

Teacher on Special Assignment Instructional Technology

DEFINITION

Under the direction of the Director of Instructional Technology, this full-time certificated position will be responsible for planning, developing, and coordinating delivery of technology-based staff development geared toward the integration of technology in the classroom to support teaching and learning. This position will assist in building upon the existing programs and designing future programs to best meet the needs of teachers and students. This position will also be involved in peer coaching, technology plan development and implementation of the district technology plan. The duration of the job assignment is two (years) years.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. The requirements listed below are representative of the knowledge, skill, and/or ability required. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. Other duties may be assigned.

- Plan, coordinate, support and implement the integration of technology into the curriculum in accordance with the District and site technology plans.
- Plan and provide technology-based staff development in accordance with the District and site technology plans.
- Provide assistance in funding and budgeting related to the District and site technology plans.
- Provide support in monitoring and evaluating elements of the District and site technology plans.
- Model lessons and provide peer coaching.
- Develop goals and objectives for teachers to successfully use technology in the curriculum.
- Serve on instructional technology review committees.
- Troubleshoot and resolve minor technology problems.
- Schedule equipment usage.
