

Indian Woods Middle School Families,

Here are our latest guidelines and procedures FOR STUDENTS IN THE HYBRID LEARNING MODEL. Students in the fully remote model will continue to attend classes from home.

What Students Should Bring on the FIRST DAY:

- Mask
- Water Bottle (optional)
- Personal Hand Sanitizer (optional)

Weekly Schedule for HYBRID STUDENTS:

For families that have selected Hybrid Model your students will start attending the week of January 26. Your student has been assigned to one of two groups by last name. Here are the weekly schedules for both groups:

- **A Group** (Last Name A - Lamb) - Monday and Tuesday In-Person at Indian Woods / Wednesday and Thursday at home learning through activities assigned on Canvas / Friday Remote learning at home
- **B Group** (Last Name Lamc - Z) - Monday and Tuesday at home learning through activities assigned on Canvas / Wednesday and Thursday In-Person at Indian Woods / Friday Remote learning at home

In-Person Learning Days: Indian Woods will open doors at 8:20AM. Students not eating breakfast will report directly to their Wolf Pack classroom. Students may eat breakfast in the MPR before reporting to Wolf Pack. Wolf Pack starts at 8:45. Students will attend all classes (periods 1-7) and be dismissed for the day at 3:45.

Home Learning Days: Students will complete activities and assignments posted on Canvas for each class. Students are expected to remotely check-in with Wolf Pack at 8:45.

Remote Learning Days: Student will remotely attend all classes including Wolf Pack. Families that have selected the Remote Only options will continue with their current schedule.

Arrival Procedures

Students riding the bus will arrive in the front circle drive. Students will get off the buses one bus at a time.

Students arriving other than the bus will enter the building on the North side by the gymnasium. Drivers should enter the parking lot using 97th Street.

Students will be required to wear masks to enter the building. We will do our best to maintain social distance between students.

Students with band and/or orchestra instruments may drop off their instrument in their music rooms before school starts.

Dismissal Procedures

Students riding the bus will leave through the two front entrances and immediately get on their assigned bus.

Students leaving in vehicles other than the bus will be picked up on the North side of the building by the gymnasium. We will do our best to maintain social distance between students. Students will be encouraged to find their rides and get in their vehicles in a timely fashion. Students may get in their vehicles along 97th Street or Horton Street. We prefer students not cross the street to enter a vehicle.

Students must wear a mask on the bus. Students must wear a mask until they enter their private vehicle.

Students walking home may leave from any exit.

Lunchroom Procedures

We have four lunch periods scheduled for each day. Each lunch varies from 65 to 85 students during our Hybrid In-Person Days.

Students will be assigned to individual tables. We are spacing students at 6 feet apart from seat to seat.

Students will be able to bring lunch or eat a school lunch.

Microwave ovens for student use will not be available.

Parents will not be able to come to the building to eat lunch with their students.

Students will not be able to eat food from outside vendors that has been delivered by a parent or delivery service.

Students must wear a mask while they are not eating.

As students return to in-person learning, USDA has indicated the **meals are at no cost to students**. If a student wants only a carton of milk, they would need to purchase this as ala carte. This would be similar to a student purchasing a bag of chips or a package of cookies. These are considered ala carte items and the student would need to purchase these.

Students wanting to add money to their account should bring check or cash to the kitchen before school. Parents may also add money to lunch accounts through Skyward. We are discouraging the use of cash during lunch.

Hallway Procedures

Students will not be issued lockers this year.

Students will be asked to stay to the right side of the hallway and not to walk in groups that cross the center line of the hallway.

Our stairways have already been designated as a set of UP stairs only and a set of DOWN stairs only.

Students will be encouraged to move with purpose to their next class.

Students will be reminded to keep social distance while in the hallway.

Students must wear a mask while in the hallway.

Students should not use the restroom during passing period in order to promote social distancing and discourage crowding in the restrooms.

Restroom Procedures

Students will be allowed to use the restroom after checking in with their teacher.

Two students will be allowed in each restroom at a time. Additional students will need to wait outside the restroom, safely distanced, until another student leaves the restroom.

Students must wear a mask while in the hallway and in the restroom.

Students must wash their hands with soap and water before leaving the restroom.

Classroom Procedures

Students will be seated at distances no closer than 3-6 feet apart.

Students will have an assigned seat.

Students must wear a mask while in the classroom.

Students will be dismissed from the classroom in an orderly fashion to prevent congestion at the classroom doorway.

Students will hand sanitize when they enter the classroom AND when they leave the classroom.

Transportation Procedures

New this year, **SMSD is requiring ALL that want to receive bus service to enroll online.** This includes those that qualify for free busing. See information [HERE](#).

Students will be given an assigned seat on the bus.

PE Classes

Students are encouraged to come to school ready to participate in PE classes.

Students needing to change into active clothes will be given the opportunity in our locker rooms.
