BOYS SWIM EARNS ADDITIONAL STATE CUTS; BOYS BASKETBALL GETS WIN OVER FGR

IRISH HAVE STRONG SHOWING AT OAKLAND COUNTY

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Swim team competed in the Oakland County meet on Saturday. This meet includes all Oakland County high school teams, regardless of size or class. Despite being a small division three team the Irish swimmers had an outstanding meet, competing well against the bigger programs in the county and securing multiple MHSAA state cut qualifying times. The meet got off to a good start with Senior Griffin Gushman posting a fifth place finish in the 200 Free at 1:46.18 and Junior Anthony Dupuis achieving a state cut qualifying time in the same race. Paul Vigneau also posted a personal best time in the 200 Free. Freshman Pierce Marchese dropped almost eight seconds in the 200 IM, placing 19th to achieve his first state cut. Senior Lars Boehme followed with a 19th place in the 50 Free to also get a state cut. Gushman swam a 4:45.59 to finish third in the 500 Free, just 1.5 seconds out of first place. In the next individual event, Dupuis and Marchese collected their second state cuts in the 100 Backstroke. Notre Dame fielded two relay teams, both of which qualified for the state meet, with the team of Dupuis, Vigneau, Boehme and Gushman placing 11th in the 200 Free Relay and the team of Dupuis, Marchese, Boehme and Gushman placing 12th in the 400 Free Relay. In total, the Irish secured an incredible seven state cut in a meet that ranks as one of the top Oakland County performances in Notre Dame Boys Swimming history.

NOTRE DAME GETS HOME WIN OVER FGR

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Basketball team bounced back with a 59-54 home victory over rival Father Gabriel Richard. The Irish never trailed and had a 26-23 lead at halftime. Notre Dame built on that lead with a 12-9 in third quarter advantage to hold on to the six point win. Junior Jon Risi had a fantastic performance on both offense and defense with 17 points, five rebounds and five steals. Junior Jack Olis contributed 15 points and Seniors Jacob Anderson and Jacob Bendtsen had nine and eight points, respectively.

SKI TEAMS CLOSE SEASON AT SEMSL MEET

The Notre Dame Girls and Boys Ski teams took part in their final meets of the season as the Southeast Michigan Ski League (SEMSL) championships were held at Alpine Valley ski hill on February 25 as part of a reschedule date. The top teams and individual skiers, both from divisions one and two from the four southeast Michigan ski hills who qualified during the divisional races earlier in the month competed in men's and women's slalom and giant slalom (GS) competitions. A mix of Notre Dame Varsity and JV ski team members participated. Top ten honors were awarded to JJ Lintol (first place in both the slalom and GS), Delaney Flavin (seventh in slalom and eighth in GS) and Keely McLeod (fifth place in GS).

IRISH CAP REGULAR SEASON WITH WIN OVER HOLLY

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Swim team finished off their regular season with two final meets this week. On Tuesday, the Irish took on Brother Rice and continued to drop time as Notre Dame received its 16th state cut, this one coming in the 200 Medley Relay. Freshman Pierce Marchese led off, followed by teammates Anthony Dupuis, Griffin Gushman and Lars Boehme as the Irish bested the state cut time by two seconds. Marchese jumped right back in the pool and dropped 1.64 in his 200 Free and later in the meet he dropped 7.65 seconds in his 500 Free. Paul Vigneau joined the fun dropping .61 seconds in his 50 Freestyle and not to be outdone, Senior Griffin Gushman had a season best time by dropping .88 seconds in his 100 Backstroke. "We may not have the numbers to win a meet, but we sure have heart. This team has not stopped amazing me! Every meet we have multiple drops by multiple swimmers. I can't ask anything more than that" said Coach Mark McGreevy after the week. However, Coach McGreevy had to eat his words later in the week as Notre Dame swam to victory in the final regular dual meet of the season over Holly. It was a big night for Senior Miguel Martinez and Sophomore Oliver Kavi. "I love those two swimming each other. It's a matter of pride for Miguel to not let Oliver beat him. And tonight it was another fun race. Miguel managed to hold off the Sophomore and in the process both dropped to personal best times." Martinez dropped three seconds while Kayi dropped nearly two in the 100 Freestyle. Vigneau strolled his way to a victory in the 200 and 500 Freestyles and dropped nine seconds to take the 500 by more than a pool length. Dupuis and Marchese finished first and second in the 100 Butterfly and Dupuis and Boehme took first and second the 100 Backstroke. Gushman added another first place in Breaststroke and the three Seniors teamed up to dominate the 200 Free Relay. "It was great to see the boys finish the season with a well deserved victory" said Coach McGreevy. "We will spend the next three weeks getting ready for our League Meet and State Meet. It's certainly has been a great season so far and the boys are excited to charge into their big season ending meets."

IRISH FALL TO LAKELAND

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Basketball team dropped another close game to Lakeland on the road, 55-49.
