Annual Title I Meeting

- Utilizing the PBiS conduct calendars and weekly homework calendars, and/or Remind 101 and Class Dojo Apps to provide



daily communication between parent and teacher regarding expectations and progress.

- Continually updating the CP website with relevant and timely information including staff information, email addresses and websites, helpful educational web links, school happenings, contact information, calendars, curriculum, lunch menus, etc.
- Sending monthly calendars home Hosting annual open house events Facilitating Pre-kindergarten and Kindergarten orientation
