GSA is a non-profit organization that awards need-based scholarships from local sponsor organizations and families to students who reside in Greenwich or attend Greenwich High School who demonstrated financial need. Awards for qualified applicants range from \$500 to multiple combined awards up to \$10,000 and are paid directly to the college or university for tuition, room, board and mandatory fees. **DEMONSTRATED** FINANCIAL NEED IS A PREREQUISITE FOR

CONSIDERATION OF ANY SCHOLARSHIP THROUGH

GSA. Financial need means student's combined financial resources (including income and savings) together with their financial package (grants, scholarships, work study, and subsidized loans) from their chosen school will not cover the cost of their college or university. The online application will be available November 15, 2020 and the deadline for submission of ALL material is March 10, 2021(no exceptions will be made to this deadline). Application to GSA includes: submission of the online application, as well as submission of the Student Aid **Report (SAR)** which is generated when the FAFSA is completed. Applicants who do not meet the financial criteria will be notified in early April. The tentative date for interviews is April 30, 2021 which is required for all applicants (assuming we are able to meet in person by then). Students also MUST submit financial aid packages from their intended school before matching with scholarship funds can be completed. The workshop is free of charge and is scheduled to begin at 4 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. on Sunday, February

Registration is limited to 100 students. Once registered, students will receive a checklist of documents and materials to gather for use during the workshop. As a reminder, undocumented students who are Connecticut residents may be eligible for institutional need-based aid at UConn. Connecticut Women's Hall of Fame Scholarship

The Eileen Kraus Scholarship awards a one-time \$5,000 scholarship to one female high school senior. Applicants must be legal residents of the state of Connecticut, in their final year of high school or recently graduated, planning to enroll in their first year of college or university (current college or university students are ineligible), and able to attend the upcoming October 2021 Connecticut Women's Hall of Fame Induction ceremony in Hartford. Eligible women will submit a two-page, 1,000 word essay detailing how an inductee of the Women's Hall of Fame inspired them and the goals they hope to achieve in their fields of study. Students should submit their official high school transcript and essay to scholarships@cwhf.org and complete the application found on the Connecticut Women's Hall of Fame website. All applications, transcripts and essays due February 23, 2021.

Bo Kolinsky Memorial Sports Journalism Scholarship

CT State USBC Association Scholar of the Year Award

Two academic scholarships of \$1,000 each are available. The applicant does NOT need to be an active bowler. The Roberta B. Willis Need-Merit Scholarship Program

Please see your counselor if you are interested in applying. Counselors must submit all completed student applications by the February 15, 2021 deadline.

Requires eligible high school students to rank in the top 20 percent of their junior year class (upon graduation for all others) and/or have a combined score of 1200 or better on the SAT or have an ACT score of 25 or better. To qualify for the need-based requirement, students must have a federal Expected Family Contribution (EFC) equal to or below our annual maximum EFC cutoff of \$10,999 to be considered for an award. All applicants must submit a 2021-22 FAFSA no later than February 15, 2021. Students must list an eligible Connecticut institution on the FAFSA for award consideration. In order to qualify for an award, students must ultimately attend an eligible Connecticut public or private, not-for-profit institution of higher education.

Middlesex County Blue Star Mothers 2021 Scholarship

A \$500 scholarship to be awarded to a Connecticut high school senior who will be going on to a four-year college and who has a parent (or legal guardian) actively serving in the military or a parent (or legal guardian) who is an honorably discharged Veteran. Military service includes the Army, Marines, Air Force, Navy, Coast Guard, National Guard and Reserves. Completed applications must be postmarked by April 2, 2021. The Milton Fisher Scholarship

The Milton Fisher Scholarship is a four-year renewable scholarship open to exceptionally Innovative and Creative high school juniors and seniors, and first-time college freshman. Award: \$4,000 - \$20,000.

Eligible applicants must satisfy these two conditions:

- 1. Applicant must be (a) a high school junior, or (b) a high school senior, or (c) any person entering an undergraduate degree program* in the fall after the application deadline or the following spring, or (d) a student in the first year of an undergraduate degree program*.
- 2. Applicant must be (a) a Connecticut or New York City metropolitan area resident planning to attend or attending an institution of higher education anywhere in the U.S., or (b) a resident of any part of the U.S. planning to attend or attending an institution of higher education in CT or NYC.
