### **Day 1**:

Today we are going to start a new writing unit. We are going to learn about and practice writing Opinion Paragraphs.

An opinion is what you think or how you feel about a topic. An opinion is not a fact. An opinion does not have to be proven.

Opinion paragraphs are a type of persuasive writing. Persuasive means you want to try to convince a friend to think like you do. For example, if you think chocolate ice cream is the best, you can write an opinion paper to convince readers that chocolate ice cream is the best.

In an opinion paragraph, the writer tells his opinion and then tells **why** he has that opinion.

Opinion paragraphs follow this simple structure:

- Opinion statement
- Reason 1
- Example
- Reason 2
- Example
- Opinion restated

You can think of it like an Oreo cookie to help you remember how an opinion paragraph is organized!

**O** is for **opinion**: state your opinion

**R** is for **reason**: Give 1-3 reasons why you think/feel that way

**E** is for **example**: provide evidence to support each reason

O is for opinion: restate your opinion, but use different words this time!

Here is an example paragraph!

Most people I know think that cookies are yummy. Do you have a favorite cookie? I think that Oreo cookies are the best! (opinion statement) First of all, I love the sweet, creamy frosting in the middle (reason). Sometimes I take the cookie apart and eat the frosting first! (example). Secondly, the two chocolate wafers on the outside are the perfect amount of crunchy (reason). They are easy to separate with a quick twist and they don't get too soggy when dipped in a glass of milk (example). Lastly, there are lots of different kinds of Oreos to choose from, depending on your mood (reason). You can choose from double stuffed, thin style, mint filling, lemon filling, strawberry filling and much more! (example). As you can see, there is no better cookie than an Oreo cookie. 

I hope you are enjoying learning how to write an opinion paragraph this week. Today we will learn more about reasons and examples. You will be able to practice sorting *Reasons and Examples*.

When we state an opinion about how we feel about something, like, "I think reading is the best subject." it is also important to support that opinion with reasons **WHY** we think that way.

For example:

Opinion Statement	I think reading is the best subject. This is why.
Reason 1	First, when you read, you get to meet new characters.

Then, it will make your writing even better if you give an example of your reason. For example:






