Math: Pre-Algebra Review (Virtual)

This course is intended to review and practice major Pre-Algebra skills and concepts. Students will receive review instruction with the opportunity for guided practice on Operations with Integers, Fractions, and Decimals, utilizing the Order of Operations throughout. Time Permitting, based on progress, I hope to cover Proportions and Percents and do some problem-



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solving as well. Encouraged, but not required, is the ability to do short homework assignments and assessments with the opportunity to self-check for independent understanding and accountability. This will require printing PDFs from email or pulling them into an app on a device. While Zooming, students should have paper, a dry erase board (physical or virtual), or some other form of working out problems and taking notes. Students should also be comfortable entering short answers to problems via the Chat feature. A Review/Intro of the basics of Algebra will be offered the following week of June 21 as a “continuation,” but these two MS math classes can also be taken separately from each other. Students will receive review instruction with the opportunity for guided practice on Expressions, Equations, and Solving for Variables. Time permitting, based on progress, we could cover Slope/Coordinate Graphing, Linear Systems, and Set Theory. Encouraged, but not required, is the ability to do short homework assignments and assessments with the opportunity to self-check for independent understanding and accountability. This will require printing PDFs from email or pulling them into an app on a device. While Zooming, students should have paper, a dry erase board (physical or virtual), or some other form of working out problems and taking notes. Students should also be comfortable entering short answers to problems via the Chat feature. A Review of necessary Pre-Algebra skills will be offered the previous week of June 14 as a “prequel,” but these two middle school math classes can also be taken separately from each other.
