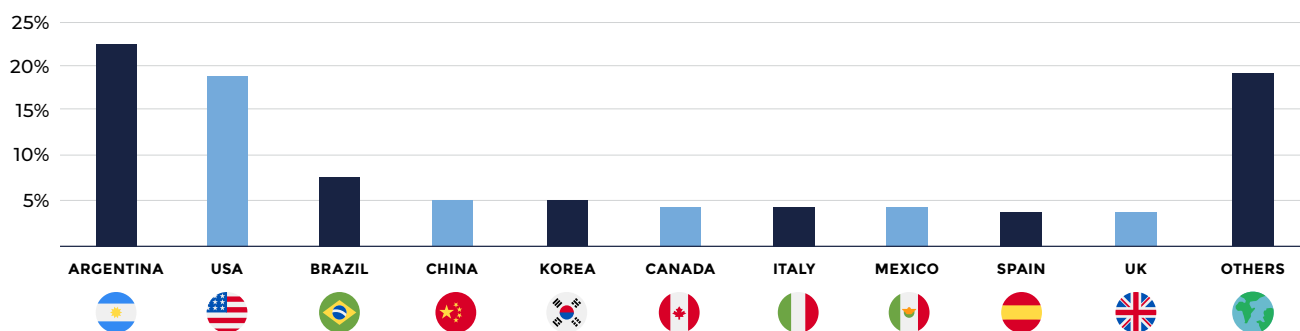

THE AEL HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA

The Lincoln High School Diploma is earned by all students who have successfully completed their four years of high school. Credit is given for achievements from Lincoln and any other schools attended.

With NEASC accreditation, the Lincoln Diploma is equivalent to a high school diploma in the USA, as well as a valid leaving certification in many other countries around the world.

THE IB DIPLOMA

All Lincoln students in Grades 11 and 12 are encouraged to pursue the full IB Diploma. This multidisciplinary programme requires the study of the humanities, at least two languages, science, mathematics and the arts. It also entails an extended essay, service and action element, and study of the theory of knowledge.

Upon successful completion of the programme and the IB exams, students receive the IB Diploma, recognized around the globe as a rigorous university preparatory qualification.

THE ARGENTINE DIPLOMA

The Bilingual Baccalaureate (Bachillerato Bilingüe) is the Argentine Ministry recognized secondary school credential (Secundaria) completed by all Lincoln students (grades 10-12). All students must be enrolled in this program which leads to an Argentine diploma. The current specialization offered at Lincoln is Art and Literature (Orientación Arte-Literatura).

This program enables students to enter universities in Argentina and other Mercosur countries.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must earn 25 credits to graduate. Each year-long course is worth one credit. A credit is obtained by receiving an overall grade of D- or above.

There are 57 students in the current senior class, and successful candidates will graduate on June, 12th, 2021. Of those, 41 are enrolled in the full IB Diploma Programme. Over the last five years, 83% of Lincoln graduates matriculate abroad, while 17% study in Argentina. A few graduates embark on a gap year for further study, employment, internships or military service
