Opinion Writing Lesson 8 Tuesday 5/26 Revising Your Conclusion

Learning Target: I can watch the video and/or read the directions and example essay to learn about the task for this week.

Directions: This week you will be revising your conclusion to make it even stronger. To learn how to do this, watch this video: https://youtu.be/G6GYjdm5FwU

If you are not able to watch the video, here is what it says:

Today we are going to be working on your conclusion. A conclusion has three things.

- 1. Transition words or phrases such as "in conclusion," or "as you can see," are two examples. Can you think of any others that would work, too?
- 2. A Call to Action: This part tells the reader what you need them to do.
- 3. Restate your opinion: Remind the reader again what your opinion is.

Now, fill out your anchor chart. Then go back to your draft to include these three parts.

(Keep in mind, you are not actually DOING these things today-just reading about them or watching the video to learn what your job is this week.)
