Dear Parents,

This letter is to inform you that a student in the Senior School, who was last in school on January 29th, has received positive test results for COVID-19. The student has been in isolation since February 2nd. The student's positive test was received today, February 8th. There is no risk of exposure as the student has not been back at school since January 29th. The family has assured us that the student has not been in contact with anyone at The Study, since leaving school.

As per our Reopening Plan, these emergency protocols have been taken:

- Our Emergency Health Officer, Mona Bosnakyan, has reached out to Santé Publique to ensure that all directives are being followed.
- The individual who has tested positive is isolating as per Santé Publique directives. We are to respect confidentiality and as such we are not able to provide further information. However, we do have permission to share that the student who has tested positive is doing well.

As per recent Santé Publique directives, please pay careful attention to the new guidelines with regards to symptoms for COVID-19 testing. Santé Publique asks that you do not wait the previously recommended 24 hours, but rather have your daughter tested as soon as possible if she displays any respiratory or flu symptoms e.g. sore throat, fever or cough. Again, please advise your respective Division Director if your daughter or anyone in your household is being tested, and while she is at home awaiting her or a family member's results, she will have access to online learning.
