

BOARD MEETING RECAP



Next Superintendent Announced At its meeting on Monday, February 22, 2021, the Shawnee Mission School District (SMSD) Board of Education announced the selection of Dr. Michelle Hubbard

as the next district superintendent. Currently, Dr. Hubbard serves as Deputy Superintendent.

Board President Heather Ousley issued the following statement on behalf of the Board:

"The Board of Education is pleased to confirm Dr. Michelle Hubbard as our District's next Superintendent. Dr. Hubbard has played an integral role in the creation and implementation of our community's Strategic Plan, and her knowledge and expertise as we execute the bond reaffirms the District's deep desire to keep fidelity with our five-year goals. Dr. Hubbard's leadership, strength, and commitment to children will serve the Shawnee Mission School District well in the years to come."

Learning Mode Update – Several individuals provided a Learning Mode update and details about the district's ongoing COVID-19 mitigation efforts. This update included the following target dates:

- Secondary students are scheduled to return to full in-person learning on March 22, 2021 (Students who chose the remote learning model in August will remain remote)
- Outdoor facilities rentals start March 1, 2021
- Indoor facilities rentals start March 22, 2021

The following presentations were made as a part of this update:

Elizabeth Holzschuh, director of epidemiology for the Johnson County Department of Health and Environment, provided an update on national guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), scientific studies, and county guidance.

Shelby Rebeck, director of health services, provided an update on mitigation measures and contact tracing in the district and plans for when secondary students return to full in-person learning.

Dr. Christy Ziegler, chief of student services, provided an update on testing and vaccination, sanitization and cleaning. She shared that vaccination rates for staff are being completed at a rate much higher than previously expected.

Dr. Rick Atha, deputy superintendent, provided an update on air quality and projected costs of mitigating COVID-19 from March 2021 to June 2022.

Dr. Michelle Hubbard, deputy superintendent, shared details about the updating of the district's middle and high school mitigation plan design for full in-person classes. She introduced Dr. Joe Gilhaus, director of secondary services, Dr. Jeremy Higgins, principal at Shawnee Mission North, and Blake Revelle, principal at Indian Hills Middle School, who shared details about mitigation plans at their respective school levels.

It was mentioned several times during the presentation that while schools will do everything possible to ensure social distancing, three feet of social distancing cannot be guaranteed at all times in this model.

Bond Update Dr. Rick Atha, deputy superintendent, provided a brief overview of bond-related items. His overview focused on items contained in the Bond consent agenda, approved by the board later in the meeting.

He also shared timeline highlights for the following elementary schools:

- John Diemer and Westwood View are scheduled for construction in the summer of 2021, with a planned completion in December of 2022.
- Pawnee is planned for on-site construction beginning in the fall of 2021, with an estimated completion date of June 2023.
- Tomahawk and Rushton are scheduled for construction to begin in January 2023, and open in August of 2024.

The timeline is subject to change based upon circumstances, but Dr. Atha said staff are hopeful the district can stay within the timeline unless something unforeseen takes place. Approval of Administrator Contracts The board approved the extension of administrator contracts. This approval did not include any components related to salary.
