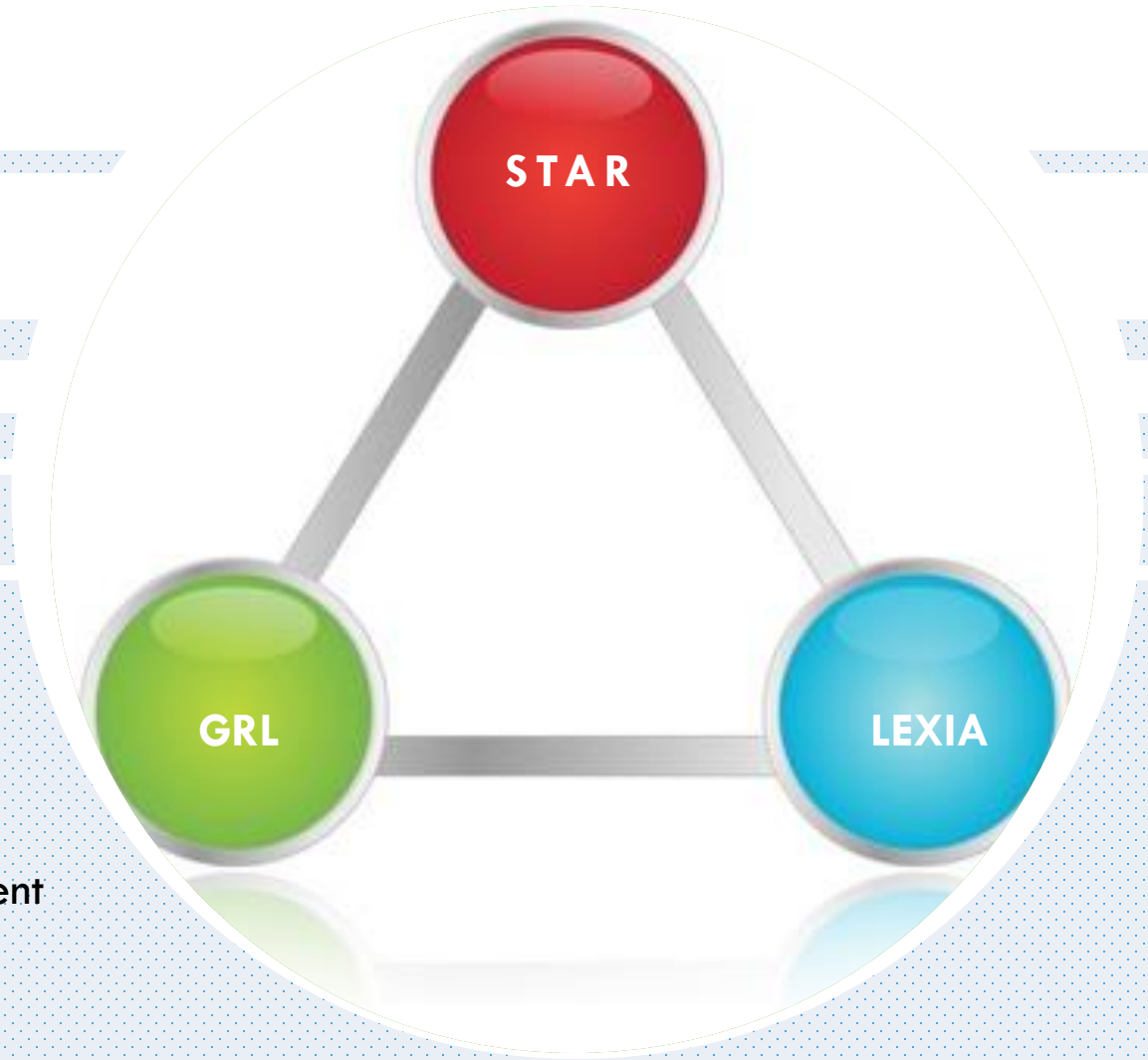

# UNDERSTANDING DATA AND INTERVENTION

▶ In Killingly, Data Cycles and progress monitoring are used to **assess students' academic performance**, to quantify a student rate of improvement or responsiveness to instruction, and to evaluate the effectiveness of instruction.

Our systems allow progress monitoring to be implemented with individual students or an entire class.

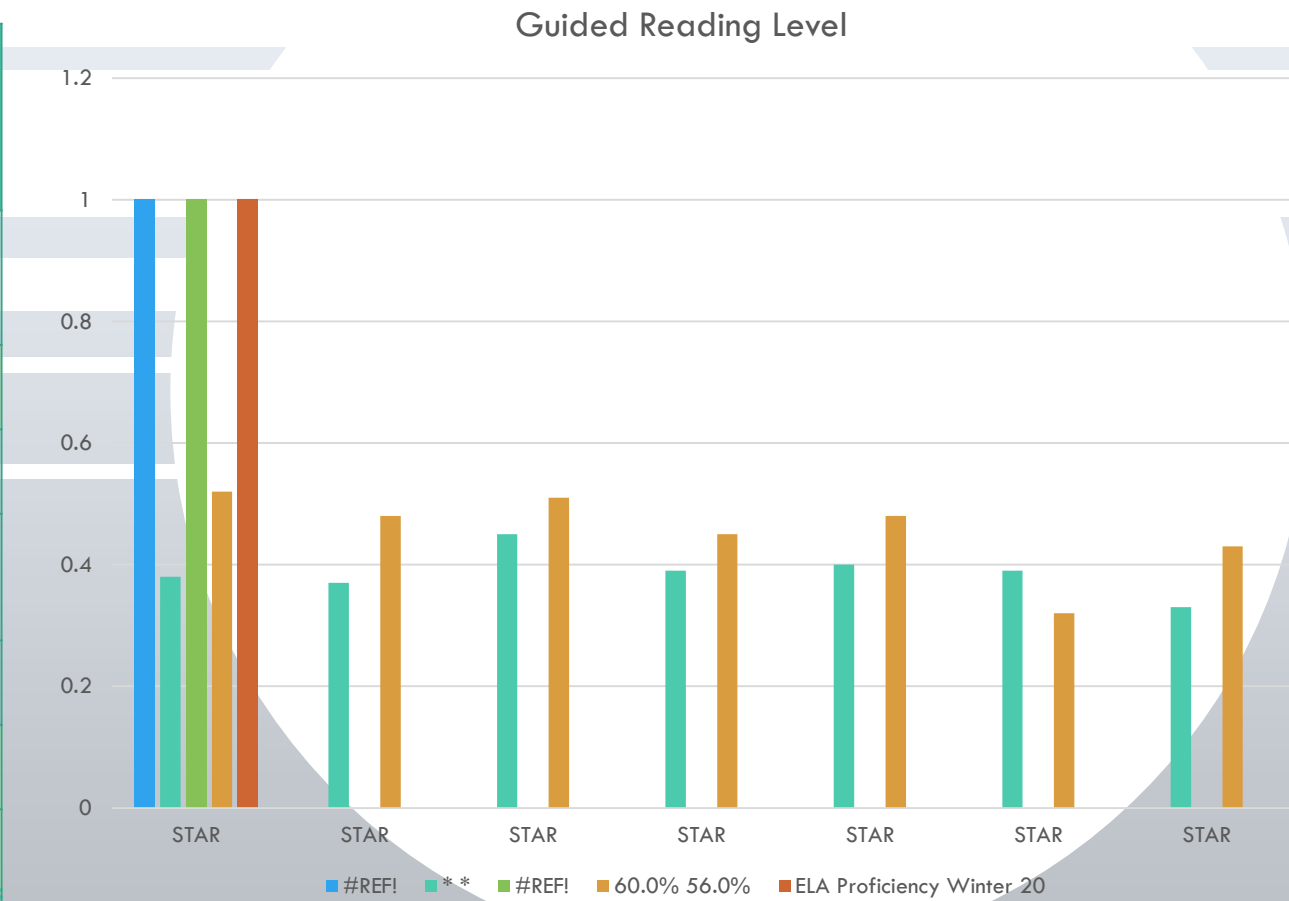

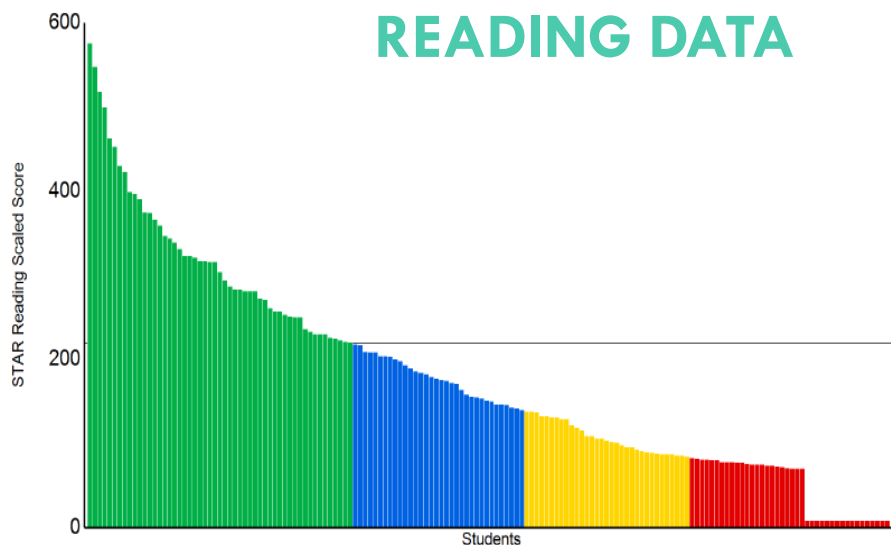

## WORK COMPLETED THROUGH INTERVENTION

- UNDERSTANDING WHERE STUDENTS FALL SHORT: WHAT ARE THE SKILLS THAT THEY ARE NOT ATTAINING?
  - VARY THROUGHOUT READING LEVEL- COMPREHENSION, WORD RECOGNITION, APPROPRIATE RATE, PHRASING, INTONATION, AND WORD STRESS.
  - CONFERENCING TIME IS KEY TO OUR MODEL.
- Early identification- Early support. Transfer remedial reading from KIS to KMS to increase support at KMS and KCS.
- Focus on Tier II- Strategic in the classroom.
  - Implementation of new strategies such as (PALS) Peer Assisted Learning System.
  - Partnering strategies which enter around the procedural skills.
  - This variance requires leveled texts and a high level of differentiation.
- Continuation of Progress Monitoring and adjustments.

# MOVING FORWARD

## **Grades K-1:**

- RX block intervention daily in grade 1 focuses on literacy strategies and support. 30 minutes per day 4 times per week.

## **Grades 2-4:**

- Increase coaching focus on teacher feedback to students during conferences and student self tracking.
- Prioritizing interactive read aloud in classroom instruction.
- JC full time in KMS. (1/2 time previously)

## **Grades 5-8:**

- Continue implementation of RW and WW in grades 6, 7 and 8.

## **Grades 9-12:**

- Focus on Mid-tier subgroup
- Revisit Tier II intervention

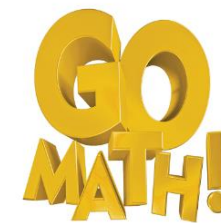

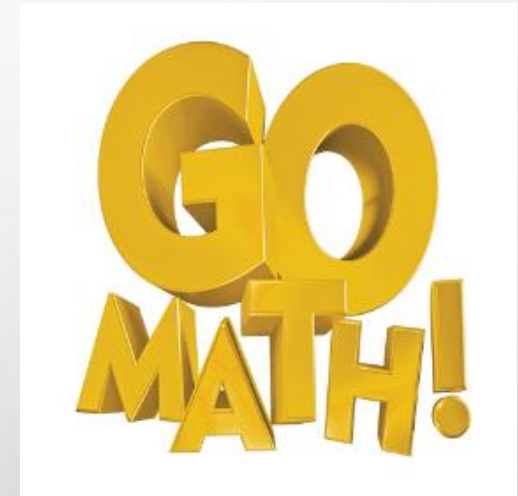
