

Risk assessment for reopening March 8th 2021



This risk assessment documents the risk control measures that will be in place ahead of opening to all students on their return to school from March 8th 2021.

It is based on the comprehensive risk assessment completed for th return to school in September 2020, following the first major lockdown and also amendments made at the point of the second lockdwown when schools remained open.

The key changes for this lockdown are:

- Face coverings advised to be worn at all points when within the buildiing
- Mass testing of students on return and twice-weekly home testing of staff and students thereafter

Any additions from the previous risk assessment are shown in bold

If a symptomatic person comes into school, they will be sent home immediately or isolated until they can be picked up. The room for isolation will be the hallway area next to the site team office.999 will be called if they are seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk. The home testing kits available in school will be given to parents/carers collecting symptomatic children, and to staff who've developed symptoms at school, if providing one will increase the likelihood of them getting tested. If not, parents will be told to log onto booking a Covid Test at the earliest opportunity. Parents and staff to inform school immediately of test results Parent informed pupil can return to school if test result is negative (email confirmation required). If positive, the family will have to self-isolate for 10 days. Visitors to the site, such as contractors, will have guidance on physical distancing and hygiene explained to them on or before arrival. Visits will happen outside of school hours wherever possible.
