

Welcome to Junior High

- 8:10 a.m.-2:55 p.m. (Monday-Thursday)
- 8:10 a.m.-2:00 p.m. (Friday)
- Block schedule (A and B day)
- Eight class periods
- Each period is 80 minutes long
- RAP (Reading and Academic Progress)
 - 35 minutes long
 - Monday-Thursday



How does the Block Schedule work?

- A Day: periods 1, 2, 3, 4, RAP
- B Day: periods 5, 6, 7, 8, RAP
- No RAP on Fridays



Dress Code

- **Shorts/skirts:** can't be higher than 3 inches above your knee
- **Pants:** no holes above the knee
- **Shirts:** must have a sleeve, no inappropriate language or pictures
- **Hair color:** no extreme colors (determined by admin.)
- **Shoes:** no slippers

Lunch

- We have two lunches that last 30 minutes.
- Eat in the cafeteria.
- Can have school lunch or home lunch.
- Counselors open the gym at lunch the last 15 minutes to play basketball and volleyball.
- You can check out a soccer ball or football in the main office and play on the field.



Lockers

- We have upper and lower lockers.
- They have combination locks on them.
- You keep everything in your locker and go back and forth to it between classes.
- You receive your locker in August.


7th Grade Math

1. Math 7

- Math 7 and Honors Math 7 are taught in the same classroom.
- If you do honors problems in class, the teacher gives you honors credit.

2. Accelerated Math

- Math 8 Honors
- Must take the CoGat Test or complete district math portfolio





Accelerated Math

- This course places students directly into integrated 8th grade math.
- Acceleration provides an opportunity to take additional AP math courses in high school.
- On this track, students can take AP Calculus in 11th grade and AP Statistics in 12th grade and earn college credit.

 - Complete the online form found in the newsletter if you are interested in Accelerated Math.




Honors or Not?

- cook nutritional meals, sew a pillow




Career and College Awareness (CCA)

Keyboarding



■ Keyboarding

- All students need to be able to type 30 wpm with 80% accuracy.
- It is something you use everyday.
- Students will be asked to type papers and do research.
- If students cannot do this, we ask that you take a keyboarding class in 7th grade.
- We have placed students in Keyboarding based on their Term 2 typing test. Typing test instructions (pg 5) are in your packet if students would like to earn a higher score.



Exploring Tech 1

- Follows the technology and engineering section of the CCA class.
- Activity oriented class that incorporates STEM principles.
- Students explore technologies in communications, manufacturing, construction, transportation, power, and energy.

Music



- We strongly encourage you take a music class in 7th grade.
 - The choices include:
 - Music Exploration
 - Choir 1 (boys or girls)
 - Orchestra
 - Band



Music Exploration

- One semester class
- Learn music basics
- Learn how to play instruments like the ukulele and bells.



Choir 1 (boys or girls)

- One semester or Full year class
- Introduction to music and learning how to sing.
- Sing music from a variety of styles.
- Perform in two concerts.



Orchestra

- Full year class
- If you played in 6th grade orchestra or want to start playing an instrument in junior high, this is an awesome class for you.



Band

- Full year class
 - Summer Band-Classes are held July 26 to August 13 for 30 minutes each day for four days each week.
- **Please see orange Summer Band handout for more information.**
- Talk to Mr. King about instrument questions
 - Percussion Test: Thursday, March 5th at 4:00 p.m. in room 106. Must have TWO years of piano to be considered for the percussion class.



P.E. 7

- This is a **FUN** class!!
- Students are required to take this class for a semester, but can also take it for a full year if they enjoy P.E.
- Uniform of white shirt and black shorts (no pockets).
- You change and have a combination locker to keep your clothes and belongings safe.
- You do different sports, fitness days and the mile run.
- You are not required to shower, but need to clean up after class.

World Language

- We offer one World Language: **Spanish**
- Students should be comfortable with English before starting another language. (grammar)
- Learn about culture, vocabulary and practice speaking.
- Full year class.
- Preference given to 8th & 9th graders.





Electives (semester)

- Film History: Learn about the history of film.
- Creative Writing: Learn to write in various styles
- Civics: Explores different types of government, economics, branches of the government, elections and current events.

N: Needs Improving


U: Unsatisfactory
