#### **Mission Statement**

#### Curriculum

Archbishop Riordan High School is committed to 21st century learning that includes leading curricular innovation and exploring alternative instruction and assessment. Our dedicated, knowledgeable, and compassionate faculty meets our students where they are, supporting them to individual excellence.

*Standards-Based Grading System* | Beginning in the Fall semester 2019, Riordan began utilizing a Standards-Based Grading system to help our students master the skills needed to succeed after graduation. The school no longer uses "F." An "I" grade reflects "Insufficient Evidence" and registers as 0.00 for GPA purposes.

*Campus Curricular Changes Due to COVID-19* | Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the school began distance learning in March 2020. Classes were asynchronous and set up in modules.

4x4 Block Schedule & Distance/Hybrid Class Schedule | In the 2020–2021 school year, Riordan will hold classes in an online and hybrid format as the SF Department of Health allows. For this academic year, Riordan will go back to a 4x4 block schedule to help protect our community's health and provide the best educational experience for our students and teachers. In a 4x4 block schedule, students can take up to 8 classes, and 1 semester 10-unit class is equal to 1 full year credit on a traditional schedule.

#### **Engineering Program**

In 2017 Riordan launched a four-year honors Engineering Program for qualified students. In addition to advanced math and science courses, this challenging program prepares students for a college-level engineering major. Courses are taught in the Makerspace classroom that give students the opportunity to learn a variety of engineering skills in a collaborative setting. ### **Athletics and Activities**

The Athletic Department fields over 40 teams over 20 combined men's and women's programs in the sports of: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, track and field, volleyball, and wrestling. More than 30 extracurricular clubs and activities and Campus Ministry programs also support the personal growth of students.

#### **Visual and Performing Arts**

The Visual and Performing Arts Department strives to engage students in productive and analytical arts experiences, offering courses in Drama, Dance, Music and the Visual Arts. The Riordan Marching Band performs at events throughout California and internationally, as ambassadors of San Francisco. The Drama Department, housed in the largest high school theatre in the Bay Area, produces an annual fall play and spring musical. Visual Arts students explore the traditional mediums of drawing, painting, ceramics, and sculpture. Through our diverse curriculum, students discover the capacity to express freely and become independent thinkers.

#### **Resource Specialist Program**

The Resource Specialist Program (RSP) offers a three-tiered program for students to receive the individual attention appropriate to their needs. Students receive services including in-class accommodations, smaller English classes, a study skills class, personalized tutoring, and testing support. With the support of the RSP, students with learning differences can and do succeed in a mainstream college preparatory curriculum.

#### **Boarding Program**

Riordan operates one of the few boarding programs in a major U.S. city. Nineteen students from nine countries—Cameroon, China, Czech Republic, Ireland, Spain, Senegal, Taiwan, Vietnam, and the U.S.—currently live on campus.


