Dean A. Millman Memorial Scholarship

The Dean A. Millman Memorial Scholarship sponsored by the Clearfield High School Class of 1966, awards \$750 to a Clearfield High School student who has demonstrated a work ethic and promise befitting the example set by this scholarship's namesake in the field of Fine Arts as determined by the school's fine arts committee.

As school artist for his class, Dean Allan Millman (1948-1977), designed the cover and provided extensive graphics for the 1966 CHS yearbook. He also painted a large mural for the class's graduation.

In the words of Millman's official biography, he was an art prodigy who awed those who knew him... a force to be reckoned with. Mature beyond his years, he would have achieved success regardless of the pursuit.

Dean first earned local fame at the age of 12 when he rode a bicycle 200 miles to visit a friend in New York State. The following year, after moving with is family to Utah, Dean accomplished the even more audacious task of riding a ten-speed bicycle across the United States, becoming perhaps the youngest person ever to do so.

Dean's artistic gifts were nurtured by CHS art teacher/district art supervisor Ivan Cornia. "He said to me," Millman told Brian Kelly in a 1971 interview, "Listen, Dean. Now is the time for you to paint."

Cornia's advice was well-taken. Although Millman passed away from leukemia at the young age of 28, his work is still represented today in major art collections throughout the United States.

- List of community service activities during high school years
- Letter of recommendation
- 200-400 word essay addressing your qualification for receiving this scholarship. Include experience, awards, community service, and goals in your field of fine art (painting, sculpture, architecture, music, poetry) or performing arts (theatre, dance, film, photography, video production/editing, design, etc.) Essay submissions should be double-spaced, titled and dated (include your name and contact information) and be accompanied by this application.
