Your School Nurse Makes a Difference to Students, Parents, School Staff, and the Community

The school nurse is an experienced health professional who is licensed to practice nursing in the State of Maryland and uphold codes of ethics and professional standards. She belongs to professional organizations, pursues further education, and keeps informed in health issues, trends, and information.

The school nurse uses her skill as ...

- ... an EDUCATOR to teach and advise students and staff about health, nutrition, and hygiene information.
- ... a MANAGER of school and community health and safety programs.
- ... an ADVISOR on health matters for students, parents and staff.
- ... a CARE PROVIDER to set up procedures for giving first aid, to test students' hearing and vision, and to give emergency and prescribed health services.

School Nurses:

- Provide first aid and limited acute care;
- ✓ Administer medication;
- Work toward prevention and control of communicable diseases;
- √ Case manage high-risk students;
- Assist students with special health needs and disabilities;
- √ Conduct hearing and vision screenings, and refer students who need additional services:
- √ Participate in school and interagency committees;
- ✓ Provide health presentations to students and staff.
