

Dear Parents,

I hope that this email finds you well.

First of all, I would like to reiterate how delighted we are to be welcoming students back on site from next week. While I am immensely proud of the staff for their tireless and innovative efforts to engage the students in remote learning, the community does not have the same atmosphere without us all being together. I hope they are looking forward to returning as much as we are, please do remind them to look at my welcome back video message available here. I should also note that I am very grateful to the volunteers who are supporting our lateral flow testing; please remind your children to thank these, mostly parents, who are donating their time to help everyone get back to class as quickly as possible.

Looking back to this week, Senior School students, staff and, I hope, many parents were fortunate to hear an inspirational talk given by Chris Lubbe. Having served as a close aide to Nelson Mandela, Desmond Tutu, FW De Klerk and Colin La Foy, he spoke informatively and passionately about South Africa's journey from apartheid to democracy and his lifelong work to end discrimination. Thank you to those of you who have contacted us with your own reflections about what the talk meant to you and your child. For those who have not seen it, your child has access to the recording of the event via the Student Hub on Teams. I am also keen to build on this to deliver a programme of similarly inspirational assemblies at least 2termly and I am grateful for all suggestions you may have about suitable topics or speakers.

Social distancing reminder

Looking ahead to next week, I know that you have received significant logistical briefings from Mr Keenan so I will not labour all of the detail already covered. I would like to clarify a key point on which we have received some queries; students must NOT arrive before their allocated time. This has been very carefully scheduled to manage a socially distanced flow while they wait for tests and then progress to classes.

Another point, I would be grateful if parents could helpfully remind students that the social distancing rules in place in Autumn, still apply. If we have a confirmed case in school, those identified as 'close contacts' will still need to isolate, even with lateral flow testing in place. It would be so disappointing, having just returned, for any student to need to isolate again. Students can help to avoid this scenario through their thoughtful behaviour.
