## Literacy Assessments - Feb. 10 & 11

On February 10 and 11, **all K-5 students in-person and Digital Academy** will meet with their teacher individually for assessments which will be used to plan for instruction for the remainder of the school year. There will

be no regular school on February 10-12 due to these assessments. In order to support the health and safety of our students, staff and community we will implement the following guidelines for our assessment process. Only staff and students will be entering the building. Please follow the directions below for students entering the building.

- \* K-2 Families: Park in the lower lot. Help your child cross the parking lot and have your child enter Door 8 (playground vestibule door). The door will be open. Students should go directly to their classroom once they enter the school. Once your child has entered the building, you may move your car along curbside for pick up after the assessments are completed. Curbside will be for pick up only.
- \* 3-5 Families: Park in the upper lot. Help your child cross the parking lot and have your child enter the front entrance to the building. The door will be open. Students should go directly to their classroom once they enter the school. Once your child has entered the building, you may move your car along curbside for pickup after the assessments are completed. Curbside will be for pick up only.

## Families with multiple children: Have your children go with the younger sibling(s).

- Personal face coverings must be worn by all staff, students, and parents.
- The child will wash/sanitize hands upon entry in the school.
- Social distancing procedures will be practiced during all assessments.
- Teachers will disinfect high touch surfaces between each child's assessments.

The child will be directed to wash their hands at completion of assessment.

Please make every effort to schedule and attend these assessment appointments. This is an important opportunity for your child to have this individual time with the teacher to gather information for instruction.

#### Complete the registration enrollment steps online.

Go to <u>www.district196.org/enroll</u> and follow the four registration steps.

To complete the enrollment process, please drop the following items off at East Lake Elementary or you may email, el.registration@district196.org, fax, 952-423-7895, or submit them via U.S. mail.

- 1. A birth certificate, passport or other evidence of your child's age.
- 2. A copy of your child's current immunization record, medical exemption or conscientious objection.
- 3. The completed Minnesota Language Survey (provided at end of online enrollment or at your school)
- 4. Proof of preschool screening, if your child was not screened in District 196. If your child has not been through the screening process, please call 651-423-7899 to set up an appointment.
- 5. If applicable, please fill out the enclosed school year childcare information, including name, address and phone number of your childcare provider for transportation purposes.

If a parent or guardian lives at a different address than the primary household, complete and return 501.1.2P, Additional Family Household Census Information.

If you are unable to complete registration, need assistance or you do not plan on enrolling your child for kindergarten, please call the school office at 952-423-7896.

We look forward to welcoming your child in the fall at East Lake Elementary!

## STUDENT PLACEMENT FOR 2021-2022

During the months of April and May, staff will be developing class lists for the 2021-22 school year. In order to ensure the best learning environment for all students, it is important that classes be balanced with an equal number of boys and girls, a blend of various ability levels, and separation of students who do not perform well together. Staff spend an incredible amount of time making sure that classrooms are balanced and that individual student needs are met. Each staff member works extremely hard in providing an excellent education for our children at East Lake Elementary. We believe all teachers employed at East Lake are excellent teachers who can provide excellent instruction.

However, sometimes there are unique circumstances when it is necessary for parents to provide additional input about their child's placement for the next school year that we do not already know. If you feel you have information that will assist us in the placement of your child, you may obtain a "Student Placement Form" from the office. Please understand that adjustments may need to be made over the summer months and that we can not always guarantee that the placement will be honored.

If you choose to complete a student placement form, we ask that it be completed and returned to the East Lake office by Friday, April 16, 2021.

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
## CELEBRATING OUR DIVERSITY AT EAST LAKE ELEMENTARY

Our East Lake classrooms are a diverse place where students of different cultures come together to learn. By promote diversity in our classrooms students can learn the values of respect, acceptance and community. We recognize and celebrate many cultures each month through our literacy curriculum. We have embedded excellent literature, activities and academic material recognizing the many cultures that we see throughout East Lake and District 196.

In February we recognize Black History Month. Grade level teachers celebrate Black History Month in a variety of ways. In February and throughout the year, teachers are continuing to keep diversity at the forefront of their planning. Teachers make sure that students of color see themselves in the school community. We want students of color to see representations of authors, historians, scientists, etc. There are so many amazing people of color and we continue to use these stories in our curriculum. Teachers focus on representing students of color when books are chosen for book clubs and read alouds.

Here are some examples on how we celebrate diversity in our classrooms throughout the year...

- $\sim$  **Strive Publishing** Working with Strive Publishing to learn from prominent Minnesota African American Authors about becoming authors.
- ~ **Author/Illustrator Units of Study:** Reading books written and illustrated by black writers and artists; Keturah A. Bobo and Donald Crews. Mae Jemison, the first black woman to go to space.
- ~ Community Units of Study at each Grade level The message is "Everyone is welcome". We acknowledge and celebrate differences that make us unique. We recognize that our unique traits can be strengths within our community. We brainstorm ways to make friends and include others. We recognize and respect others' perspectives, thinking, and opinions.
- ~ **Bullying Curriculum** We discuss stereotypes (not all bullies are large, male, etc.) and how we cannot make assumptions about people/groups of people.
- ~ Reading biographies Biographies highlighting prominent black leaders as well as leaders from various cultures (Martin Luther King Jr., Rosa Parks, Abraham Lincoln, Harriet Tubman, etc.). Specifically focusing on leaders during slavery as well as the Civil Rights Movement leading to conversations around inequities during these time periods.
- ~ Classroom Libraries Books in each classroom library that represent different cultures and backgrounds.
- ~ Geography Units Reading about black Americans who have made a difference to people in the US or even in MN.
- ~ **District 196 curriculum committee** adding representation of people of color in the district curriculum.

## **CAHOOTS 2021 SUMMER PROGRAM**

CAHOOTS math and language arts in one book ... a great value!

Parents, Community Education is pleased to again be offering CAHOOTS, a K-5 summer math and language arts correspondence workbook program.

The program is portable, flexible and designed to closely match our district curriculum through an engaging and reflective approach to learning. After completing each lesson and checking answers online, students complete an assignment reflection and send to a CAHOOTS Buddy who will send a written response back.

You will receive a letter which includes enrollment instructions the week of March 1. Cost is \$43. Final registration is due April 2.

It is recommended students work on the grade level they will be entering in the fall (i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> grade is a review of kindergarten), to review and reinforce skills learned during the school year. Please discuss with your child's teacher, if you feel another level may be more suitable.

CAHOOTS should not be considered a replacement for participating in summer school, if your child qualifies. CAHOOTS is not intended to replace regular reading for enjoyment or math activities that strengthen your child's fluency and love for math.

Looking ahead, we will begin Kickball/Baseball, Basketball, Floor Hockey and Bowling. That will take us right up to about spring break.



## Return to In-Person - update -

Band families received a letter from District 196 about our return to in-person school and what band will look like. Specific details can now be added for Highland and East Lake:

- We will continue to offer Zoom classes for all band students through February 3.
- Students will be able to play at school during in-person learning.
- Homerooms will not be mixed for band class playing groups.
- Tenor Saxophone and Tuba players will be assigned TWO instruments. The one they already have will stay at their home. Their other individually assigned instrument will stay at school.
- Percussion students will bring their own sticks and mallets to school on their band day.
- Flute, Oboe, Clarinet, Bass Clarinet, Alto Saxophone, Trumpet, French horn, Trombone, and Baritone students will bring their instrument from home to school on their band day.
- All students will bring their iPad and band folder/books/music to school on their band day.
- Band PPE has been ordered for students and instruments and HEPA filters have been / will be installed in playing spaces as prescribed by the District.
- Band teachers will continue to produce play-along videos. It is strongly recommended that students continue to use these for guided home practice.
- In-person band will likely begin after President's Day to give band teachers time to prepare equipment and spaces, while allowing students to re-adjust to their classrooms.
- There **may** be "**Zoom Band Party!**" for **ALL** band students on Wednesday mornings before school due to the late start. In other words, "Wednesday Band Party" may continue, but in the morning!:)

#### Schedule For In Person Students: What day/time does my student attend band?

Students will have one day per week for their band class at school. The schedule will be posted in Schoology and in classrooms.

The students already know Mrs. Wyatt as we have been working together all year. Also, Mrs. Firchow will have zoom drop in times. Mrs. Wyatt and Mrs. Firchow plan closely together. Digital Academy students will perceive very little change from the earlier portion of the year.
