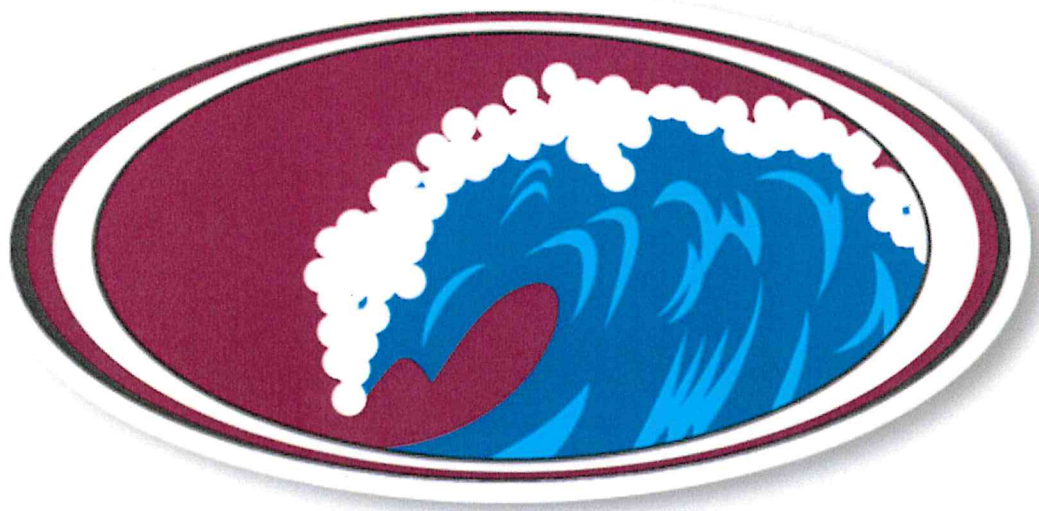
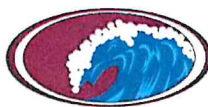

Core Academic Placement Guidelines

Welcome Incoming Freshman Families! Laguna Beach High School is very excited to welcome you to our school, and we look forward to sharing all of the opportunities we provide. This letter explains the core academic course placement guidelines for course selection. It is our goal to ensure that your student is placed in the most supportive learning environment so they may achieve the highest level of success.

English

All freshman students can register for English 9 or English 9 Honors. For honors placement, a student must have demonstrated a strong English foundation with performance, grades, and teacher recommendation.

English 9 Honors ...

- possesses a workload and rigor that provides key foundational preparation for and is meant to establish norms consistent with English 10 Honors, AP English Literature, and AP English Language. Students planning on taking AP English classes in their junior and/or senior years should take English 9 Honors.
- teaches the fundamentals of grammar, literary analysis, and writing for a variety of purposes—analysis, argument, and narration.
- moves at a faster pace.
- requires an average of 20-30 minutes of homework per night. The majority of homework is reading.

Math and Science Success

Placement into freshman mathematics should be based on past performance and grades, assessment data, as well as teacher recommendation. We highly recommend that all students have a strong Algebra foundation as it is the base for future math courses. Data shows that students who take Algebra in 8th grade that do not have a strong foundation, perform average and below average in mathematics throughout high school. Often, this discourages students from moving forward with their math sequence, and as a result, they only take a minimum of three years of math at the high school level. Colleges and universities are looking for students to have four strong years of mathematics upon college entry.

Freshmen Placement Recommendations:

- Algebra I or Geometry (earned a grade of B or higher in Algebra I)
- Accelerated Geometry is recommended for students who earned a grade of A in both semesters of Algebra I along with a strong assessment performance.
- Algebra II is recommended for students who earned a grade of A or B in Geometry along with a strong assessment performance.
- Algebra II Honors is for students who earn a grade of B or better in both semesters of Geometry and a grade of A in both semesters of Algebra I.

Science: Integrated Science I

Note: Honors placement will be determined by the readiness test in addition to the above criteria. If you have a question regarding your student's core academic placement, please speak to your student's current academic teacher.

Advanced Placement and Honors Courses

Laguna Beach High School is committed to providing an environment in which all students have equal access to classes, including Honors (H) and Advanced Placement (AP) classes. All classes are open to students who have successfully completed the recommended preparation, made an informed decision, and understand the course expectations.

We encourage all families to strongly consider the course descriptions, expected homework requirements, extracurricular obligations, and recommended preparation before enrolling in Honors and AP courses.

The content of AP courses is determined by the College Board. Honors courses are locally designed to prepare students for the rigor of AP courses and exams. Students should consider projects and exams may overlap and can result in workload fluctuations.

Honors and AP courses are designed to be rigorous and demanding. It is expected that you understand the intensity of these courses and commit to the necessary work to ensure success.

LBHS faculty and administration expect once a student is enrolled in an Honors or AP course, they will remain in that course for the duration of the school year; however, if a student chooses to drop an Honors or AP course, it must be done within the drop-date window. The student's current grade will transfer as is to a new class. Please refer to the LBHS Student Handbook and/or the school website for specific drop dates.

Summer reading and/or work may be required for some Honors or AP courses. Please check the high school website homepage (Academics tab, Summer Assignments tab) in early June for specific class requirements (books, packets, etc.).

If your class requires a textbook or summer reading book you must check them out through the LBHS Library. The LBHS Library will be closed from July 1 - July 31, 2025, and will re-open on August 1, 2025.

Athletics/Sports

Sports can be used to fulfill the LBHS requirement of 20 credits of PE

- Tryouts are required for all sports teams.
- If a student makes a team, their counselor will add the sport to their schedule once coaches submit rosters in the fall/winter/spring.
- Fall and Winter sports are listed on fall schedules and transcripts, spring sports are listed on spring schedules and transcripts.
- All 9th and 10th grade students must enroll in PE or an after-school sport.
- If a student drops or is cut from the after-school sport prior to earning 20 credits, the student must take PE to fulfill the graduation requirement.
- Students who quit or are removed from a sport are subject to a withdraw/fail "W/F." See Student Handbook.
- To participate in try-outs and sports during the school year, a Breakers Athletics Online Packet **MUST** be completed online at www.AthleticClearance.com. No exceptions.
