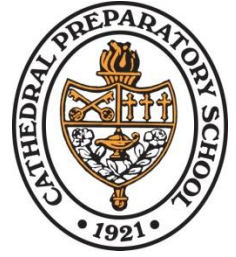


CATHEDRAL PREPARATORY SCHOOL

ART SCHOLARSHIP



Cathedral Preparatory awards renewable art scholarships of \$500 each based on the criteria listed below. **Once we receive your application, we will call to confirm the time and location for your audition. Virtual auditions are permitted.**

Procedure:

- A) Applicant must submit a letter of recommendation from his art teacher or private instructor if applicable.
- B) Applicant must, on the day of audition, submit three original art works. One **MUST** be a pencil drawing, one **MUST** be a two-dimensional piece done in color, which could include drawing, painting, photography or graphic arts, and the third piece is the artist's choice. Applicant must also bring a portfolio to the audition.
- C) Applicant must write a short essay (one page typed, double spaced) describing his interest in art. The essay should explain how he would like to develop his artistic skills, future plans for artistic involvement in high school and beyond, and how his personal talent has been shared with others. The essay should also indicate the artist's favorite medium, such as pencil, paint, clay, etc.
- D) The applicant will be given time to draw a preset still life containing the basic three-dimensional shapes: cone, sphere, cube, and cylinder. Applicants will be expected to demonstrate knowledge of three-dimensional drawing and shading. All supplies necessary for completion of this project will be provided.
- E) As a scholarship recipient, you will be required to participate in the annual Prep and Villa Art Show, submitting a minimum of one finished piece
- F) Applicant must complete the registration form below and submit it with the letter of recommendation and essay no later than **March 26, 2021** to: Mr. Timothy Dougherty, Cathedral Preparatory School, 225 West 9th Street, Erie, PA 16501.
