Community Health Worker Certification

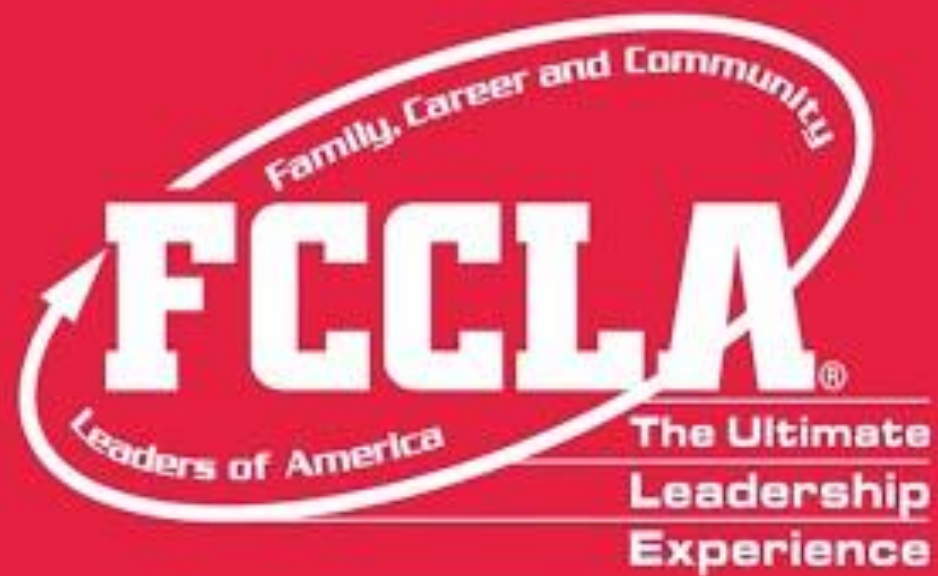
