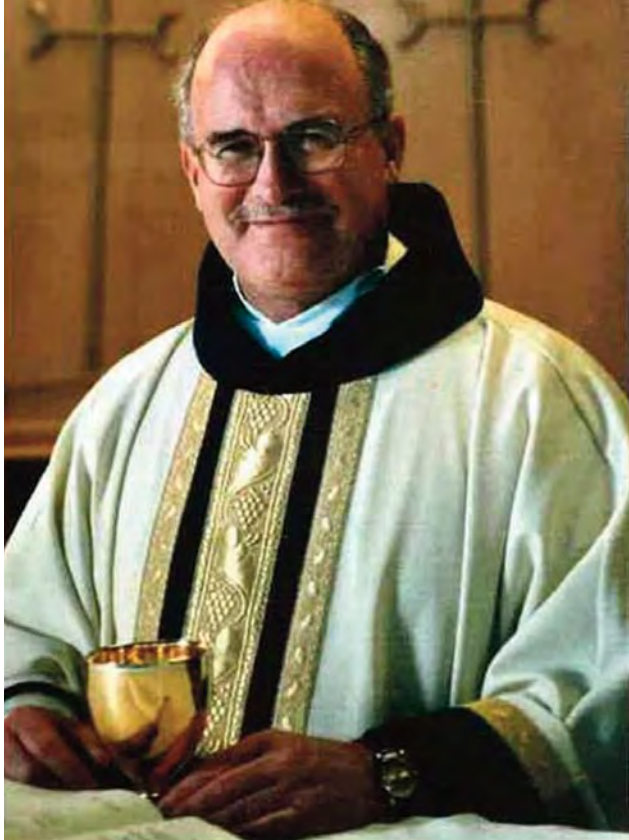

On July 26, 2020, we sadly bid farewell to Father Patrick James Ritter. Father Pat was synonymous with Sacred Heart, serving our community for 12 years as pastor in addition to his earlier assignment here as parochial vicar. He was respected and trusted by his peers and the people he was called to serve, spending countless hours on various boards and committees for the Archdiocese of Seattle.

Father Pat was known for his great enthusiasm and love of people. He was most himself when he was in a crowd sharing stories and telling jokes.

He enjoyed engaging with members of the Sacred Heart Community as well as travelling to various parts of the world with friends, exuding his welcoming spirit to all. He brought joy to all who knew him through his strong faith in God, his great sense of humor, and his compassion for others.

As a former teacher, Father Pat had an enduring love for Catholic education. He was actively involved with Sacred Heart School and was a founding board member of the Fulcrum Foundation.

Father Pat was a talented pianist and organist. Known throughout the Sacred Heart School Community to play a rousing sing-along of “Rudolph the Red Nosed Reindeer” at Christmas time and his famous rendition of “Take Me Out to the Ballgame” at the last Mass of the school year. He also loved to entertain the members of Carpe Diem in the Narthex and friends in his home with piano sing-alongs, especially around the holidays.

His thoughtful leadership and ability to engage the parish and school will never be forgotten. We dedicate this community report to the legacy of Father Pat. He will be missed dearly.

# parish Campaign

It is with heartfelt gratitude and sincere appreciation that we are able to share our 4 in 1 Campaign results with the Sacred Heart community.

In 2018, Sacred Heart embarked on the 4 in 1 Campaign to perform a complete replacement of the church roof and ceiling, upgrade the interior lighting and re clad the bell tower. During the course of the project, the bell tower required complete removal of the existing limestone and a different method of recladding. This unanticipated change was the result of a seismic requirement that secures the church and bell tower in the event of an earthquake. Our final cost for the campaign, as of December 2020, is \$3,016,000.

Thanks to the contributions of our parishioners, we have collected 85% of the \$2.25 million in pledges in two years of a three-year pledge redemption period. Thank you so much for your generosity! If you still have an outstanding balance on your 4 in 1 pledge, payment of your pledge at this time would be greatly appreciated. This results in our ability to pay down our loan from the Archdiocese and replenish our parish savings. Please contact the parish office if you need information on the status of your pledge. Thank you to all who participated in, and contributed to, this successful parish project. We are all blessed to have a beautifully refurbished church for our Sacred Heart community.

## Notes to Financial Statement:

[1] Every year, the parish and school operating funds make a transfer to the parish and school capital funds. This recognizes the need to put aside substantial money for major maintenance and repair needs as good stewards of our facility-related resources.

[2] The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) rebate is an important funding source for the parish capital fund. From the 2019 ACA effort, we received a rebate of \$7,356. Making and fulfilling your ACA pledge made this possible.

[3] The interest from our parish general savings account with the Archdiocese of Seattle is an important funding source for the parish capital fund and is included here.

[4] During the summer of 2019, the school renovated the primary school restrooms. Cost of the project was \$316,020. Of that, \$129,886 was raised the previous year at the 2019 School Auction through Fund-A-Need for this purpose.

[5] During the spring of 2019, the HVAC control system for the church and parish center buildings was updated and upgraded with new technology and enhanced graphics in order to improve management capability and save on energy costs.

[6] During the summer of 2019, the school spent monies to design and construct a new pre-school playground on the grassy area just west of the parish office building.

# Connecting the Classroom with the World!

Who could have imagined in the fall of 2019 the way the world was about to change in the spring of 2020? Sacred Heart School, like all the rest, has had to reimagine the way that school takes place in order to continue to provide an excellent education to all our students whether they are online, in-person, or both.

We were able to accomplish this feat and successfully switch from in-person to remote instruction within two days after the governor closed schools in March. Our technology team of Nancy Schoeggl, Lindsay Steer, Deanna Simons, and Joe Daly prepared our teachers with a quick course in the programs necessary to shift to online learning. They were assisted in this process by the invaluable support of a variety of parent volunteers including Christian Wylde, Evelyn Padrino, and Carlos Gonzalez. Of course, the whole school community had a hand in this transition, including the parents who acted as volunteer teaching assistants from their homes which now served as their children's classroom.

The Auction Fund-a-Need of four years ago played a pivotal role in this transition and provided the necessary hardware, training, and experience that laid the groundwork for a unified and robust approach to online learning. As teachers and students began to return to campus this fall, one piece of hardware was crucial to our success: the Boxlight displays.

About 15 years ago, Sacred Heart School began installing Promethean Activboards into classrooms around campus. Over the course of the next four years, they were installed in every classroom and began to transform the way that teachers taught and students learned. The Activboards brought the educational resources of the internet into the classroom in a large screen format.

Slowly, those Activboards reached the end of their lifespan and needed to be replaced. However, instead of just replacing them with new Activboards, we were fortunate to be able to bring updated technology to our classes in the form of Boxlight flat panel displays. We were able to do this thanks to the extremely generous support of two anonymous donors who saw both the need and the possibility of something better! The Boxlight displays arrived providentially at just the right time. They allow the students at home to interact with the teacher and students in school. With students now being taught simultaneously in-person and online, these new interactive displays have been critical to our quality of education.

2020 has been a challenging year for teachers and students everywhere and we pray for all our students, parents, and staff and all those around the world as we continue to do our best to teach and guide our students. Thank you to the many people who have made our successes possible and our challenges resolvable this year and for the ongoing generosity exhibited by our community. And once again, thank you to the two anonymous donors for their fortuitous foresight in providing our school with the Boxlight technology!

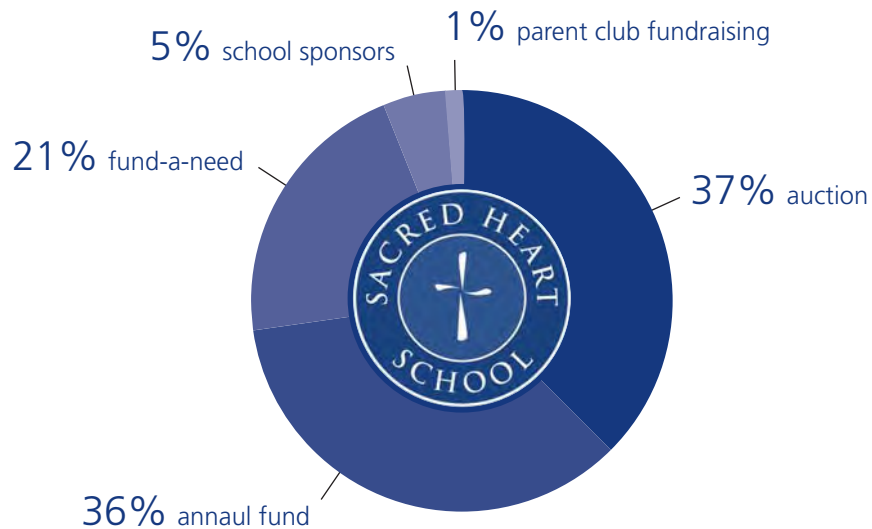

*Last year our annual School Auction Gala, “Studio 54, Blame it on the Boogie”, raised over \$135,000 towards supporting ways to integrate STEAM into our student’s lives here at Sacred Heart School. STEAM embodies the current trend of educating our students in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics in fun, innovative and engaging ways. With our world around us advancing at such a rapid pace, it is important to prepare our students to enter into the future with as much experience as we are able to provide. These funds will allow us to integrate the STEAM concepts into areas that we have not been able to fully explore before.*

*We had 3 tier goals, with the FUNKADELIC tier being the highest level we could achieve. With the generous donors from both Sacred Heart School and Sacred Heart Parish, we were able to achieve our goal! Just a sampling of some of the items we have slated for the school are 3-D printers, laser cutter for Art and Technology classes, additional robotics equipment for classrooms, history ‘trunks’ to provide real hands-on experience, after-school entrepreneurial program, additional science, math and engineering tools for all grade levels, and increased education for our staff to support STEAM growth in our students. While we have been briefly sidelined in our project development by COVID-19, we are ready to deploy these funds and role these programs out as soon as we are able. We have already begun acquiring the 3-D printers and look forward to welcoming students back on campus to begin experimenting with them soon! 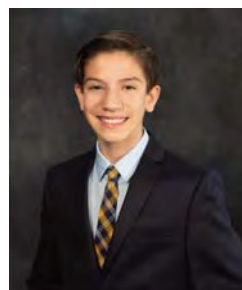

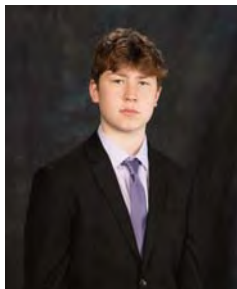

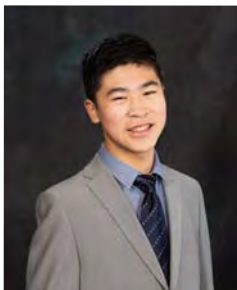
