8.2 (D/A) GATE PROGRAMS – Boyle (06-07 G & O Component V-IV)

•Western Placer Unified School district receives Gifted and Talented Program (GATE) categorical monies from the state each year. We are completing our second year of a two-year funding cycle. We need to reapply for GATE funding.

The GATE Program Application process has changed, with a new requirement to consider data on the representation of subgroups in our GATE population; to track GATE student achievement and success; and to complete a program assessment and set goals in eight required areas.

The enclosed GATE Program Application fulfills those requirements and reflects parental and staff input on expanding our GATE program offerings.

Mary discussed the GATE funding process and reviewed Gate program evaluation in the academic process. She is currently looking at expanding elementary level to 2 classes, depending on the number of students in GATE. Looking at after school enrichment courses including band class after school for elementary and middle school programs for next year. Also bringing Odyssey of the Minds, start at grade 3 and goes to through high school. The district is looking at hiring coordinators for the program. She has already reviewed the program design, needs, goals, curriculum and instruction, and professional development. A motion by Mr. Carras, seconded by Mrs.

8.5 (D/A) APPROVAL OF CHANGE ORDER NO. 10 FOR TWELVE BRIDGES MIDDLE SCHOOL - Allen (06-07 G & O Component V-IV)

•Change Order No. 10 represents a \$45,000 credit the District is receiving in lieu of the contractor replacing a significant number of area drains with the product originally specified in the contract documents. The subcontractor for EDGE mistakenly installed a similar product that had been used on other WPUSD projects and has offered a \$45,000 credit. Please note the original credit offer was under \$20,000. Prudent negotiations resulted in a significantly higher credit than originally proposed. A copy of the Change Order Request is attached for your review.

RESOLUTION 06/07.32 FOR PG& E EASEMENT TO PROVIDE FOR EXTENSION OF UTILITY SERVICES TO 691 N STREET, LINCOLN, CALIFORNIA – Allen (06-07 G & O Component V-IV)

•Mr. Hai H. Nguyen is the owner of the property located at 691 N Street (lot 16). The District owns the adjacent two parcels (lots 14 and 15). The two lots are part of the Zebra Housing Program. Mr. Nguyen is requesting an easement from the District in order to allow PG& E to extend existing service to his lot. Originally Mr. Nguyen was seeking an overhead extension of a power line to serve his property. Staff believed that an aerial encroachment would not be in the best interests of the future owners of lots 14 and 15. Mr. Nguyen has revised his original request and is now seeking an underground easement be granted to PG& E to allow for utility extension to his property. As depicted on the enclosed map, the underground encroachment would have minimal negative effect on the two lots owned by the District.

A motion by Mr. Haley, seconded by McLeod, and passed by unanimous roll call vote to approve resolution 06/07.32 for PG & E easement to provide for extension of utility services to 691 N Street, Lincoln, California.

8.7 (D/A) NOTICE OF COMPLETION FOR TWELVE BRIDGES MIDDLE SCHOOL INCREMENTS 1 AND 2 – Allen (06-07 G

& O Component V-IV)

•The Western Placer Unified School District entered into contract with NTD-EDGE Design Builders, Inc. on March 25, 2004. Work was substantially complete to the satisfaction of Cathy Allen, Director of Site Development by May 25, 2007. Several items are being excluded from the Notice of Completion due to pending DSA approvals and replacement of the infield mix on both softball fields in the park. Economic & Planning Systems, Inc., (EPS) has assisted the Western Placer Unified School District (District) in forming the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Districts (CFDs) and has provided technical support in analyzing funding capacities of the CFDs for the purposes of funding new school facilities. The District has prepared and maintained the database of all parcels in all CFDs since inception, tracked development approvals for all parcels in the CFDs, prepared the annual special tax levy for the Placer County (County) Auditor-Controller, and responded to public inquiries regarding the special tax.

The District has requested EPS provide a proposal and budget for performing the tasks currently performed by the District. For Fiscal Year (FY) 2007-08, there would be "onetime" costs associated with converting the District's CFD data to EPS's data systems. Thereafter, EPS would maintain a parcel database and track development approvals in the CFDs on an ongoing basis to update parcel data on the database.

SCOPE OF WORK

EPS proposes a series of tasks that will lead to the implementation of a Mello-Roos CFD.

TASK 1: FY 2007-08 CFD ADMINISTRATION

EPS will maintain the CFD parcel database and will respond to public inquiries.

Task 1.1: Review Records

EPS will review records of the City of Lincoln (City) and the County to maintain and update a list of taxable parcels in the CFD. The list will contain Assessor's Parcel

BERKELEY

Numbers, development status, taxable status, FY in which parcel was first taxed as a "developed" parcel, and any other related data required to develop the annual special tax levy. The District will periodically provide EPS with copies of building permit applications submitted to the District for residential development. EPS will record the building permit information in the database. After each database update of new residential development, EPS will provide an electronic copy of the database to the District.

Task 1.2: Prepare List

EPS will prepare a list of the special tax levy for delivery to the County Auditor-Controller and will work with the District to prepare and deliver all accompanying documentation of the special tax levy.

TASK 2: FY 2007–08 TECHNICAL SUPPORT

EPS will prepare an analysis in support of the annual continuing disclosure and other analyses. This task also will include any other analysis of funding strategies for school facilities as directed by the District.

TASK 3: ONE-TIME SET UP COSTS FOR DATA

EPS will work with the District to convert data to EPS's systems. It may be prudent for EPS to use this opportunity to audit the tax records of the District to make sure that the FYs in which parcels were first taxed as "developed" are accurately accounted for. The tax is levied at the developed rate for 30 years for CFD No. 1 and 40 years for CFD No. 2. The audit will assure the District receives all special tax revenue required to cover debt service in all years in which CFD bonds are outstanding.

The total estimated budget to complete this work is \$16,000 as detailed below:

STANDARD PROVISIONS FOR STATE CONTRACTS

- 1. The Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend and save harmless the State, its officers, agents and employees from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any and all contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, laborers, and any other person, firm or corporation furnishing or supplying work services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of this Agreement, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by Contractor in the performance of this Agreement.
- 2. Contractor, and the agents and employees of Contractor, in the performance of this Agreement, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees or agents of the State.
- 3. The State may terminate this Agreement and be relieved of any payments should the Contractor fail to perform the requirements of this Agreement at the time and in the manner herein provided. In the event of such termination the State may proceed with the work in any manner deemed proper by the State. All costs to the State shall be deducted from any sum due the Contractor under this Agreement and the balance, if any, shall be paid to the Contractor upon demand.
- 4. This Agreement is not assignable by the Contractor, either in whole or in part, without the consent of the State in the form of a formal written amendment.
- 5. Time is of the essence in this Agreement.
- 6. No amendment or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing, signed by the parties and approved as required. No oral understanding or Agreement not incorporated in the Agreement is binding on any of the parties.
- 7. The consideration to be paid Contractor, as provided herein, shall be in compensation for all of Contractor's expenses incurred in the performance hereof, including travel, per diem, and taxes, unless otherwise expressly so provided.
- 8. Contractors entering into a contract funded wholly or in part with funds from the United States Government agree to amendments in funding to reflect any reductions in funds if the Congress does not appropriate sufficient funds. In addition, the contract is subject to any restrictions, limitations or enactments of congress which affect the provisions, terms or funding of this agreement in any manner. INTERDISTRICT ATTENDANCE

The Superintendent or designee may approve interdistrict attendance agreements for the following reasons:

- 1. To meet the child care needs of the student when options within the district of residency is not available. If an option within the district is available, only cases of hardship may be granted. (Education Code 46601.5)
 - Once a permit has been issued based on childcare needs, a student in grades K-7 may not be required to reapply for an interdistrict transfer as long as the student continues to receive a childcare in the district. (Education Code 46601.5)
- 2. To meet a child's special mental or physical health needs, as certified by a physician, and school psychologist or other appropriate school personnel with approval from the sending district.

(cf. 6159 - Individualized Education Program)

- 3. When the student has a sibling(s) attending school in a receiving district, to avoid splitting the family's attendance unless the student in the receiving district is attending based on an interdistrict agreement.
- 4. To allow a student to complete a school year when his/her parents/guardians have moved out of the district during that year.
- 5. To let eighth grade students attend the same school they attended as seventh grade students, even if their families moved out of the district during their seventh grade year.
- 6. To let seniors attend the same school they attended as juniors, even if their families moved out of the district during the junior year.
- 7. When the parent/guardian provides written evidence, that the family will be moving to the receiving district in the immediate future and would like the student to start the year in that district.
- 8. When recommended by the School Attendance Review Board or by county child welfare, probation or social service agency staff in documented cases of serious home or community problems, which make it inadvisable for the student to attend the school of residence.
- 9. To let seventh through eleventh grade students attend their prior school for the 2005-06 and 2006-07 school years. After the 2006-07 school year, students will be expected to attend Western Placer Unified School District.

9. Other significant reasons not included on the Interdistrict Request Application

INTERDISTRICT ATTENDANCE (continued)

Interdistrict attendance agreements or applications shall not be required for students enrolling in a regional occupational center or program. (Education Code 52317)

The Superintendent or designee may deny initial requests for interdistrict attendance agreements if the school's facilities are overcrowded at the relevant grade level and based on other considerations that are not arbitrary. However, once a student is admitted based on child care needs, his/her continued attendance may not be denied because of overcrowding.

The Superintendent or designee shall notify parents/guardians of a student who is denied interdistrict attendance regarding the process for appeal to the County Board of Education as specified in Education Code 46601.

(cf. 5145.6 – Parental Notifications)

Students who are under consideration for expulsion or who have been expelled may not appeal interdistrict attendance denials or decisions while expulsion proceedings are pending, or during the term of the expulsion. (Education Code 46601)

(cf. 5119 – Students Expelled from Other Districts) (cf. 5114.1 – Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process)

Transportation

The Superintendent or designee may authorize transportation for students living outside the attendance area to and from designated bus stops within the attendance area if space is available based on the student fee schedule.
