CREATING SCHOOL ACCOUNTS

- When your students submitted applications, they should have received an email asking your student to create an account
- It is important that this is done for every school that your student applied to.



CHECKING SCHOOL PORTALS

- After your child has created their account/portal, they need to be checked at least once a week
- This is how the school will communicate with your student
- Your student will have a "to do" list if they need to turn any additional information in







- If your student reported SAT or ACT scores on their application, they are responsible for sending these scores to each school they self reported scores to
- Send available scores via college board
- They will do this with AP scores as well to the college you plan to attend to

Important Cal Grant / Chafee Updates

This screen contains important updates about the Cal Grant, Chafee and Middle Class Scholarship programs, CSAC makes every effort to keep you updated.

Cal Grant Updates

- You can complete the 2017-2018 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application as early as October 1, 2016.
- If you were denied a Cal Grant Competitive award, please be advised that the Commission cannot consider corrections to the FAFSA or GPA information. The Commission received approximately 200,000 applications to compete for the Cal Grant Competitive award cycle. The State provides us with funding for only 12.875 awards. As you can see, this is a highly competitive grant and we have a very limited amount of Cal Grant Competitive grants to award to students. Visit your financial aid office to see if they have other funding available to assist you in meeting your financial obligations.
- * What does Low Score mean? CSAC receives approximately 200,000 on-time applications annually from applicants who have demonstrated financial need to compete for 12,875 Competitive Cal Grant awards. Based on the demand, CSAC scores the applications using GPA, income, family size, parents/students educational background, single parent home and disadvantaged high school criteria. Points are assigned uniformly to all eligible applicants based on information provided on the FAFSA. If you weren't awarded a Competitive Cal Grant, your total points were lower than the 12,875 selected applicants

- English: 4 units
- Math: coursework culminating in at least the completion of Algebra II
- Science: 3 units (one year of lab science is recommended) effective 2012
- Social Studies: 3 units
- Second Language: 2 units of the same language*

TRANSFER STUDENT-WHAT DOES THAT MEAN?

- Complete 60 transferable credits
 - Year 1 & 2 done, enter as a 3rd year (junior)
- Must pass all classes with "C" or better
- Must have at least 2.0-2.4 GPA in transferable courses • GPA will vary, remember minimum is not always accepted • UC still have to answer personal insight questions
- No SAT or ACT test
