All students in grades 3-5 will continue with their distance learning experience. On February 4, our grade 3-5 students will begin full day, in-person learning for five days a week. EAST LAKE PRESCHOOL NEWS



Preschool has been busy with our nature unit. We have been enjoying seeing each other on our daily zooms and have had fun getting to know the students from the other cohort. The children are great at unmuting and muting on their own and have really mastered the zoom class. We have been learning about the changes happening outside and how those changes impact animals and people. Some animals hibernate while others adapt to the cold in other ways. We dress differently during these colder days. Since we did not have any snow to make snowmen, we used our

imaginations to use what we had around the house to create snowmen. We want to thank all of the families for their support during distance learning. We could not do this without your help and we know you have a lot going on. In January, our unit will focus on being healthy. We will find out what it means to be healthy by thinking about good sleep, eating, and exercise habits as well as mask wearing, hand washing, and age appropriate distancing.

It is hard to believe that it is almost time to start the process of registration for next year's Preschool class. Early childhood is a time of great discovery! Connections Preschool gives students the opportunity to play with other children while learning important prekindergarten skills. The preschool curriculum is aligned with School District 196's K-12 learning standards. Beginning math, reading and writing skills are introduced alongside a developmentally appropriate, play based curriculum.

All teachers are fully licensed by the Minnesota Department of Education. In order to attend, children must be four years old on or before September 1, 2021 and live in District 196. District 196 Preschools are half-day programs. The Connections Preschool Catalog for 2021-2022 will be mailed to homes with 3 and 4-year old children soon. Dear Fifth Grade Band Parents & Students,

Believe it or not middle school is fast approaching for our fifth graders. Soon, you and your son or daughter will be signing up for middle school classes. Before you and your family register for classes I wanted to write to you about the band opportunities that await our students in the near future. Especially if you are sending your oldest child to middle school, you may find this letter helpful.

My sincere hope is that each of our fifth-grade band students takes advantage of the wonderful instrumental music programs at the District 196 middle schools.

Participation in band

Is an opportunity to continue to develop a skill on an instrument Allows students the creative experience of making music with friends in a positive peer group

Reinforces math, reading, and organizational skills

Middle school bands do not rehearse before or after school as the elementary school usually does during a "normal" school year. Instead students have a playing class every other day during the school day. Students also have small group lessons once per cycle (about once every 8 school days).

Former students come back and tell me about the exciting music they are playing at the middle school and high school. They also really enjoy being able to play more because middle schools bands meet every other day. Also, there will be opportunities for playing field trips.

In addition to band class and lessons, students registered for band may participate in a variety of other ensembles, some of which may be:

Jazz band Holiday band Flute or clarinet choir Saxophone Quartet Brass ensemble Percussion ensemble

Some students branch off and learn another instrument in addition to their main instrument, for example, some may learn

- \sim Bass guitar or keyboard for jazz band
- ~ Timpani, drum set, and much more (percussionists)
- ~ Baritone saxophone (saxophones)
- \sim Piccolo (flutes)

NO CHILD CARE ON JANUARY 13


