Full Year Elective Options

AP Research (405) Required for students enrolled in any AP class. Time to receive additional instruction and homework.

Band 2-Brass/Woodwind (2210) Intermediate Band for brass and woodwind instruments. (Fee)

Band 2-Percussion (2213) Intermediate Band for percussion instruments. (Fee) (Tryouts)

Band 3-Advanced (2220) The top band for brass/woodwind. (Tryouts) (Fee)

Band 3-Advanced Percussion (2224) The top group for percussion (Fee) (Tryouts)

Chinese 1 (3310) Beginning class that will introduce the Mandarin Chinese language, culture, and history. (Fee)

Chinese 2 (3320) More emphasis on reading, writing, and speaking Chinese. Further exploration into Chinese culture. Prerequisite: Chinese 1 (Fee)

Chinese 3 (3330) Continue developing skills in Mandarin Chinese. Prerequisite: Chinese 1 & 2. (Fee)

Choir 2-Knight Lights (2307) An advanced choir for boys and girls. (Fee)

Choir 3-A Capella Choir (2310) Advanced a capella choir for boys & girls. (Tryouts) (Fee)

Choir 3-Knightingales (2310) Advanced show choir for girls with treble voices. (Tryouts) (Fee)

Dance Company (2606) Performing dance group will focus on choreography and technique. Previous dance experience recommended. Extra performances required. (Tryouts)

French 1 (3210) Beginning class that will introduce the French language, culture, and history. (Fee)

French 2 (3220) Extension from French 1. Prerequisite: French 1 (Fee)

French 3 (3230) Extension from French 2. Prerequisite: French 1 & 2 (Fee)

Orchestra 1 (2405) For beginning students who want to play a string instrument. Prerequisite: 6th grade orchestra class or private lessons strongly encouraged. (Fee)

Orchestra 2 (2406) Advanced orchestra. (Teacher permission required) (Fee)

Released Time 9 (850) L.D.S. Seminary

Spanish 1 (3110) Beginning class that will introduce the Spanish language, culture, and history. (Fee)

Spanish 2 (3120) Extension from Spanish 1. This is not a class for students who already speak Spanish. Prerequisite: Spanish 1 (Fee)

Spanish 3 (3130) Extension from Spanish 2. This is not a class for students who already speak Spanish. Prerequisite: Spanish 1 & 2 (Fee)

Yearbook (4365) Students will help produce the school yearbook. (Teacher permission required)

Semester or Year Elective Options

Knight Academy (400) Students will learn effective study habits. Helps students reach their academic goals.

Counseling Assistant (212) Help the counselors as needed. (Counselor permission required)

Library Media Assistant (215) Help in the library as needed. (Librarian permission required)

Office Assistant (210) Help in the office as needed. (Secretary permission required)

Teacher Assistant (211) Help a specific teacher as needed. (Teacher permission required)

Advanced Robotics (6700) Advanced understanding, building and operating VEX robots. Prerequisite: Beginning robotics. (Fee)

Beginning Robotics (6700) Understanding, building and operating VEX robots. (Fee)

Art Foundations 9 (2105) 9th grade basic art class covering a wide variety of art elements, mediums, and history. (Fee)

Drawing 1 (2110) An art class focused on black-and-white renderings. Prerequisite: any Art Foundations. (Fee)

Painting (2107) Students will further develop their art skills and knowledge through the use of various painting techniques. Prerequisite: any Art Foundations. (Fee)

Beginning Ukulele (2316) Introduces basic ukulele technique. Students must provide their own ukulele. May only be taken once. (Fee)

Child Development (7410) This course will help prepare students to work with children. (Fee)

Creative Coding 2 (7744) Will learn Python and Java Script. Will be a hands-on interactive class. Must have some background of coding. (Fee)

Creative Writing 1 (4335) Teaches the skills and strategies necessary to write creatively. May only be taken once.

Current Issues (4531) Students will explore local, national, and international issues. May be taken once per school year.

Dance 2 (2602) Intermediate level dance. May be taken once per school year.

Hip Hop/Social Dance (1042) Consists of social, cultural and world dances. Hip Hop and line dances as well as partner dances will be studied.

Engineering Tech 1 (7820) Explore the four disciplines of engineering, design processes and opportunities in engineering. Students will design and build projects. (Fee)

Engineering Tech 2 (7822) Continuation of Engineering Tech 1. Four new disciplines will be studied. Students will design and build projects. (Fee)

Exploring Computer Science (7760) Help students develop computational thinking practices of algorithm development, problem solving and programming.

Food and Nutrition I (7460) Explores healthy cooking and eating. (Fee)

Get Fit (1050) This course is for students who want to further advance their physical fitness through rigorous cardiovascular fitness and strength training, as well as flexibility, agility, and nutrition. (Fee)

PE Skills & Techniques 9 (1022) Participation in team and individual sports and games to help students improve and maintain their physical fitness. (Fee)

Hacking STEM 2 (6600) Students will participate in inquiry based science and engineering processes. Prerequisite: Hacking STEM 1.

Interior Design 1 (7445) Explore creativity in the area of interior design. Students will learn to apply elements and principles of design. (Fee)

Science Exploration-Zoology (6703) An introduction to the fundamental concepts of zoology. Dissection is required and counts as part of the grade. (Fee)

Sewing Construction & Textiles 1 (7433) An introduction to apparel design and sewing skills. (Fee)

Introduction to Stage Crew (2514) Introduction to the many aspects of behind-the-scenes theater. This is a CLASSROOM experience. Students WILL NOT participate in school productions or after school/evening dates.

Stage Crew/Productions (2514) Students will help run school plays and assemblies. Some night rehearsals will be required. (Teacher permission required)

Teaching as a Profession (7215) Students will learn about the role and characteristics of an effective educator.

Terrorism and the Post 9-11 World (4528) Concepts of terrorism, modern issues, problems and solutions will be discussed. Current events will drive discussions in class.

Musical Theatre 8-9 (2508) For those who want to be a part of the school musical production. Mandatory evening dates – May 2-13. (Fee)

Theatre 1 (2502) Students will learn to speak and perform in front of an audience.

Theatre 2 (2503) An advanced class for the serious drama student.

Prerequisite: Theatre 1. Mandatory evening dates Oct 30-Nov 9. (Fee)

Web Development 1 (7795) Gives students a project-based environment in the development of up-to-date concepts and skills used in the development of today's websites.

World Wars of the 20th Century (4615) Studying WWI, WWII and the Cold War and discuss why wars happen and the consequences.

Yoga/Aerobics (1060) Various endurance, stretching and stress management activities.

Jr. High Honors Courses Indicators for Student Success

Please thoughtfully consider the following criteria as you are making a decision about whether or not Jr. High honors level courses will provide the most appropriate learning environment. A student should:

1. Score as “Proficient” on the Sage Test in a specific subject area before considering enrolling in an Honors level course in that subject area.
2. Consistently earn an “**A**” or “**B**” (or a “**3**” for 6th graders) for the subject in which they desire to take an Honors course.
3. Have a **high level of interest** and **strong desire to be challenged** in the subject in which they would like to take an Honors course.
4. Consistently exhibit most of the following characteristics:

Learning/Intellectual Characteristics:

- Enjoys tasks that are more challenging than average
- Has a ready grasp of underlying principles and can quickly make valid generalization about events, people and things
- Tries to understand complicated material by separating it into its respective parts; reasons things out
- Analyzes problems and considers alternatives
- Enjoys complex concepts and processes

Motivational/Affective Characteristics:

- Becomes absorbed and truly involved in certain topics or problems
- Needs little external motivation to follow through in work completion
- Often requires little direction from teachers
- Is highly self-motivated and persistent
- Has high expectations of self and others

When deciding whether or not to enroll a student in a particular subject area honors course, please consider the following subject specific characteristics:

Math/Science:

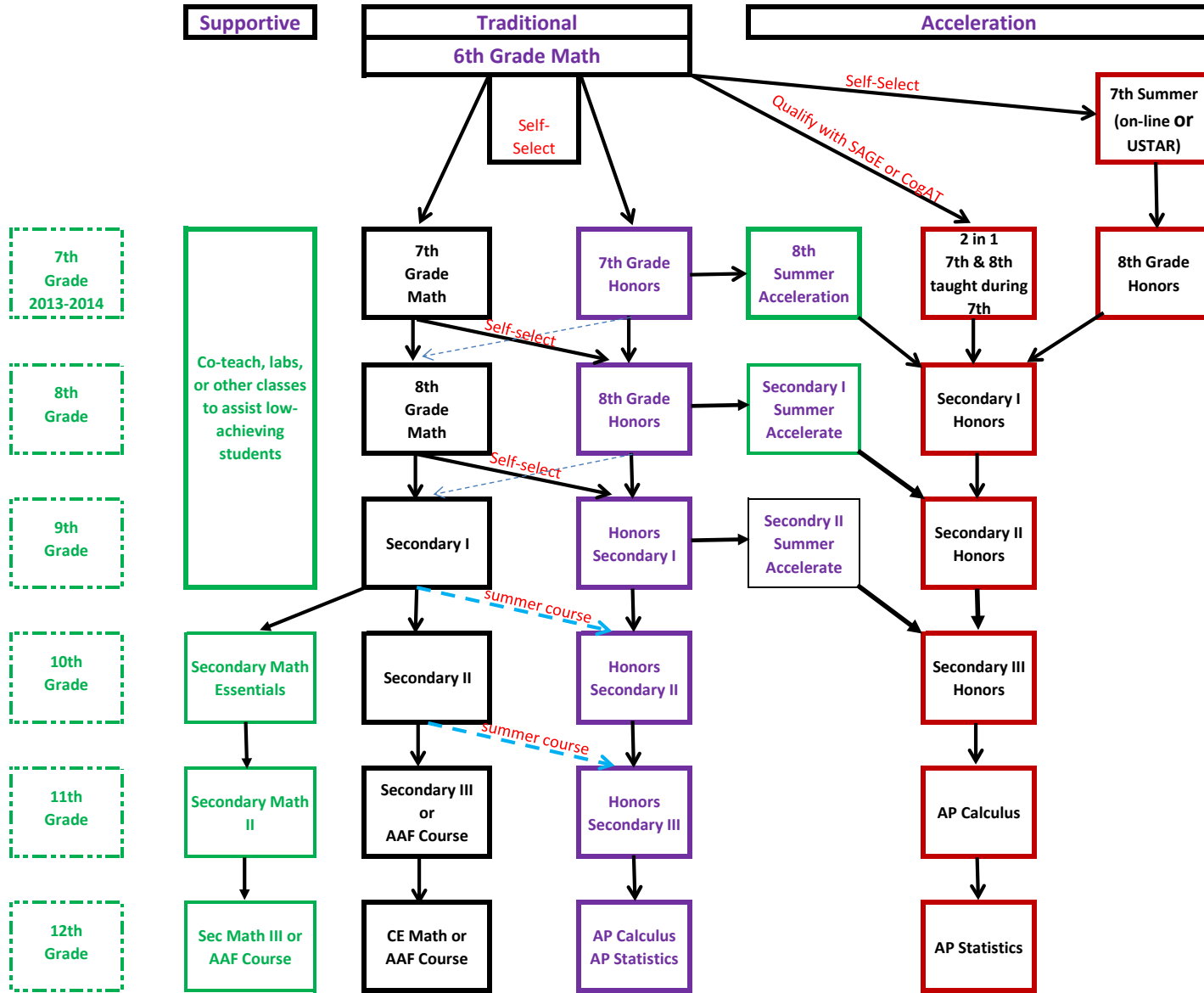
- Is interested in numerical analysis
- Has a good memory for storing main features of problem and solutions
- Reasons effectively and efficiently
- Organizes data and experiments to discover patterns or relationships
- Is flexible in solving problems

Social Studies/Language Arts:

- Has advanced vocabulary for age or grade level
- Reads a great deal; does not avoid difficult material
- Enjoys language/verbal or written communication; has advanced communication skills
- Organizes ideas and sequences in preparation for speaking and writing
- Likes study and research in areas of interest
