- DAR Scholarships are awarded and judged without regard to gender, race, color, religion, national origin, or disability.
- Applicants must be citizens of the United States. Proof of citizenship includes a photocopy of the applicant's birth certificate or naturalization papers or the information page of the U.S. Passport (with the photograph covered).
- Applicants must attend or plan to attend an accredited college or university in the United States.
- All multi-year scholarships, typically renewable up to four years, must be for consecutive years of attendance at an accredited college or university in the United States.
- Applicants should carefully review the criteria for each scholarship, as some have special stipulations.
- Inclusion of an applicant's photograph in any section of their application will result in disqualification.
- Please note, DAR chapter sponsorship of an applicant is no longer required; however, a chapter or state chair may work with students by assisting them with their applications prior to submission.
- After the approval of the national Executive Committee, recipients will be contacted by email notification directly the DAR Scholarship Committee National Chair **no later than May 15, 2021**.
- All scholarship recipients will be asked to provide a sealed official transcript, which will be sent to NSDAR headquarters and the Office of the Reporter General. In addition, multi-year scholarship recipients must send their transcripts to the Office of the Reporter General—Committee Services, NSDAR, 1776 D Street NW, Washington, DC 20006–5303 **by July 1** of each year.

Each year the DAR awards over \$150,000 through more than 25 scholarships to young individuals for their outstanding academic achievements. DAR Scholarships are offered for a wide range of disciplines including: history, law, medical, nursing, music, education and many more.

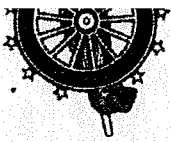

MP3 Format

- Applicant announces name, voice specialty (i.e. Soprano, Tenor) or piano.
- Date MP3 is made.
- Before each selection announce the name of the number, the composer and state the style, i.e. classical, jazz, musical, art song, etc.
- There should be a least two selections of contrasting styles. (If applicant feels a third selection would help present their talent, they may include one, but no more than three). In the case of pianists if their selections have various movements, they should select one movement from at least two compositions.
- Please complete the movement or song which is being played or sung. Do not submit fragments from songs.
- Vocals may be a cappella or accompanied. It is up to each vocalist to present themselves in the best way.
- Video recordings will not be accepted.
