Employee Profile:

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Weekly lesson planning

- Assessment, documentation, and reporting of each student's academic and behavioral progress
- Integration of social skills into the real-life circumstances that occur each day
- Provide ongoing communication with parents
- Assist support staff in the implementation of their duties
- Participation in weekly staff meetings, staff trainings, and in-service
- Maintaining current CPR, First Aid, and AED certifications as provided by STCA
- Assure safety and supervision of assigned students, implementing behavior modifications and accommodations as outlined by administration
- Adherence to STCA policies as outlined in the student handbook, the staff handbook, and the employee's contract
- Possible extra duties as assigned: Including but not limited to Christmas Program, Spring Show, Field Day, Early/After Care

Physical and Mental Requirements and Work Environment Conditions:

- Talking – expressing ideas by means of the spoken word to convey instructions to students/parents and co- workers accurately, loudly, or quickly
- Hearing – ability to perceive sounds at normal speaking levels with or without correction and to receive detailed information through oral communication
- Standing and walking for sustained periods of time – moving about on foot for monitoring students in the classroom
- Stooping, crouching, and kneeling – ability to assist small children with various needs
- Climbing, reaching, pushing, pulling and lifting
- Repetitive motion of the arms, wrists, hands and fingers
- Close visual acuity required for viewing a computer monitor, preparing and analyzing data and figures
