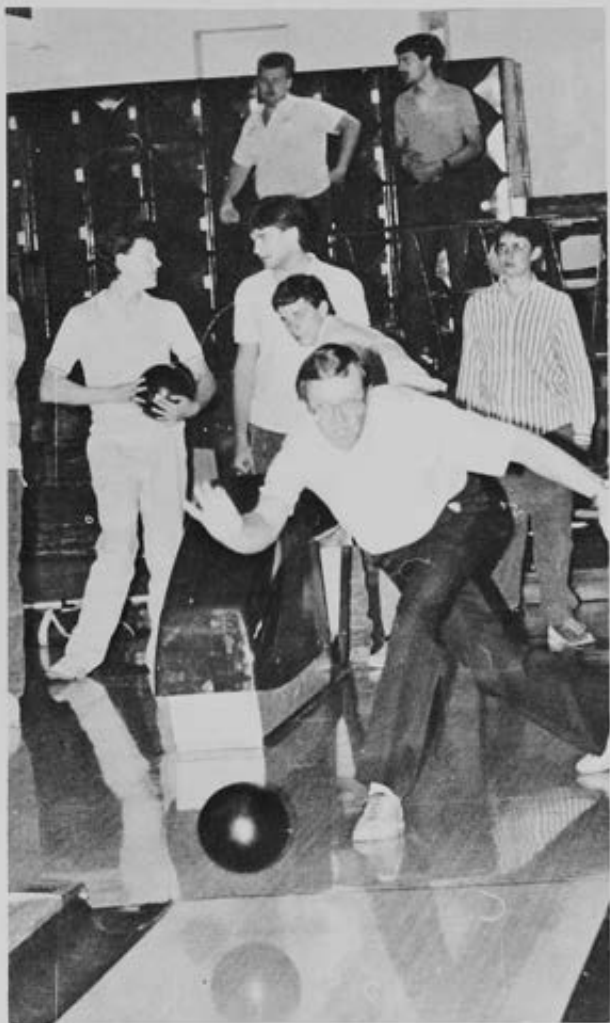

I Envy Not In Any Moods


