4k curriculum focuses on play, early literacy, math and social skills.

4k - Online - What did it look like?

- ▶ 4 days a week of online instruction
 - Large group live meeting with class
 - Recorded lessons on Seesaw
 - ► 1 small group live meeting per week
 - All 4K students were provided same activities
- Supply pick up two times per month
- ► All students have access to a school issued iPad

4k - Blended - What did it look like?

- 2 days a week of In-School instruction for 2.5 Hours
 - Morning/Afternoon Meeting
 - Story and Project
 - Letter Practice/Academic Activity
 - Free Choice from individual bins
 - Students were provided a meal this year
 - 2 days a week of Online Review Instruction
 - Story and Activity
 - Story and Activity
 - 1 Teacher and 1 Educational Assistant in classroom

4k - Traditional - What did it look like?

- 4 days of In-School Instruction for 3 hours
 - Morning/Afternoon Meeting
 - Story and Project
 - Letter Practice/Small group academic activity
 - Center Time Exploration Dramatic Play, Blocks,
 Manipulatives, Writing/Art, Sensory Play
 - Snack
 - Outside Play
 - 1 Teacher and 1 Educational Assistant in classroom

STUDENT IMMUNIZATION LAW AGE/GRADE REQUIREMENTS

The following are the minimum required immunizations for each age/grade level according to the Wisconsin Student Immunization Law. Additional immunizations may be recommended for your child depending on his/her age. Please contact your doctor or local health department to determine if your child needs additional immunizations.



Eligible for Transportation

Student transportation services, while operating under the contract between the District and bus company and in compliance with all Federal, State and local laws, regulations and policies, has the primary purpose of providing safe, efficient and economical conveyance from home to school and home for those eligible students. Those students deemed eligible are as follows:

- Students living **TWO OR MORE MILES** from the nearest school of attendance.
- Students with special educational needs as defined in an I.E.P.
 Students deemed to live in an area of unusual hazard.

Riding the Bus

- Masks must be worn by all students while on the bus.
- During the Morning and Afternoon Route students will be picked up at squap stops unless your address is considered a doorstop.
- Students should be waiting outside for the bus FIVE minutes prior to PICK.
 UP TIME.
- Midday Pick Ups and Drops off will be door to door.

Riding the Bus

- Students in grades pre-K through 2 will not be dropped off at a bus stop unless at least one adult caretaker or responsible sibling of at least 11 years of age, is visible to the bus driver. (School Board Policy No. 631).
- If no one is outside to greet the student, the route will continue as to not delay other students from getting home, and a parent/guardian will be contacted. If they can not be reached, they will be returned to the school. Safe place HOME, SCHOOL AND BUS.
 - Drop off times are estimates and can vary depending on the students riding the bus. Please be prepared to meet your students 5 minutes before their scheduled drop off time.

First Day of School

- The first day of school is exciting and scary at the same time.
- We know the first day pictures and getting on the bus are moments every parent wants to capture. However, please remember the bus is on a time schedule.

Tips:

- Take pictures before the bus arrives.
- Hugs and kisses just before the bus pulls up.
- Take the final picture as they are getting on the bus.


