Full Year Elective Options

Band 1-Brass (2204) For beginning students who want to play a brass instrument. Instruments are available to rent. (Fee)

Band 1-Percussion (2206) Prerequisite: 2+ years of piano lessons and tryouts. Piano experience is recommended, but not required. (Tryouts) (Fee)

Band 1-Woodwind (2205) For beginning students who want to play a woodwind instrument. Instruments are available to rent. (Fee)

Chinese 1 (3310) Beginning class that will introduce the Mandarin Chinese language, culture, and history. (Fee)

Dance Company (2606) Performing dance group will focus on choreography and technique. Extra performances required. Previous dance experience recommended. (Tryouts) (Fee)

French 1 (3210) Beginning class that will introduce the French language, culture, and history. (Fee)

Orchestra 1 (2405) For beginning students who want to play a string instrument. 6th grade orchestra class or private lessons are strongly encouraged. (Fee)

Spanish 1 (3110) Beginning class that will introduce the Spanish language, culture, and history. (Fee)

Semester or Year Elective Options

Choir 1-Beginning Choir (2301) A beginning choir for boys and girls. (Fee)

Knight Academy (400) Students will learn effective study habits. Helps students reach their academic goals. One semester is required in the 7th grade but can be taken for a full year.

Semester Elective Options

3-D Art (2104) Students will design and create a variety of 3-dimensional art. (Fee) No prerequisite required.

Art Foundations 1 (2101) A basic art class covering a wide variety of art elements, mediums, and history. (Fee)

Beginning Drawing (2101) Learning basics of drawing such as shading, form, use of space and perspective. (Fee)

Beginning Robotics (6700) Understanding, building and operating VEX robots. (Fee)

Creative Writing 1 (4335) Teaches the skills and strategies necessary to write creatively. May only be taken once.

Creative Coding 1 (7743) Introductory course with activities such as creating and organizing web pages, designing mobile apps; and collaboratively developing, publishing, and presenting products such as videos and podcasts. (Fee)

Creative Coding 2 (7744) Will learn Python and Java Script. Will be a hands-on interactive class. Must have some background of coding. (Fee)

Dance 1 (2601) A dance class for all genders and levels. No dance experience required. Class will consist of ballet, jazz, contemporary, improvisation and choreography. May be taken once per year.

Exploring Business and Marketing (7548) Develop skills to become a successful entrepreneur through a business and marketing simulation.

Exploring Tech 1-Engineering (7810) Students will learn the basics of wood construction, including making baseball bat and glove holder. (Fee)

Exploring Tech 1-Manufacturing (7810) Students will learn skills for design and manufacturing and make boomerangs, hot air balloons, etc. (Fee)

Hacking STEM 1 (6600) Students will work with technology to learn problem-solving skills in a collaborative way.

Hacking STEM 2 (6600) Students will participate in inquiry based science and engineering processes. Prerequisite: Hacking STEM 1.

Keyboarding 1 (7552) A beginning class, strongly recommended for students who type 30 wpm or less. (Fee)

Science Exploration-Astronomy (6701) An introduction to the fundamental concepts of astronomy. (Fee)

7th Grade Musical Production (2502) For those who want to be a part of the musical production. Mandatory evening dates – January 3-14, 2022. (Fee)

Theatre 1 (2502) Students will learn to speak and perform in front of an audience.

Immunization Requirements

7th Grade Entry 2021-2022

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Please read this information carefully as you prepare for your 7th grade student to enter junior high school. Please note the following:

- If you wish to have an exemption for your student, an online educational module must be completed, the exemption form must be printed and turned into the school in order for the exemption to be valid.
- Tdap booster, a second varicella (chicken pox) and Meningococcal vaccine are the additional required immunizations to enter junior high school.
- If your student has previously had the chicken pox a doctor's signed verification must be provided in order to be exempt from the varicella vaccine.

To attend the 7th grade, a student must have written proof of receiving the following immunizations:

- **Tdap**
- 2 Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
- 3 Hepatitis B
- 2 Varicella (chickenpox) or proof of immunity to disease signed by a health care provider (see below)
- **1 Meningococcal (Only Meningococcal vaccine given after 10 years of age is acceptable for 7th grade school entry)**
- 4 Polio (3 doses, if 3rd dose was given on/after 4th birthday)
- 2 Hepatitis A
- 5 DTaP/DT (4 doses of DTaP, if 4th dose given on/after 4th birthday; 3 doses of Td, if starting series after age 7 years with a single dose of Tdap preferred as the first dose)

Starting July 1, 2018 (Utah House Bill 308—School Immunization Law in Utah)

HB 308 Section 53-A-301 requires that students claiming immunity against a disease for which vaccination is required because the student previously contracted the disease **must submit a document signed by a healthcare provider** to the school as proof of immunity. Parents are no longer allowed to sign the Utah School Immunization Record for history of chickenpox disease verification or any other diseases. Schools must attach the immunity document from the provider to the Utah School Immunization Record.

Changes for Medical, Religious, or Personal Exemptions:

“To receive a vaccination exemption form, the legally responsible individual of a student **must complete an online education module** about vaccine-preventable diseases (free of charge), **print the vaccine exemption form**, and present the form to the school. If the legally responsible individual *declines to complete the online education module*, he/she must receive an *in-person consultation* at the local health department (\$25 fee may apply), sign the exemption form at the local health department, and provide a copy of the completed school immunization exemption form to the school official.”

Medical Exemption: In addition to completing the **online educational module** and **vaccine exemption form** as stated in the above paragraph, a **written notice signed by a licensed healthcare provider** stating, that due to the physical condition of the student/child, administration of the vaccine would endanger the student's/child's life or health **is required**.

Note: The **online educational module** is available on the Utah Immunization Program website (**www.immunize-utah.org**). A link will also be available on websites of local health departments, local educational agencies, and other public health programs or organizations.

Jr. High Honors Courses Indicators for Student Success

Please thoughtfully consider the following criteria as you are making a decision about whether or not Jr. High honors level courses will provide the most appropriate learning environment. A student should:

1. Score as “Proficient” on the Sage Test in a specific subject area before considering enrolling in an Honors level course in that subject area.
2. Consistently earn an “**A**” or “**B**” (or a “**3**” for 6th graders) for the subject in which they desire to take an Honors course.
3. Have a **high level of interest** and **strong desire to be challenged** in the subject in which they would like to take an Honors course.
4. Consistently exhibit most of the following characteristics:

Learning/Intellectual Characteristics:

- Enjoys tasks that are more challenging than average
- Has a ready grasp of underlying principles and can quickly make valid generalization about events, people and things
- Tries to understand complicated material by separating it into its respective parts; reasons things out
- Analyzes problems and considers alternatives
- Enjoys complex concepts and processes

Motivational/Affective Characteristics:

- Becomes absorbed and truly involved in certain topics or problems
- Needs little external motivation to follow through in work completion
- Often requires little direction from teachers
- Is highly self-motivated and persistent
- Has high expectations of self and others

When deciding whether or not to enroll a student in a particular subject area honors course, please consider the following subject specific characteristics:

Math/Science:


- Is interested in numerical analysis
- Has a good memory for storing main features of problem and solutions
- Reasons effectively and efficiently
- Organizes data and experiments to discover patterns or relationships
- Is flexible in solving problems

Social Studies/Language Arts:

- Has advanced vocabulary for age or grade level
- Reads a great deal; does not avoid difficult material
- Enjoys language/verbal or written communication; has advanced communication skills
- Organizes ideas and sequences in preparation for speaking and writing
- Likes study and research in areas of interest
