Greenwich Scholarship Association

GSA is a non-profit organization that awards *need-based scholarships* from local sponsor organizations and families to students who reside in Greenwich or attend Greenwich High School who demonstrated financial need. Awards for qualified applicants range from \$500 to multiple combined awards up to \$10,000 and are paid directly to the college or university for tuition, room, board and mandatory fees. **DEMONSTRATED**

FINANCIAL NEED IS A PREREQUISITE FOR CONSIDERATION OF ANY SCHOLARSHIP THROUGH

GSA. Financial need means student's combined financial resources (including income and savings) together with their financial package (grants, scholarships, work study, and subsidized loans) from their chosen school will not cover the cost of their college or university. The online application will be available November 15, 2020 and the deadline for submission of ALL material is March 10, 2021(no exceptions will be made to this deadline). Application to GSA includes: submission of the online application, as well as submission of the Student Aid **Report (SAR)** which is generated when the FAFSA is completed. Applicants who do not meet the financial criteria will be notified in early April. The tentative date for interviews is April 30, 2021 which is required for all applicants (assuming we are able to meet in person by then). Students also MUST submit financial aid packages from their intended school before matching with scholarship funds can be completed. Joe Lieberman Connecticut Scholarship Program

Up to five \$1,500 renewable scholarships for each year of full-time study at any accredited two-year or four-year college, university or vocational-technical school. Students must be high school seniors who reside and attend school in Connecticut, or be home schooled in Connecticut. Minimum GPA of 3.5, demonstrated leadership potential and record of community service also required. <u>First County Bank Foundation Richard E. Taber Citizenship</u> <u>Award</u>

Three \$5,000 scholarships to high school seniors who hold a "B" average or higher. Award candidates must consistently demonstrate at home, school and in the community characteristics of Citizenship, Leadership, Academics, Service and Sportsmanship (CLASS). French-Candian Genealogical Society of Connecticut, Inc. Scholarship

The Milton Fisher Scholarship

A four-year renewable scholarship open to exceptionally innovative and creative high school juniors and seniors, and first-time college freshman. Award: \$4,000 - \$20,000.

Eligible applicants must satisfy these two conditions:

- 1. Applicant must be (a) a high school junior, or (b) a high school senior, or (c) any person entering an undergraduate degree program* in the fall after the application deadline or the following spring, or (d) a student in the first year of an undergraduate degree program*.
- 2. Applicant must be (a) a Connecticut or New York City metropolitan area resident planning to attend or attending an institution of higher education anywhere in the United States, or (b) a resident of any part of the U.S. planning to attend or attending an institution of higher education in CT or NYC. Glenn Moon Scholarship/Association of Retired Teachers of Connecticut (ARTC)

2021 graduates of secondary schools in Connecticut are eligible IF they are committed to pursuing a career in the field of education. Scholarships to be awarded are one four-year scholarship of \$2000 for 4 years (The winner must maintain college grades in the upper bracket and must continue teacher preparation training.) PLUS one 1-year scholarship of \$1500. Students must use the 2021 online application and directions for mailing found on the Association of Retired Teachers of Connecticut website.
