# Graduation Requirements:

## Minimum 21 credits in 4 years of high school

- 4 credits in English
- 2 credits in Math
- 2 credits in Science (1 Biological & 1 Physical)
- 1 credit in Health Enhancement
- 1 credit in World History
- 1 credit in U.S. History
- ½ credit in U.S. Government
- ½ credit in Senior Social Studies elective
- 1 credit in Visual or Performing Arts (VPA)
- 1 credit in Career & Technical Education (CTE)
- 7 elective credits

**Grade level in PowerSchool indicates how many years you have been in school  
-- NOT your progress toward graduation.**

# NCAA/NAIA Requirements



- Complete a minimum number of high school core courses
- Earn a minimum grade point average in those courses
- Earn a minimum score on the SAT or ACT
- Graduate from high school

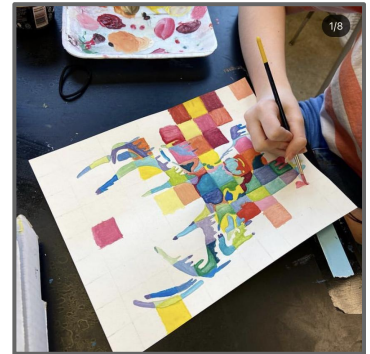

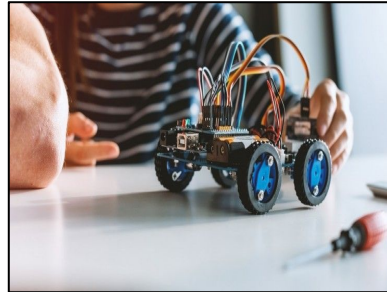
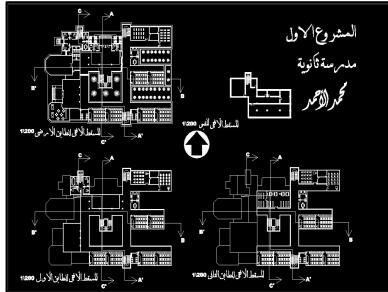
